The Berry Forum

Around sixty people attended the second official public meeting of the Forum, which was held on 9 July at the Berry School of Arts.

Feedback was provided on matters raised in June, including the draft constitution, the propose Coolangatta Mt land transfer to National Parks, Garden Club's proposal to have Council take the spare parcel of land off George St from RMS for a community park, the strategic master plan, an island for the duck pond at Mark Radium Park and Garden Club's concerns about the condition of the oldest section of the cemetery. New matters raised from the floor included the need for better fencing of the off-leash dog walking paddock on North Street, upgrades and funding status of work on the School of Arts building, status of the Berry Taxi Service, status of the campaign to make Berry free of plastic bags, a footpath for Kangaroo Valley Road, public toilets and status of Council's North Street Concept Plan.

Roll up Roll up It's Show Time!

Roll up Roll up It's Show Time! Once again the Berry School of Arts doors are set to open for the annual Berry Camellia and Floral Show at 12 noon on Saturday, 2 August and then from 10am - 2pm on Sunday. If you have never called in to see this spectacular display of blooms, you have been missing one of Berry's oldest events.

The original Show was staged in 1963 by the Social Committee of the Berry School of Arts to raise funds for the upkeep of the building. In 1968, organisation of the Show passed to the Chesalon Nursing Home Auxiliary who then passed it on to the Berry Garden Club in 1991. We have been doing it ever since. Fifty three years of history makes this the longest running Camellia Show in the same venue in NSW. Berry can be proud of this record!

Entry to the Show is only \$5 with catering provided by the David Berry Hospital Auxiliary. The Camellia Show Convenor, Lorraine Heath and her husband, Stan, recently returned from the combined NSW and National Camellia Shows in Sydney with one National and two State awards for their entries. In the points score competition they gained 3rd place overall with 20 first places and 15 seconds. Our Show could not be in better hands!

It has not been good news, though, for the Camellias behind Karinya, the Palliative Care Unit at the Hospital. The two tall conifers were the first to go, then the Camellias, followed by the roses, the gardenias and other plantings. It has been a mystery for the Garden Club volunteers who garden there once a month. The answer appeared in Autumn. Mushroom-like growths ballooned from plant bases - Armillaria root rot. Known as the honey fungus, it attacks living roots and is deadly to plants. We can only clear away affected plants to halt its spread, allow the soil to dry and then start planting again. Others have told us this is happening also in their gardens after our very wet summer.

Our AGM will follow our August meeting at 7.30pm in St Luke's Church Hall on Tuesday, 18 August. There will be no guest speaker this month although Fungi, in a separate Kingdom of its own, could have been a fascinating topic. Instead, a generous supper will follow the AGM allowing time to mingle. Visitors are always welcome. For more information on

The Joint Regional Planning Panel meeting to decide the Rockfield Park Development could take place on Thursday, August 27, 2015 as advised by the JRPP Secretariat.

The meeting will be open to the public and provides the community a last opportunity to demonstrate their opposition to this inappropriate development. The community will be able to address the panel as part of the meeting process.

To recap the reasons why this development should not be allowed:

- Massive 50 acre development, 42 accommodation units, spa and pool complexes.
- 186 person conference / wedding function centre, bar and lounge
- 80 seat restaurant
- > 100 car parking spaces
- Processing and storage of up to 80000 litres of sewerage.

How will this impact the Berry and Kangaroo Valley Community?

- A doubling of traffic on hazardous Kangaroo Valley and Tourist Roads
- Depletion of water aquifers and probable events of sewage flowing into creeks
- Impact and death to wildlife, ecology and the environment
- Economic impacts on and destruction of existing B&B businesses
- Disregards planning laws SLEP2014 that prohibits this type of development

 Disregards legal opinion by Senior Counsel Chris McEwen that says Wedding/Function Centres are prohibited in the RU1 zone under SLEP2014

Professional authorities have made the following statements in regard to the development.

- Shoalhaven Police Local Area Command in there submission to Council D15/218215 '...an increase of vehicular traffic of this number in this area ...will contribute to an increase in serious motor vehicle accidents, road trauma not to mention the increase in demand for emergency services'.
- Martens Consulting Engineering Report, June 23, 2015, commissioned by Shoalhaven Council on the Sewerage Management Plan in the S68 application report.

"DA documentation does not address NSW DEC (2004) Environmental Guidelines – Use of Effluent by Irrigation", **and**

COUNCIL WORKSHOPS

Shoalhaven Council runs regular free workshops under their Home Sustainability program, to encourage and educate residents in a variety of sustainability topics. Bookings are essential: online at shoalhaven.nsw.gov. au/Environment/Waste-and-recycling/Home-Sustainability-Workshops, or by calling the Council on 4429 3129. The program starts again in Spring. Workshop topics covered:

Composting; Stage 1 is for those who are new to composting, or need tips on improving a poor composting system. Included is a free compost bin to get you started. Stage 2 covers more advanced topics, and different composting systems, but you must have completed Stage 1. Workshops take around ninety minutes.

Bokashi Composting: a form of composting in a closed bucket system using microorganisms. The smaller size of a Bokashi bucket makes it a useful composting system if you live in a unit or townhouse, or don't have a garden with space for a compost heap or bin. Worm Farms; another ninety minute workshop to teach you all about setting up and feeding a worm farm. Even if you have a compost bin, it's worth also having a worm farm, for the excellent fertilizer it creates, which is excellent for plants and seedlings.

Organic Vegetable Gardening, and Healthy Soil, Healthy Life; these two workshops are complementary for improving your garden's productivity.

Natural Cleaning: practical tips for replacing chemical based cleaners with natural, nontoxic alternatives. Cut down on products that can be harmful to your health, while protecting the environment. Included in the workshop is a lesson on making your own cleaner to take home.

Love your Leftovers: new to Council's program, Stages 1 & 2 workshops promote reducing food waste. Stage 1 topics include menu planning, pantry staples and food storage.



Stage 2, for those who have completed Stage 1, offers demonstrations on how to use leftovers to make healthy, delicious meals in around thirty minutes, which you get to sample. Adam Guthrie, wholefood chef, teaches these workshops. Education never tasted so good!

ETHICAL SHOPPING

A new web site, goodonyou.org.au, from registered charity Ethical Consumers Australia brings together the latest information on brands' status in categories of environmental impact and pollution, and fair wages. The site rates hundreds clothing brands, and cosmetics and personal care products. A phone app is in development, which will offer alternate product suggestions, store locations, and make it easy for you to give feedback to companies. If you are concerned about making ethical decisions when shopping, this is a useful and proactive tool.

The fashion industry employs one in six people in the world, and is the second most polluting industry (after the oil industry) so the choices we make have a huge impact on the environment and some of the world's worst paid, least protected. The True Cost, a documentary about the fashion industry, is a shocking indictment of disposable fashion. The documentary has had limited release in Australia, with a few charity screenings, but is currently available on iTunes.

We are comfortably insulated as a community from the realities of the vast clothing production industry, its negative impact on workers, and pollution of water supplies and farming land. Changing the way we shop for clothes will make a huge difference the lives of others. Fast fashion has come at a high cost, not only in the supply chain, but also as a growing landfill problem. Only around 60% of clothing donated to charities is saleable, and about a quarter is sent straight to landfill. Many modern fabrics, based on artificial fibres, do not break down, but hang around for years or decades. This type of wasteful consumption may make us feel rich, being able to buy new items every week if we desire, but it keeps us, and the supply chain workers, poor. The only people who profit are those in between, who add the huge mark ups.

FAIR TRADE

Along with more conscious decisions regarding clothes shopping, buying Fairtrade certified items also gives a living wage to farmers and producers. Check fairtrade.com. au for brands, products and locations.

BUYING LOCALLY

When buying fruit and vegetables, try to choose seasonal produce, grown in Australia. Avoid out of season items shipped in from the US, South America and Europe. Check the labels of tinned fruits and vegetables; buying Australian protects the livelihoods of our farmers. Here are some local businesses and enterprises that are also worth looking into; Greenbox: Gerringong based food cooperative, sourcing locally grown, seasonal produce. greenbox.org.au

The Treat Factory: bulk goods in minimal packaging.

South Coast Dairy: Milk and dairy products from local cows.

The last twenty were given to the Renal Unit at Shoalhaven Hospital. It gives us great pleasure to think that on these cold winter days, some people may be iust a little warmer because of our efforts.

I've been teaching Ethics at my local primary school for a few years now.



The reason I teach it is not because I have a child at the school who I want to be able to do Ethics; it's not because I'm anti-religion. I teach Ethics because I think it's more important for kids to learn to think about what they believe and why, rather than be presented with one point of view and told that's what they should believe.

When given the opportunity to do so, kids are more than willing to explore ethical issues ranging from lying and selfishness, to how we should know right from wrong and why. They are happy to form and express their opinions, and equally happy for others to express theirs.

I think all of us - adults and kids alike - could do with giving a bit more thought to the big issues... to what's okay and what isn't okay and why. We stand to become more ethical and responsible people if we can examine our reasons for holding a certain opinion, and - if they aren't good reasons - change it. In fact, I think one of the best things about Ethics is that it teaches kids that it's okay to change your mind. Another is that it shows them that there is often a range of opinions on one topic... and that's okay too. As long as there are sound reasons for those opinions. Some reasons are not sound at all and it's good to know the difference.



Surely, these kinds of lessons are more useful in this day and age than lessons about religion? And, if you were going to teach kids about religion, wouldn't you want them to know about more than one of them?

We're in the 21st century now. There are many religions; many different points of view; much diversity. Kids need to learn how to live in that world. They need to know how to work out what they believe, while understanding that not everyone thinks the say way, or has the same beliefs. And to navigate their way, they need strong powers of reasoning.

As the motto of Primary Ethics says: 'Just think about it.'

Member Robyn Messner then gave us a most fascinating talk about her time living on Norfolk Island from 1997 to 2004. She lived in Government House as her husband was the Administrator of the Island. This is the same as being a State Governor.

She told us about the history of the island and about the community that lives there and what it is like to live there. She then told us of her role on the Island, part of which was as Patron to many of the community groups. For a population of two to three thousand people there are five churches, 14 sporting clubs and 26 groups and service clubs.

She described Government House, its history and its importance to the community in the past and the many roles it now performs for the present community. The building was in serious need of repair and renovation so she took upon herself the job of restoring it to its former glory period of 1829 to 1835. The work was carried out by the local restoration team and now is a source of pride in the community apart from being used more by the community particularly for raising funds for many causes.

Weed Regrowth:

It often happens that the good intensions of weed clearance lead to unanticipated consequences. A common method is to bulldoze or totally clear the weeds. Another is to spray them with Roundup. The immediate result is an absence or the death of the weeds. The next growing season however sees their regrowth or the growth of a more vigorous set of common invasive weeds, Fleabane or Wild Tobacco typically. Often these are spawned from wind borne seeds taking advantage of disturbed ground. If the weeds have been removed from creeks or gullies it can result in serious erosion. The use of herbicides like Roundup also kills the native plants or grasses that will if present prevent the seeding of the wind borne plants. These herbicides should only be delivered directly to individual plants.

The recent release of the biological control of Crofton Weed has demonstrated a better principal in weed control. The spread of the introduced fungus does not fully destroy but weakens the host plant. If it eradicated the weed the fungus would die out as well, enabling the more common host to reinvade. The fungus makes the Crofton Weed less dominant.

Weed and Native of the Month:

Weed: Cat's Claw, Yellow Trumpet Vine, (Bignonia unguis-cati). A woody climber with twining branches and paired leaves. Flowers bright yellow followed by narrow bean-like pods 45 to cm long contain numerous seeds. Native: Yellow Guinea Flower, (Hibbbertia scandens). Yellow flowering scrambling climber, native to the South Coast. Usually grows on fences and in forests. Likes shade and is drought tolerant.




