## New Shareway / Footpath - Opened

**Background** – Tracks to the Future is a Sub Committee of the Berry Alliance that was formed nearly 2 years ago at a Community Forum called to discuss the footpaths, parks and gardens around Berry. The Committee considered everything that was raised at the Community Forum, studied what was needed, and made a recommendation for our first project. This recommendation was endorsed by the community at another Community Forum. This project was a Shareway along Alexandra Street -between Station Street and Victoria Street. The Committee decided early on that we were better at raising money than floating concrete, so concentrated on raising the necessary funds.

- We were successful in a grant application through the State Governments Community Building Partnership Program and were granted \$22k;
- We were successful in our application to Council under their Community Paths Fund and received a commitment of \$8,500 and Council will install the pram ramps for the shareway;
- We received a donation of \$5,000 from the Garden Festival through the Berry and District Garden Club,
- The Berry Alliance donated \$5,000 to the project;
- The sub Committee raised money by selling raffle tickets, selling sausage sandwiches and through asking for donations.
- In total, nearly \$45k was raised for this project.

The Committee decided that we would make the shareway 2 metres wide, even though we could have settled on 1.5 metre or 1.8 metre shareway. We wanted a shareway that truly could be shared. Wide enough to cater people who use gophers, walking frames, prams or scooters.

We thank each and every person and group who contributed to this project. Some work still needs to be completed - the garden beds at Gillam Street, and the two resting seats that are on order as well as the Pram Ramps at each Street end and the entrance to the Showground.

The Tracks to the Future Committee already has their next project underway and have an application in to the State Government for a grant. We are considering a shareway down Clarence Street next to the School. Gareth Ward has already been lobbied and we are hopeful that we will be successful and be able to rely on Council and the community to assist us in this next project as well.

We will be holding a Community Forum to discuss this early in 2012.

## Berry bypass preferred alignment and Berry (south) interchange updated

On 11 January 2012 the Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) announced that the preferred alignment and designs for the Berry bypass and the Berry (south) interchange have been updated.

The RMS would like to thank members of the community review group, established to re-examine the bypass alignment, and others in the community for their time, perseverance and ideas for improving the Berry bypass.

The proposed revisions to the alignment were presented to the community on Tuesday 6 December 2011. The community meeting, called by the local Member of Parliament Gareth Ward, was well attended with over 250 residents at the Berry School of Arts to discuss the revised alignment and design.

The revised alignment was displayed at the Berry project office from 1 December to 14 December 2011 for community comment.

153 written submissions were received during the display. Issues raised by the community and stakeholders included:

- potential impacts resulting from the Kangaroo Valley Road interchange.
- the North Street alignment.
- the diversion of Town Creek.
- the proposed two-way traffic movement from Victoria to Queen streets.

An issues report summarising the issues raised in submissions is on the project website at **www.rta.nsw.gov.au/fbb**. Also, we have a questions and answer webpage newly set up that may assist with some questions. All project related issues raised in the submissions will also be addressed through the Foxground and Berry bypass environmental assessment.

The community review group has done a great job and there is now an opportunity for other community members to join a refreshed working group to continue the good work. It is intended the new working group and RMS will meet regularly over the coming months to discuss ideas and issues important to the community. The first of these meetings is proposed on Wednesday 8 February and during mid January will be advertised and notified by email to members of the project database.

RMS will also conduct urban design workshops during the first quarter of 2012 working with the community about the North Berry precinct and the buffer zone. Discussions with the community around property access, heavy vehicle rest area, flooding, pedestrian amenity, urban design, noise and visual impacts in the Foxground and Berry bypass project area will continue to inform the assessment for the project.

#### In 2012 the Berry project office will be open on Fridays from 10am to 5pm from 3 February.

#### **TENDER AWARDED FOR WORK ON PRINCES HWY UPGRADE**

Member for Kiama Gareth Ward today said that Gerringong residents have been handed an early Christmas present with the awarding of the tender to upgrade the Princes Highway.

"Fulton Hogan has been selected as the successful tenderer to design and construct the 7.5 kilometre upgrade of the Princes Highway between Mt Pleasant and Toolijooa Road," Mr Ward announced today.

"This brings great cheer to the local community as it means we are one step closer to a safer, more durable highway," he said.

"Work on the \$310 million upgrade is expected to start in the second half of next year, with completion expected in the first half of 2015, weather permitting," Mr Ward said.

"There are more presents under the tree, with negotiations between Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) and Fulton Hogan providing for Fern Street to remain open during the work.

"Original plans had indicated Fern Street could be closed for up to 12 months due to the difficulties working with passing traffic, however this has now been solved," Mr Ward said.

"This is a big win for Gerringong, allowing this access to remain open during work is good news for locals and visitors.

"RMS will continue to work with the local community on the designs of the shared access roads, noise mitigation measures and recognition of Aboriginal heritage in the area," he said.

When completed the upgrade will generally follow the existing highway route and include:

- Two lanes in each direction with a median barrier;
- A 100 km/h speed limit across most of the upgrade;
- A new raised interchange at Belinda Street with a service road connecting to Willowvale Road:
- A new raised interchange at Rose Valley Road and service road connecting to Fern Street
- A third lane for slow vehicles heading south from the Crooked River bridge to the top of the Gerringong Curves:
- A new bridge replacing the railway level crossing in Fern Street;
- Access roads in various locations to improve road safety for vehicles entering or leaving the highway
- Improved flood immunity to withstand a one in 100 year flood event, including for Belinda Street;
- Preservation of two Moreton Bay fig trees at the Rose Valley interchange; and A new bus facility at the Gerringong railway station

## **Berry Garden Club**

Christmas and New Year festivities now a memory and gardeners are venturing out to work.

The wet weather experienced over the last months has led to a lot of growth, welcome in many instances, however not where weeds are concerned. Watering is usually a high priority at this time of the year but such is not the case in early January as I write this article. Pruning is high on the agenda, followed by mulching the cuttings. The wet weather was greatly appreciated by many plants, great floral displays and long flowering season noticeable.

An innovative new product has just been released, Every Little Drop Hose Meter. This product shows exactly how much water is being used every time you hose the garden. The meter displays current amount of water being used, the total volume used and average daily consumption.

The following are flowering in my garden as I write this article. Pentas lanceolata - found from Yemen to tropical East Africa, is a shrub undergoing a revival of interest. Difficult to find a few years ago, some varieties are now available in local nurseries. The common name Star Cluster is descriptive of the flower shape, available in shades of pink, red, less commonly mauve. Hardy, pest and disease resistant, flowering all year, hard to find fault with Pentas.

Hydrangeas have been exceptionally good this season, a wonderful shrub for the garden and floral decoration. It was a pleasure to walk around Berry in early December admiring the massed displays.

Agapanthus put on a great display each year, with little effort from the gardener. Agapanthus'Black Panther' commences its flowering season in early January. Its dark blue flowers, certainly not black,

are held on stiff stems. Gardeners concerned at the weedy tendencies of Agapanthus prefer to purchase sterile varieties. Justicia, another old favourite experiencing a return to favour. J. carnea has pink flowers, white variety alba is also available. This shrub prefers a shady position, the large flower very noticeable at a distance. Crocosma, a bulb from South America, has a reputation as a weed. However, correct selection of species will overcome this problem.

Commencing its flowering season in midsummer, the bright orange flowers are also good as cut flowers. Climber Trachelospermum jasminoides, Chinese Star Jasmine, commenced flowering at the end of October and is still in full bloom. This climber is slow at establishing, a year or two later and growth is very rapid. An asset all year, green glossy leaves and dense coverage make it very suitable for a privacy screen. White, perfumed flowers adorn Madagascan Jasmine, Stephanotis floribunda. A vigorous climber with large glossy leaves a favourite for bridal bouquets. Dainty Hoya bella, miniature wax flower, is a climber very suitable for hanging baskets. White flowers have purple centres.

Gardeners are looking forward to Berry Show on  $3^{rd}$  and  $4^{th}$  February to view the very popular flower, plant and vegetable sections.

Be aware that even with a permit, the lighting of fires is prohibited and the permit is automatically suspended, on Total Fire Ban Days, days of Extreme Fire Danger, or when the Environment Protection Authority declares a "No Burn Day."

## WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING AT

One night a wife found her husband standing over their newborn baby's crib. Silently she watched him. ## NEWS FROM BERRY AND DISTRICT HISTORICAL SOCIETY AND BERRY MUSEUM

#### VALE NAN THOMAS (1915 - 2011)

Nancy Cullum was born in London in 1915. Her father, Ernest, was a church organist, and her mother Emily a schoolteacher. She had an older sister, Peggie. They were not a well-off family, but held together by the hard work of her mother, who instilled in Nan the need of independence and a good education.

Nan excelled in school studies, winning a scholarship to King's College of London University to study Classics, including Latin and French, in which she was fluent. In her second year at University, she won another scholarship to study at the prestigious French college, The Sorbonne. Her year in France was perhaps one of her happiest; she established a long-standing relationship with the French family with whom she stayed, still corresponding with them until recent times. She graduated from University (with a first, quite an accomplishment for a woman in the 1930's.)

Nan had a great love of the theatre and spent her spare time queuing for the 6-penny seats "in the gods" at London theatres to see the famous actors of the day. It was her involvement in the University drama group that led her to meet a charming Welsh medical student, Kenneth Bryn Thomas. Their romance flourished as war threatened and she married "Bryn" in 1939. Three children were born, David, Hilary and Elizabeth.

After the war, Nan and Bryn settled in the English countryside and Nan continued her teaching career, teaching French and Latin, until

retirement in the early '70s. Dreams of travel with Bryn after his retirement were cut short when Bryn died suddenly at the age of 62 in 1978. After a couple of years, Nan made the decision to emigrate to Australia, where two of her children already lived, and arrived here in 1981 at the age of 65, to start a new life for herself.

Her arrival in Berry was serendipitous. Looking around the area with a friend, she came across a house on Victoria Street which had been put on the market the previous day. Nan took one look and decided to buy it, much to the delight of the owner!

21 Victoria Street became her home for the next 30 years.

She quickly became involved with the Historical Society, making lasting friends at the Museum, and served as Secretary and President of the Society. She also became involved in local activities, learning woodworking and German, and supporting the local Aboriginal group for reconciliation. She loved her garden and had a succession of cats as her faithful companions, the last being her beloved Piers.

She stayed in her house until just a year ago, having celebrated her 95th birthday in her garden with her friends. In December 2010 she moved to the Berry Masonic Village, where she has been well and lovingly cared for in her final year.

Nan's family wish to thank you all for your friendship and support for Nan over the years,



and know that you will all take with you your special memories of Nan.

Nan was greatly involved with the Historical Society during her 30 years in Berry. She served not only as Secretary and President but also for many years as a committee member, roster organiser and trainer of new volunteers. Amongst her many other roles at the museum she represented the Society on the Berry Courthouse Conservation Committee and the Illawarra Branch of the National Trust for whom she organised many historical tours of Berry.

She will be remembered with great fondness by the members of the Berry and District Historical Society.

### Berry Nature Corridors: From Escarpment to Sea

Back in March 2011 we wrote about the concept of habitat corridors and the Berry Corridors project. With the imminent Berry Show and our desire to engage the community it seemed timely to revisit this project. Over the last few months a small group of Landcarers have been meeting to develop a comprehensive project plan for this project, with the support of Shoalhaven Landcare Association, and Southern Rivers Catchment Management Authority. The project is financed by a "Caring for our Country" grant from the Commonwealth government.

With increasing incidence of higher and higher maximum temperatures, and the potential for sea level rise and periodic flooding, many native animals are going to struggle to survive. The "Corridors" concept is designed to help animals (and indeed some native plant species) move more freely to escape such climate induced events. Berry Corridors will intersect with the Great Eastern Ranges or Atherton to the Alps project. Its vision is to establish sustainable and resilient vegetation connections supporting the movement of wildlife between the coast and the escarpment.

The initial focus area is to the east of Berry, including Broughton Creek, Harley Hill, Moeyan Hill, Coolangatta Mountain and Seven Mile Beach National Park bounded by the Shoalhaven River to the south.

Whilst there are many "on-the-ground" activities planned, the project recognises the importance of building relationships with the community to achieve support for the works and we see the Berry Show as an important opportunity to do this. Education of landholders is a key issue and some training workshops will be held. Assistance is offered to prepare individual property vegetation plans and a weed and

indigenous species identification service aimed at those properties in the corridor - key educational resources that we can explain to you on the Berry Show Landcare stand.

Win trained in Melbourne as a Deaconess between 1948 and 1950 and was commissioned in 1951. She had short placements at Carlton, Victoria (1950-51) and Albury, NSW (1952-54). Win was hoping to follow in her aunt's footsteps by working as a missionary in Korea, but she was asked to go to Ernabella. This became her life's main ministry, and she lived for 32 years in Ernabella, from 1954 to 1986. Until then, she had had no real previous experience of Aboriginal people and had only lived in large cities and towns. Yet she had an amazing ministry amongst the indigenous community at Ernabella, especially with the women.

It was the policy of the Presbyterian Church that the missionaries learnt Pitjantjatjara, so for several months after arriving, Win had instruction in the local language. She retained fluency in the language for the rest of her life.

Win took over the role of the Arts Centre coordinator at Ernabella (established 1948), and the Centre remains the longest continuously running aboriginal arts and craft organisation in Australia.

For the first 28 years of the Arts Centre, artists worked almost exclusively spinning and weaving wool, and making hand pulled floor rugs incorporating the distinctive Ernabella designs (*anapala walka*). Win introduced different media, always with an emphasis on the quality of production. In particular, she introduced batik into Ernabella in the late 1960's, enabling the women to translate traditional art and designs onto fabric and thus setting up a profitable business. It quickly became a signature art form for Ernabella.

Of her time in Ernabella, Win reflected: "I love that I've had the great opportunity of living and working with the Aboriginal people in Australia. It's a privilege that has been shared with others who have lived with the Aboriginal people – in every case you'd find they're grateful to have been given that opportunity to live with these people and learn to understand their point of view."

Win was able to travel to Ernabella to celebrate the <u>60th anniversary</u> of Ernabella Arts in 2008.

During her 32 years in Ernabella, Win was able to gather a remarkable collection documenting many aspects of Ernabella's history including the church and school. The most significant components of the collection are the many examples of art and craft including batiks and other decorated fabrics, children's drawings, paintings, and various other wooden implements and carvings.

As part of Win's contribution to the religious life at Ernabella, she illustrated lessons and stories with her distinctive drawings. Similarly, her drawings were used on Christmas cards which were sold as a way to raise funds for Ernabella.

Win's contribution to the life at Ernabella was recognised in being incorporated into the local social organisation and given the name, *Awulari*. She was awarded an MBE in 1977 (Member of the Order of the British Empire) and a medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in 1989.

Win wrote several publications including the book *The People in Between*, published in 1968. This is an extract from an article in the Age Newspaper.

Win was a member of the Berry Branch of the ALP and for many years she was the Treasurer of the Branch. She was a stalwart of the Branch and was always busy particularly around election time when she used to do an enormous amount of letter boxing as well as working all day on the polling booth at Shoalhaven Heads.

Social justice was much more than a saying for Win – she lived it! Until ill health forced her to leave the Branch and the home that she loved (and had turned into a library and museum) Win was still very active and was always a fascinating person to spend time with and discuss policy and all things political.

Win will be missed by all her friends and colleagues here in Berry and Shoalhaven.
