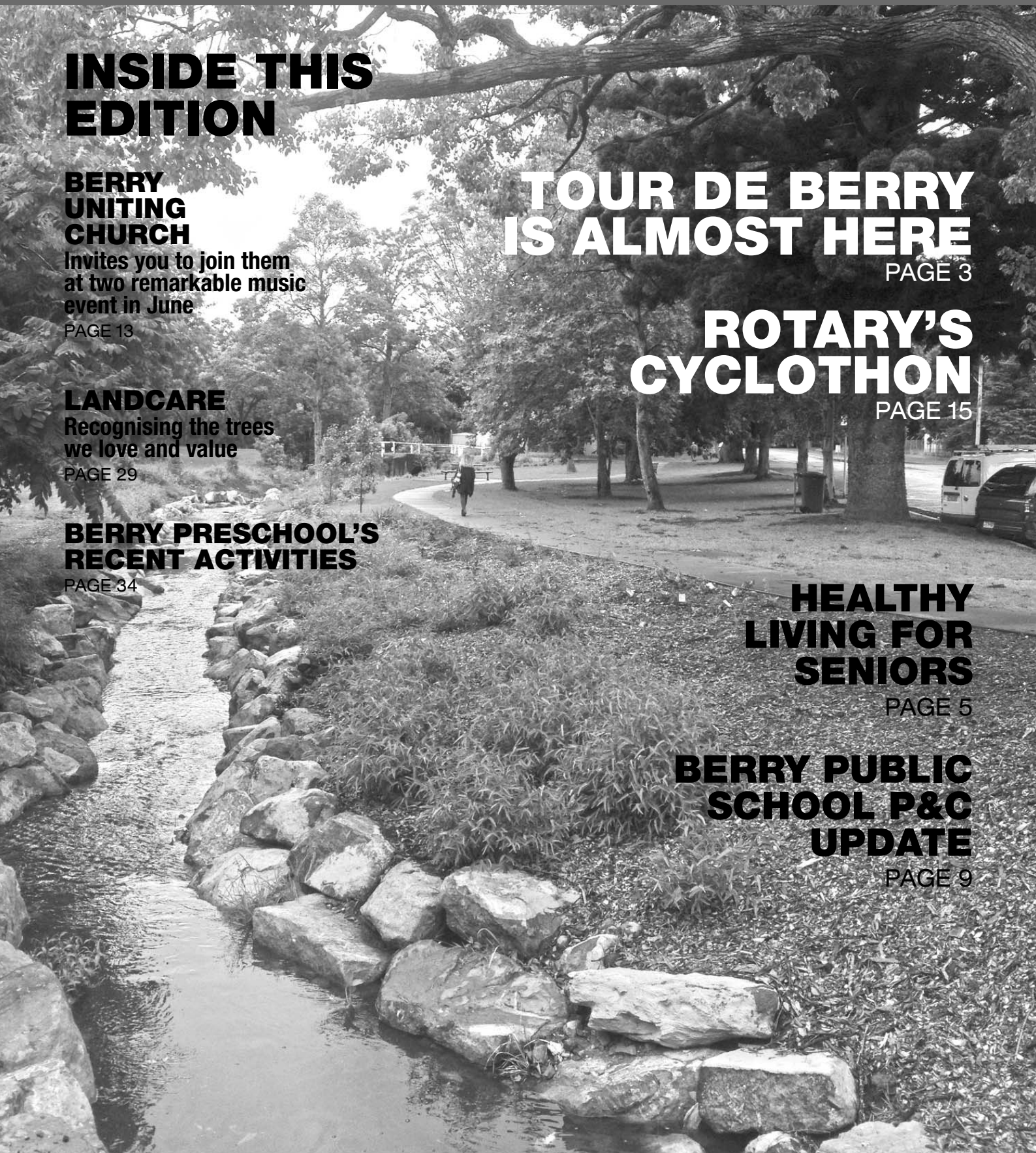

TREES, THE BERRY BYPASS AND SUSTAINABILITY

If you've been to Sydney lately and driven along Anzac Parade you will be aware that many of the magnificent Moreton Bay fig trees are to be cut down to make way for a light rail project. The removal of these significant specimens has caused widespread outcry and dismay. Closer to home, in 2014 the removal of the infamous "Bum Tree" was met with protest, particularly as the larger trees along the Sand Track offered an arboreal corridor link for the endangered superior glider and other species to safely navigate their territory without having to resort to crossing the road at ground level.

In the midst of the construction of the Berry Bypass, we've seen many mature eucalypts and other trees felled, and the destruction of associated habitat. I recently contacted Fulton Hogan to find out how the construction company was managing the project, to see if and how the bypass construction rates in terms of environmental sustainability.

I learned that the project employed ecological specialists to assess every tree before removal. The ecologists assessed endangered flora species and for the presence of animals in the trees. This included nighttime surveillance of hollows identified to establish whether animals were using them. All trees with hollows were felled using a two-staged clearing process. Clearing was delayed on several occasions to confirm birds had fledged and to ensure hollows and wombat burrows were unoccupied. In areas of higher sensitivity, specialist timber harvesting machinery was used to ensure trees could be lowered gently to the ground, enabling ecologists to inspect the hollows and perform rescue and relocation if required. Trees were assessed during clearing and 'hollow' habitat was replaced on a one to one basis with nest boxes, as an alternate nesting site, placed in adjoining habitat. To date the project has installed 269 nest boxes. Recent surveys show the occupation rate after the first six months is approximately 20 per cent, and is expected to increase over time. The project employed the lowest impact technology available in NSW for the clearing of main stands of trees, and areas of higher ecological sensitivity on the project. Timber has been recycled for multiple uses including:

- Kiln dried and sawn logs for use in the new Kangaroo Valley Road Bridge timber bollards;
- Trunks, root balls and coarse woody debris used in landscaping to provide refuge or habitat for native fauna. It has also been used for fauna furniture near the dedicated fauna crossings under the highway;
- The majority of the branches and leaves have been mulched for use in landscaping activities, or for erosion control during

building of the highway. As this material contains a rich source of local native seeds it will complement the bush restoration efforts of the RMS and Fulton Hogan, in conjunction with the volunteers at Landcare and the Plant Propagation project at Berry Public School;

- Some timber trunks have been gifted to the community for use in community projects; and
- The clearing contractor transported most of the big logs for processing into timber or for commercial firewood.

Limits of clearing were identified before the process started, to retain as many trees as possible inside the project boundary. In some cases, the alignment of property accesses or fencing was modified in order to retain trees, including:

- A large stand of trees retained at the Toolijooa cutting by changing the design;
- Trees were protected from clearing on North Street, after residents requested they be retained; and
- Temporary road staging was modified to retain trees. For example, at the entrance to Berry from the north, the final design was amended to retain the stand of Liquid Amber trees adjacent Mananga Homestead.

The completed landscaping design included community consultation regarding selection of species for planting, with local sourcing of seed stock from the bushland directly surrounding Berry. Planting of trees and shrubs has already begun along the newly opened section of road to the north of Berry. The RMS is currently evaluating potential BioBank sites to compensate for the Foxground and Berry bypass project's impact to vegetation and habitat. Rural landowners within 50 kilometres of the project were invited earlier this year to register their interest in protecting native vegetation on their property under a BioBanking agreement. More than 40 property owners have responded and Roads and Maritime is now in the process of assessing the properties for the bio diversity offset package. The Berry Forum

It's the First Anniversary of the Berry Forum – our first official public meeting was held on 11 June last year.

Over the last 12 months we have made a lot of progress –

- A Committee of 12 elected members has been meeting every 2-3 weeks and the meetings are productive and enjoyable.
- Forum public meetings are held bi-monthly on the second Thursday of the month and attendance has varied between 60 and 80 on a regular basis. Fulton Hogan present at the beginning of each Forum meeting on progress with the Highway and their plans for future works.
- We have networked with the other main groups in Berry and offered a communication channel out to the community. Council departments now have a conduit to the Berry community, and requests from Council are always dealt with promptly.

- We've established a quality website which relays important information to the community, promptly and with clarity, and our email distribution now reaches over 700 residents. Minutes of every Forum meeting and Committee meeting are posted on the website, normally within 5 days of the meeting.
- In September last year a Sub-Committee was formed to oversee the development of a Strategic Plan for Berry and the concept and development process was presented to the community at the October Forum meeting.
- In September a presentation was made to the Forum on the preliminary Berry District Park Master Plan and we have continued to work closely with Council on the project.

It's been a productive and rewarding twelve months and the Committee is looking forward to maintaining momentum with the development of the Strategic Plan for Berry. There's never been a better time to get involved!

Berry Courthouse Has a Face Lift

The Courthouse has had a wonderful new paint job! All the old flaking paint and lead based paint was correctly removed and encapsulated, a full preparation was undertaken and two fresh coats of paint were applied. This was all done over the last couple of months and the results are wonderful.

This kind of work is necessary to preserve Heritage buildings such as this and need to be undertaken regularly to ensure there are no damp problems as well as ensuring the building looks it's best for our community.



It is not an inexpensive process and the Management Committee undertook to seek funds to assist Council in the works.

We are very grateful to the State Government for a donation of \$12,515 to assist and Gareth Ward, Member for Kiama was at the celebration function to hand over the contribution.

The total was made up of approx. 50% Council, 25% State Government and the remaining 25% was contributed by the Berry Courthouse Management Committee. Deputy Mayor John Wells was also in attendance and he joined the President of the Berry Courthouse Conservation and Museum Committee and Gareth Ward in singing the praises of this remarkable building.

The passion for the building was evident in all three addresses and from the many Committee members and volunteers from our community there on Mother's Day afternoon. We encourage the community to have a look at the freshly painted building (pay particular attention to the Coat of Arms on the front of the building – it is outstanding) and consider hiring it for an event or function. Weddings are very popular in the private hedged garden and on the steps of the Courthouse.

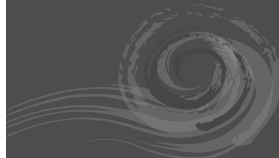

We are very lucky to be able to bring to Kangaroo Valley some of the country's finest musicians.

Emma Matthews is a highly acclaimed and awarded soprano. She has performed with all the state opera companies and the major Australian symphony orchestras, as well as at Covent Garden in London, and with conductors including Vladimir Ashkenazy, Marko Letonja, Sir Charles Mackerras and Simone Young. Her performances have won her the admiration and affection of hard-to-please opera audiences as well as concertgoers. Elena Kats-Chernin was born in Tashkent, now in Uzbekistan, and moved to Australia in 1975. Some contemporary composers' music can be hard to approach but Elena Kats-Chernin's work is generally very accessible and playful.

She and Tamara-Anna Cislowska are two of Australia's leading female pianists. They have collaborated extensively over twenty years in creating improvisations around Kats-Chernin's music. Audiences respond very positively to the sense of immediate creation that flows from this improvisatory approach. They will play together at 11.30am on Sunday 26th June.

Around 100 attendees, including several distinguished women from the District Board, and the Mayor of Goulburn, joined the festivities.

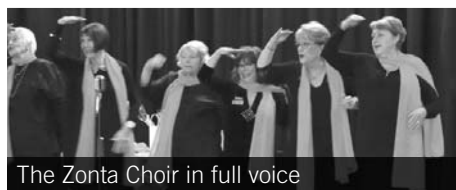

The Club recently held another breast cushion assembling day, so we now have a useful stack of these comforters ready to be given to women and men of the Shoalhaven after breast surgery.

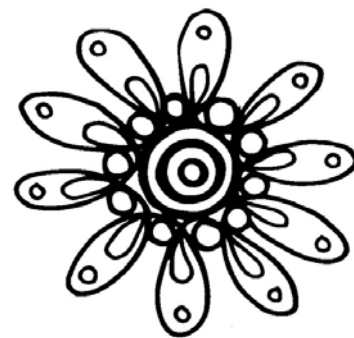

Fire Permit Update

The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period in the Shoalhaven Local Government Area ended on 31 March 2016.

From 1 April 2016, fire permits will no longer be required for the Shoalhaven Local Government Area.

Although fire permits are no longer required, property owners must still exercise caution and follow guidelines regarding the use of fire.

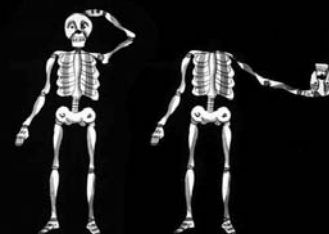
Residents must notify neighbouring land owners and their local fire authority at least 24 hours before burning, as well as taking appropriate action to ensure containment and control of their fire so it doesn't escape and cause damage.

Penalties still apply for failing to notify that you are lighting a fire and for allowing fires to escape.

Berry Conversations Off to Promising Start with April 17 Event

The inaugural Berry Conversation on April 17--featuring Angus Trumble, Director of the National Portrait Gallery-- proved to be a popular event, drawing many from Berry as well as other parts of Illawarra and the Shoalhaven. Held in the prize-winning Berry Sports and Recreation Centre Hall (which itself drew admiring comments from those seeing it for the time), the event saw an audience of 125 listened as Berry resident Mary Cunnane talked with Angus about how Australian art is presented and perceived overseas; the challenges of heading up a major national cultural institution in a time of budgetary constraints; and his early career as aide to the Governor General of Victoria, Davis McCaughey as well as his time as Senior Curator at the Yale Center for British Art in the US. They also discussed the books he has published, as well as the novel on which he is now working;

Compered by Bill Pigott, the discussion was then opened up to members of the audience who put a series of thoughtful questions to those on stage, after which everyone retired next door for sandwiches, wine, pastries and "Conversation Punch."

"Nowra East Public School aims to create and continually build upon stimulating, supportive learning environments while incorporating quality teaching and learning programs for all students. Students regularly participate in Aboriginal dance groups, school community garden workshops, choir and drumming programs, gymnastics, representative sporting teams, Wellbeing, Koori Wellbeing and Mindfulness programs.

Our school library endeavours to be a calm learning space for all users. Students are regularly encouraged to use the library as a relaxing space during recess and lunch breaks. Along with reading and borrowing pursuits, students are involved in using our growing collection of Lego, puzzles, board games, mindfulness activities along with computer technology. Staff and students work collaboratively to build research capacity and develop critical thinking skills in conjunction with an appreciation of quality literature."



In our monthly newsletters we hear about a variety of countries and the work carried out by the mission, this month we heard about New Leprosy cases on the increase in PNG, especially amongst children, in 2012: 276, 2013: 380, 2014:540. 2015 figures are not yet available.

It is in the shadow of poor communities where people with leprosy are hiding from shame. Gouwo Gomu, a 45 year old wife and mother, is one of those new cases of leprosy. Ashamed and isolated, she quit her job as a nurse aid when she first got the disease. What would others think? Her husband and children were the only ones who cared for her. The villagers who were once her friends were too frightened to come near her. But after multi-drug therapy she's now a highly-valued health worker in her community. Among her roles are birth attendant, HIV/ AIDS advocate and leprosy ambassador. If only all cases in PNG could work out so well. This shows the urgent need to remain vigilant about finding and treating cases quickly. We are always happy to have your ongoing support and interest.

Berry Significant Tree Register - recognising the trees we love and value

The many beautiful and mature trees which contribute to the Berry townscape justify our reputation as the 'Town of Trees'. The patchwork of native vegetation and farmland around Berry also contains a valuable heritage. This includes magnificent old-growth trees, rare species, habitat trees and trees which add character and beauty. In recognition of our trees and their contribution to our lives, Berry Landcare is establishing a community-based internet register of significant trees in the Berry district.

The register will form a pictorial album, accessible to all internet users, and will be compiled from public nominations with the consent of property owners. The excellent research already conducted on this subject by the Berry and District Historical Society could be collaboratively applied in the creation of the register. The register would be open to both introduced and native species and adopt a range of significance criteria. It is intended that the register will promote community pride in our environment and showcase the aesthetic, historical, and ecological values of our tree heritage. Where necessary, sensitive location information will be protected.

Important characteristics of the register will be its celebration of the Berry district and its trees, its compilation by the local community, and the absence of any obligations on property owners. This is in contrast to other heritage registers which are

not locally based, are generated by top-down administrations, and seek to restrict landuse. Berry Landcare would like to thank the Veolia Mulwaree Trust for a recent donation of \$1000.00 towards the development of the tree register. We are approaching our funding target to launch the register and Berry Landcare would welcome further offers of sponsorship.

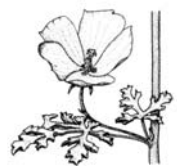

Weed and Native of the Month:



Paddy's lucerne: (*Sida rhombifolia*) An erect herbaceous shrub to 2m high, with fibrous stems and a deep taproot. Flowers are pale yellow, five petalled to 10mm dia, and subtended on long thin stalks. Leaves are green lanceolate to obovate, toothed edged 1-5 cm long, underside paler with fine hairs. Seeds germinate throughout the

year and are dispersed by the barbed seed on clothing and fur. Remove by hand.

Native Hibiscus: (*Alyogyne huegelii*). Fast growing, rounded shrub reaching height of 2-3m, about 1.5m wide. Flowers are beautiful large mauve hibiscus-like in spring and summer. Leaves variable lobed to 6cm. Bird attracting hardy plant. Growth habit and foliage similar to the tomato plant

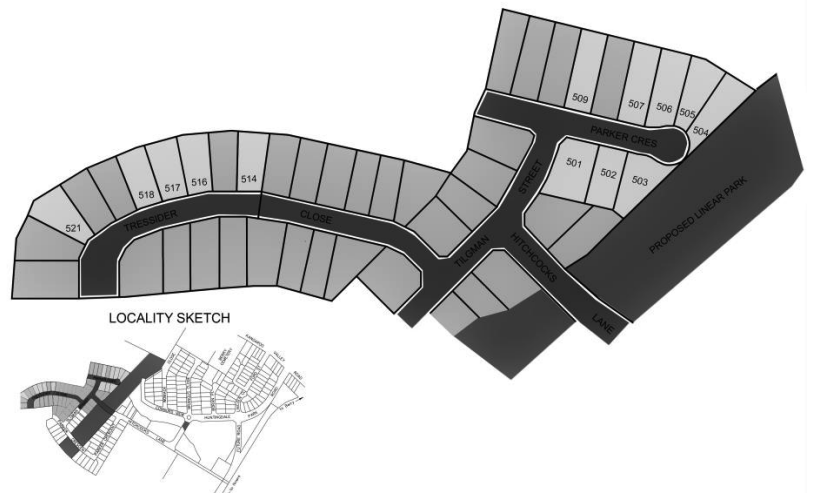

What is a Derby?

What is a Derby? One incarnation is a classic Thoroughbred 2400 metre horse race for three year olds: however Berry Riding Club has introduced another kind of Derby to the events we offer. The Showjumping Derby is a test of skill, timing, versatility and endurance as riders must ride to optimal time over a challenging and varied course. The course distance varies between 750 and 1300 metres and a Derby comprises both conventional show jumps and Cross Country or natural obstacles. Worldwide there are several prestigious and time honoured Derbies held each year which draw huge crowds of spectators and the cream of the show jumping horses and riders. The most famous is at Hickstead in Great Britain which has been held every year since 1960. The notorious Hickstead bank stands 3.2 metres high and competitors must negotiate a 1.45m jump before getting to the top of the bank and sliding down the almost sheer face. How is that for an adrenalin rush! Berry Riding Club decided on a more conservative course but managed to maintain the thrill and fun of a derby for riders and spectators.

On the 8th of May a large group of enthusiastic riders ventured to Schofields Lane to try their hand at our first ever Derby Day. Anyone driving past on the highway would have seen a big turnout of floats and cars and lots of horses. The grounds were covered with brightly coloured show jumps and rustic

cross country fences being negotiated by the brave and bold riders of all ages. Apparently a good time was had by all and course builders Marlene Battedou and Penny Rose are to be congratulated for making the event safe and pleasurable for riders of all skill levels. Thanks also to the judge Cathy and the helpers whose hard work makes events like this possible.

The good news is that it warm spring weather will make it far more pleasant to dress up in the pink Lycra, tulle and sequins that make this day so much fun. 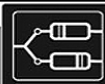
