Report from Public Meeting on DA for 12 Townhouses on Corner Queen, George and Albert Streets, BERRY

Another well attended meeting was held at Berry Court House on **Monday, 14th June 2004 between 6:00pm and 7:00pm.**

There was much discussion about why Council would allow this development to proceed knowing full well that this land floods. Photographic evidence as recent as March 2002 shows this block of land under flood water after only heavy rain for one day. This was not a real flood as many long time residents of Berry would testify.

Several residents further downstream have been refused permission to extend their houses or build garages on land close to this creek, yet approval to build 12 townhouses has been granted. To do this, Council has accepted a flood study by the developer because the most recent flood study done by Council was 20 years ago. Council has recently commissioned a flood study with Snowy Mountains Engineering Corporation (S.M.E.C.) but it will be some time before it is completed.

After much discussion it was decided to request a public meeting with Council to explain how they came to give this development approval.

Council, we are told, are willing to receive a deputation to go over the processes and the issues but they are not prepared to hold another public meeting as the application has now been approved.

The meeting also decided to consider approaching the media in an effort to resolve, what most residents consider a very unwise decision by Council. Steps have been initiated to follow this course of action.
