Council to provide free e-waste collection points

Shoalhaven City Council has partnered with DHL to establish free 'Drop Zone' e-waste collection points across the City.

Under the new produce stewardship program local residents will be able to recycle unwanted televisions and computers free of charge at all of Council's Recycling and Waste Depots as well as at TSR E-Waste at South Nowra.

Mayor, Joanna Gash welcomed Council's partnership with DHL as she encouraged local residents to take advantage of the free program.

"Currently, too many of the community's unwanted or unused electronic items are ending up in landfill," said Cllr Gash.

"Further to this, Council is seeing further cases of electronic waste being illegally dumped by residents looking to avoid tipping fees.

"This new free recycling program will provide the community with greater flexibility in recycling electronic waste while conserving both the area's landfill and local environment."

"Local residents now have access to an on-going, free recycling service for old or unwanted televisions, computers and computer products, such as printers, keyboards and mice, regardless of their age or brand."

Items able to be recycled under the new program include -

- Televisions.
- Computers and computer products.
- Laptops, notebooks, palmtops and tablets.
- Computer monitors.
- Internal hard drives, motherboards, cards, internal power supplies, CPUs, DVD and CD drives.
- Mice, keyboards, joysticks, game pads, scanners and web cameras.
- Printers - ink-jet, dot matrix, laser printers and multi-functional devices.

Thanks also to those many businesses who decorated their businesses and shop windows, displayed our banners and promotional material. Le Tour de Berry is a 3 week long community Festival organised at the same time as the famous le Tour de France cycle race is run. It is an annual event held in July each year. We get together to celebrate cycling, food and wine – with a French flavour.

It raises funds to help Tracks to the Future committee of the Berry Alliance to build footpaths and cycleways in and around Berry.

Last year with the help of the Council and some community groups we organised and built a 2 metre wide Shareway along Clarence Street next to Berry Public School, from Victoria Street and 2/3rds of the way

down to the footpath on Albany Lane. We have sufficient funding for the final 1/3rd to be completed and we are just waiting for the School community to finalise their plans for that section regarding parking. We do not wish to put in the Shareway if it ends up causing difficulty for future plans by the school community.

In 2011/2012 we built a 2 metre wide Shareway along Alexandra Street from the Railway Station to Victoria Street (next to the Showground).



The Official opening of the Clarence Street Shareway on the last day of Term in June. Opened by three of the four School captains Jade Mustapic, Jessie Abbott and Lachlan Sutton along with Deputy Mayor Cllr John Wells. Also assisting were Cllrs Patricia White, Lynn Kearney and Andrew Guile, Headmaster Bob Willets, Martin Uptis from Council, Ian Parker and Geoff Armstrong from the Berry Alliance & le Tour de Berry and Peter Stinson, Guy Mainsbridge and Ken Hutt from Berry Rotary Club. Ken is also from le Tour de Berry.

Our Future projects include:

1. Stage 3 of the Clarence Street project.
2. A footpath/Cycleway along Victoria Street between Albany Street and Alexandra Street. (This will link the footpath along Victoria Street currently terminating at the Berry Courthouse with the footpath in Alexandra Street in to town (Queen Street) and the new footpath we finalised last year along Alexandra Street to the railway station from Victoria Street. This will complete another circuit of footpaths.
3. A Shareway around the sporting fields at Camp Quality Park on the corner of North Street and Woodhill Mountain Road. Currently there is a wide footpath from the two car parks. We would like to complete this around the other section of the oval to join this all up into a circuit. These projects have been previously investigated and prioritised by the Tracks to the Future Committee and endorsed through Community Forums and we are hopeful that we can get at least 2 of the three done during the next 12 to 18 months. A very exciting prospect – thank you everyone for your assistance and support.

Council moves to increase General Rates

Shoalhaven City Council will increase General Rates by 4.6 per cent above the rate pegging limit (3.4 per cent) in the 2013/14 financial year.

The decision follows the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal's (IPART) approval of Council's application for a special variation rate rise to help fund infrastructure renewal.

The increase is estimated to provide Council with an additional \$2.3 million, all of which would be exclusively allocated towards road and path renewal in 2013/14 (\$1.8 million on roads and \$500,000 on pathways).

Mayor, Joanna Gash said she was very pleased Council chose to accept the rate variation saying the additional funding would allow Council to start tackling the area's infrastructure backlog.

While pleased to see the commencement of road renewal and path projects in the coming financial year, Mayor Gash cautioned that it will take many years to overcome infrastructure backlog works of \$37 million.

"Council has made a commitment to bring the area's road and pathway network up to an acceptable standard," said Cllr Gash.

"The additional funding received from the rate variation will allow works to be undertaken on a number of critical projects within the coming financial year,

"Days like today, when the area is subject to heavy rains, reinforce the need for road rehabilitation works across the city to minimise cases of further degradation and flooding of road surfaces."

Funding from the special variation rate rise will be allocated towards the following road renewal projects -

- Currarong Road (5.6km to 6.8km from Coonemia Road) - \$624,000
- Jindy Andy Lane (0.0km to 0.7km from Comerong Is Road) - \$364,000
- Quinns Lane (0.4km to 0.8km from Princes Highway) - \$512,000
- Lake Conjola Entrance Road (within tourist park) - \$200,000
- Orsova Parade - \$100,000.

Funding from the special variation rate rise be allocated towards the following path projects -

- Woollamia Road (community) path - \$200,000
- Princes Highway (south of Canberra Crescent) path - \$90,000
- Berry Street Nowra CBD path - \$210,000

Berry Alliance says: *You will note that the projects listed do not include anything in Berry. This list is for the 2013-2014 financial year. We will be holding a Community Forum in September or October on the topic of identifying roads and pathways that our community would like to see included in the program of improvement that is to be funded by this special increase in rates. Once identified these will be put to Council with a request that they be included in the program.*


SEWING CLASSES



The Australian Decorative and Fine Arts Society (ADFAS) illustrated lecture on Thursday August 29 will delight and inspire garden lovers.


Prince Franz of Anhalt-Dessau was an absolute ruler of a small province in rural Germany in the second half of the 18th century.

A profound Anglophile and scion of the Enlightenment, he determined to mould his little world into a model state exemplifying liberal and progressive attitudes to the conduct of society. Education was at the heart of his reforms, along with industry and agricultural revolutions, and the whole district was to be blended into a seamless whole of beauty and utility.

The inner sanctum of this new world was the ornamental park at Worlitz, laid out around a series of lakes. The Palladian villa now looks out over grounds of endless beauty and fascination, with bridges and seats of rich variety leading to grottoes, temples, orchards and an artificial volcano. Brown, Rousseau and Sir William Hamilton are warmly acknowledged, and at every turn the visitor reflects on taste, tolerance and the benefits of progress.

Visitors are always welcome at a cost of \$25 which includes supper following the lecture so roll up at 7.30 PM to the Berry School of Arts on Thursday August 29 for a warm and enjoyable evening.

“In my next life, I wanna be a female bear . . .”

I saw the following ‘funny’ written by a woman. “In my next life, I wanna be a female bear. If you’re a bear, you get to hibernate. You do nothing but sleep for six months. Before you hibernate, you’re supposed to eat yourself stupid. If you’re a bear, you birth your children (who are the size of walnuts) while you’re sleeping and wake to partially grown, cute cuddly cubs. If you’re a mama bear you swat anyone who bothers your cubs. If your cubs get out of line, you swat them, too. If you’re a bear, your mate EXPECTS you to wake up growling. He expects that you will have hairy legs and excess body fat. Yup...I wanna be a bear”.

Well I’m sure that the opportunity to give birth to a baby the size of a walnut while you are sleeping would be appealing to most women. I remember being at the birth of my two children and hearing a groaning that came from my wife that I had never heard before. That groaning that was deeper than words could express. That groaning that expressed the pain her whole body was going through to give birth.

The bible says that this world is groaning in pain. You only have to open your eyes for a minute to see the world groaning. Whether it is personal pain, poverty, death or suffering it is there. Here is how it is put in the Scriptures – “We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time [Rom 8:22].

But there are two things that we can hold on to as we see and feel the ‘groaning world’.

The first is that Jesus Christ brings good news into that world. Here is how it is put to the Shepherds at the birth of Jesus - “Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. 11 Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord [Lk 2:10-11].

The second is that this world isn’t the end of the story. The reading above about the world groaning follows on to say - but we...groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies [Rom 8:23]. In other words, there is more to come. Heaven is described as a place where - “God himself will be with them and be their God. 4 He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.” [Rev 21:3-4]

Bringing life to the southcoast and the nations

The Berry Riding Club has had a busy month or two, despite all of the rain. The focus has been on developing member's riding skills, bringing in professional coaches in the disciplines of dressage and jumping over fences.

Riding Club News



Our informal riding get-togethers during the week (GG's day) continue to expand with friendly chit-chat, morning tea and time to arrange other social activities such as a ride on the beach, a trail ride in the hills or to go to pilates.

We have also had two Skill Sharing days where Club members shared their knowledge with others. One of these was to show riders what it was like from the judge's box and the other how to ride to music. It was amazing to see how well the horses and ponies responded to the rhythm of the music but, then, what sport does not rely on rhythm from its athletes?

Two competition days were also run, with both being well attended even though we need to ride around the survey pegs that are now popping up across the grounds as a reminder that we are soon to be sliced in half by the Berry bypass. The imminent start to the bypass has been viewed with great concern by our membership, for as the Club grows we need more room, not less. The Club is also an asset to the area, bringing in people to stay the weekend and do shopping between their rides.

The South Coast is a significant rural area in which there are no Government-owned riding facilities such as that found in the Southern Highlands, the Canberra region, Sydney and Tamworth. Riders along the Coast are generally restricted to this area with challenging journeys for anyone daring to take their horses further afield.

This lack of facilities locally prompted the Club to run a Junior Skills Development Clinic at the Bicentennial Park in Camden during

the last school holidays. With over 130 riders camping over for 4 days and 16 professional coaches, these young people had various theory sessions together with tuition on the cross country course as well as flatwork and jumping. It was unfortunate that Berry missed out on the flow-on economic benefits,

however it was a good advertisement for our Club's varied activities and we are sure more people will come down the Coast for the Jumping, Dressage and Interscholar activities planned for the second half of the year.

LANDCARE BERRY

Planning for the growing season

With shorter days in winter, now is an ideal time to plan your attack on the weeds in spring and summer. Like any planning activity it is important to set goals and a timeframe to achieve the desired result. The first task is usually a site assessment. This needs to document the state of the site. One thing we regretted was not making a video "trip" along a path through our hectare of Lantana before we set about clearing it. If you are unsure how to plan your attack, bringing in expertise early on could save you some grief later. Why not call your local Landcare Coordinator? Or go along to the next working bee in your area and discuss the problem with others who may be able to direct you to easier solutions.

Another important consideration to the planning process is to evaluate the surroundings – are there weed problems around your site that are likely to "infect" it after you have done your hard work? Is there a native seed source close by that will promote natural regeneration? For example, if the paddock/lawn edge is covered in Cobblers Peg /Farmers Friend and you remove the adjoining Lantana, are you going to end up with a field of Cobblers Peg? (Lantana uses a chemical to suppress the growth of other plants and weeds).

What is the appropriate timing to be applied to your project? If the weeds to be addressed are winter flowering, e.g. Cape Ivy, Crofton weed or Mist Flower, then there is no time to be lost to avoid seeds setting. If you have woody weeds such as Lantana you will be better waiting for warmer weather when the weed is actively growing before hitting it with Glyphosate/Brushoff spray or Glyphosate in a splatter gun. The latter (splatter gun) is becoming widely used, and your local Landcare coordinator can explain its use and where you could obtain one.

It is important to set realistic timescales and to realise that some activity, e.g. natural regrowth, cannot be planned to a timeframe. Our gully took 2 years following use of the splatter gun on Lantana to regenerate naturally. A reasonable reaction after 18 months might have been to undertake a mass planting, but this was eventually unnecessary. Also important to realise that weed control is never a "one-off" process, the importance of setting aside time for follow-up weeding especially in the first couple of years cannot be over-emphasised.

Weeds of the month:

Cape Ivy - scrambler with soft ivy shaped leaves and yellow flowers. Crofton weed – woody stems up to 1.5 mtr tall with clusters of off-white flower heads at the top.



Gardens are looking great at present, Camellias in full bloom, Jonquils and early Daffodils adding colour and scent. Also arriving on the scene are Magnolias, many mature trees rising above rooflines. In Princess Street between Alexandra and Albany Streets is a wonderful specimen of *Magnolia denudata*, commonly called Yulan or Jade Orchid. The best known of Chinese flowering trees in its home country it has been cultivated in gardens there for over 1,000 years. Bark and buds are used for medicinal purposes and the flowers for making scent. Pulp surrounding the seeds can be dried, powdered and taken in the manner of snuff for medicinal use. Flower buds pickled in vinegar and ginger are used as an accompaniment for rice. Petals dipped in flour and fried in oil until crisp are considered a delicacy. In China plants are often grouped together emotionally, in the Yulan's case it joins Crabapple and Tree Peony to represent wealth and rank in the Jade Hall.

'Jade Hall' is a term meaning a wealthy establishment.

In Australia possums and various birds eat the Magnolia flower buds in winter therefore ruining the display. This destruction is happening in my garden as I write this article.

Guest speaker at Berry Garden Club's July meeting was well-known Landscape Architect Michael Bligh. Michael's presentation gave a fascinating

insight into garden design principles, choice of landscape materials and plants, and paid particular attention to all year attraction. I am sure that members returned home that night with heads full of future plans.

In July I attended the annual Yates Media Presentation in Sydney. There was, of course, much to interest all gardeners and I will mention a few products. There is now an expanded range of Dynamic Lifter products, organic based plant foods boosted with added nutrients and blended to suit groups of plants, also additional packet sizes. A simple to use shaker pack lawn repair kit called Easy Patch is a four in one seed, fertiliser, soil wetter and coir peat solution for bare or worn sections of lawn.

Readers might recall an article I wrote last year regarding Myrtle Rust, a disease affecting the Myrtaceae plant family, an

important family of Australia ornamentals including Eucalypts, Paperbacks and Callistemons (Bottlebrush). The disease has spread rapidly throughout eastern Australia since first identified in 2010. In 2012 Yates introduced Zaleton, an effective treatment for Azalea Petal Blight. It is a combination of two fungicides, one systemic and one penetrant. Recently Zaleton has been registered for control of Myrtle Rust.

A new horticultural treat for garden lovers - Australian Garden Show Sydney will be held in Sydney's Centennial Park, Thursday 5th to Sunday 8th September, 2013. This event is sponsored by NSW Government Tourism. Appearing will be Australian and overseas speakers.






RedBerry Quilters

Local community encouraged to become alert to graffiti

Shoalhaven City Council Mayor, Joanna Gash is encouraging local residents to report any new cases of vandalism to Council as soon as they appear throughout the City.

The Mayor's calls for public assistance follows the vandalism of a number of Sussex Inlet properties recently which left local businesses and other structures defaced with offensive messages.

Mayor Gash praised the local community for promptly alerting Council to the vandalised areas saying Council staff were able to remove the offending graffiti on the same day.

"It is unfortunate that some thoughtless people continue to graffiti and vandalise both public and private property throughout the Shoalhaven," said Cllr Gash.

"In the last year alone, Council has received approximately 250 requests to remove graffiti from within the City.

"These numbers do not include graffiti removal from public amenities or the strategically identified sites which are both automatically serviced by Council staff."

"While Council is working hard to eradicate all graffiti from within the City I would certainly encourage private property owners to take responsibility for prompt action against graffiti on property under their management also."

"Council's Policy for Graffiti Management requires new incidents of graffiti to be removed as quickly as possible so as to deter further vandalism."

"If Council and private property owners continue to work together I'm sure we can see a large decrease in unsightly and criminal acts of graffiti across the City."
