

POLICE REPORT

- There was a single vehicle accident on Beach Road, near the intersection of Sunnymede Lane on Friday the 9th July. Luckily no person was injured but the vehicle required towing from the scene.
- Another accident occurred at the intersection of Victoria Street and Prince Alfred Street at 10am on Saturday the 10th of July. Two vehicles were involved and one required towing. No person was injured.
- Sometime over the night of Wednesday the 14th of July or the early hours of the following morning an unknown person has caused malicious damage to a vehicle parked in the driveway of a premises in Victoria Street. The vehicle was scratched along the length of the driver's side with a sharp instrument.
- About 7am on Thursday the 15th of July there was a head on collision between two vehicles at the intersection of the Princes Highway and Tannery Roads just north of Berry. The vehicle heading southbound crossed to the incorrect side of the road. Luckily the vehicles were not travelling very fast and no serious injuries were sustained by either driver. Both cars required towing.
- Sometime overnight on Saturday the 24th of July or early hours of the following morning a letter box was damaged by unknown persons in the Berry CBD area. The letter box appeared to have been struck and squashed by a heavy object.
- A house in Woodhill Mountain Road was broken into by an unknown intruder in the early hours of Tuesday the 27th of July. It is

likely that the intruder was disturbed when one of the occupants got up around 3.30am. The actual break in was not detected until later in the morning when a fly screen was noticed to have been removed from the main bedroom window. Some property had been handled and moved but nothing appears to have actually been taken. Crime scene examiners have dusted several objects for possible fingerprints.

- On Sunday the 1st of August a fork lift attachment for a bobcat earth mover was stolen from a property on Coolangatta Road at Berry.

- Sometime overnight on Saturday the 7th of August or early hours of the following morning unknown persons have entered the grounds of the Berry Recycling Centre on Agars Lane and stolen two wheelbarrows. A witness reported seeing a white table top utility in the vicinity of the tip around 6.30pm on Saturday evening but there is still insufficient evidence to corner the habitual offender.

- About 6pm on Wednesday the 11th of August a large shed was completely destroyed by fire at a property on Ben Dooley Road, Berry Mountain. The occupant had been burning some material in a nearby incinerator which spread to the shed.

- Between 3pm and 3.30pm on Saturday the 14th of August unknown persons have entered the backyard of a premises in Croziers Road, Jaspers Brush and stolen a quad bike.

Berry police appeal for any information which may assist in any of these matters to be passed on.

To encourage new members the club has waived the joining fee for the next 2 months so that many more people can enjoy the benefits that the club has on offer.
