# The Berry Forum



Seventy two people attended and heard several presentations, including an update on Berry District Park, progress and plans for the Bypass, an update on the Strategic Plan Focus Areas, status of the Rockfield Park appeal to the Land & Environment Court, Council's proposed rates increase, an introduction to Boomerang Bags, and Council's proposed changes to the recycling and waste facilities.

#### **Rockfield Park**

Council will be defending its refusal of the DA at the Land & Environment Court. The onsite hearing at 801 Kangaroo Valley Road, which is open to the public, is on 20 March. The Forum Committee has made a submission (see website) supporting Council's refusal and Stuart Coughlan will be presenting the key points at the onsite hearing. We encourage Forum members to attend to demonstrate to the Commissioner that Berry residents are serious about protecting the Berry environment and challenging developments that attempt to circumvent planning legislation.

#### Council's Proposed Rates Increase

Council is applying to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for a gross increase of 13% in 2017/18 and 14% in 2018/19, to financially support the ongoing provision of service levels to the community

and increase levels of asset maintenance and renewal. Council has agreed to consider establishing a Citizens Panel to provide recommendations on priority areas for expenditure and to investigate potential additional sources of revenue related to tourist accommodation.

## **Berry District Park**

The first meeting of the newly formed District Park Review Group, chaired by the Forum in partnership with Council, took place on Tuesday 14 February.

## **Strategic Plan Focus Areas**

Review Groups have been established for the following Focus Areas -

- Town Centre Develop an inviting Town Centre that highlights Berry's atmosphere
- Infrastructure & Facilities Provide a high level of well maintained infrastructure and
- Sustainability Establish Berry as an environmentally aware community with sustainable practices

Initial meetings have taken place and the membership and terms of reference for each

### **Boomerang Bags**

The bags will be introduced into the IGA in a box with a message 'Borrow & Bring Back'. The bag will include a flyer to explain the purpose of Boomerang Bags and the goals for a "plastic bag-free Berry".

## Changes to Recycling and Waste Facilities

Council has proposed the following recommendations for the Berry facility-

- Change the operating days to three days per week, Friday, Saturday and Sunday and open the buyback facilities on Saturday and Sunday mornings
- Continue operating for 7 days per week from Christmas to the end of the January school holidays
- Close the recycling and waste facilities on all public holidays
- Close and remove the bottle bank from the car park behind the IGA.

## IT'S OUR FINAL CHANCE TO STOP IT!

## ROTARY CLUB of BERRY-YOUTH PROGRAMS

Rotary Clubs across Australia sponsor young people in the development of a whole range of skills including in the areas of communication, leadership, resilience and self-esteem and in furthering their career aspirations. The Rotary Club of Berry prides itself on making a significant contribution to the younger generation.

The March 9th meeting of the Club is bound to be a very interesting night as several of the sponsored participants who attended youth programs during January will come along to give an overview of their experiences at the programs.

Hannah Jones of Berry attended the National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) which is a 12 day residential program conducted at the Australian National University Canberra. For Year 11 students passionate about science, NYSF gives an opportunity to visit a large variety of some of Australia's leading scientific facilities and to talk to many of our top scientists enabling informed career choices to be made.

Also conducted in Canberra is the program known as The Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, (RYLA) which Aaron Plain attended. This program is a 7 day residential seminar for aspiring leaders aged 18 - 25



years. There is a lot of self-development where participants can learn leadership, communication and problem solving skills, practice new behaviours, forge life-long friends and challenge their own personal beliefs and values. For many attendees there is a realisation that they can aspire to higher things in life than possibly they had previously considered possible.

At the recent Honeywell Summer Science School the club sponsored four students from the Shoalhaven High School. This program gives an abbreviated version of the NYSF program and can assist students in their selection of what further studies they may choose to follow.

For younger students aged 15-17 the program known as the Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment, (RYPEN) provides an opportunity for self-development and confidence building. Over past years the Rotary Club of Berry has sponsored dozens of students to attend this camp. This weekend program engages the participants in various activities learning new skills, hearing from others about their life stories, while having heaps of fun and meeting new friends.

The next RYPEN program will be conducted in May, it's a weekend event at Mogo and the awardees selected are fully subsidised by the Rotary Club. This program has beneficially changed the lives of many young people.

All of these programs are available by application, and further information can be accessed via the Rotary Club of Berry website **www.berryrotary.org.au** under the heading of New Generations.



The Berry Chamber of Commerce & Tourism has started 2017 at a cracking pace, with many projects underway to ensure the best possible position for Berry when the re-alignment is opened later this year.

The Chamber Committee is working closely with the RMS, Shoalhaven Council, Shoal-haven Tourism, Gareth Ward and other local groups to finalise the design of tourism sign-age for the town and confirm appropriate sites. This signage is separate from the RMS signage, and is aimed at encouraging people to stop in Berry for a break, instead of bypassing it.

#### **Historical Trails**

We are also working with the Berry Historical Society on developing a historical walking trail around Berry, which will be available on GoogleMaps. Visitors will be able to follow a route around our local historic sites, and read information on the map about each site. Developing this trail is part of a wider project to obtain road signage designating Berry as a historic town, again with a view to encouraging tourists to visit the town.

#### **Advertising**

We continue to actively manage the Chamber's social media sites, and are currently filming some new footage in Berry and surrounds. We are planning specific advertising, both social media and television, at the time of the opening of the realignment later this year.

#### Thank you

The Chamber committee would like to thank everybody who took part in, or supported, the Berry Merry Christmas event last year. We had the biggest turn out to date, and collected around 20 trolley loads of goods for the Shoalhaven Homeless Hub. It was also a very happy celebration of another great year for Berry.

During the last week of school in 2016, Year 3 pupils received certificates at a special school assembly and also took home some of the plants that they had grown during the year.

The take home plants which are available from the school nursery, are hardy and suitable to grow in a wide range of soil types and conditions in the local area, and can be incorporated into most garden designs and small town or villa gardens.






#### Blue Flax Lily (Dianella caerulea)

- A tufted perennial plant from 70cm to 1m tall.
- It grows in clumps and has grass-like leaves.
- In spring and summer the pale blue star shaped flowers are held on long slender stems.
- Small dark blue/purple fleshy berries containing many black seeds develop when the flowers finish.
- The berries provide food for small local birds.

#### Little Breynia (Breynia oblongifolia)

- A small shrub with a weeping habit growing to about 2 metres tall which can be kept compact and dense by pruning.
- The small rounded leaves have a soft appearance.
- The tiny bell shaped flowers in spring are hidden below the leaves.
- The fruits resemble tiny apples and as they develop, they change from green to red and then purple when they are fully ripe.
- The plant attracts butterflies and provides food and protection for small local birds.
- Little Breynia is an understorey plant preferring some shade, but is hardy when established.





#### Native Violet (Viola hederaceae)

- A pretty carpet forming ground cover. It creeps along the ground forming a living mulch, helping to exclude weeds.
- The flowers are white with purple markings and some flowers are present for most of the year.
- It grows best in moist shady places and looks attractive in a hanging basket



## STAYING ACTIVE **PROGRAM**

Shoalhaven City Council has been successful in a funding application submitted to the Aquatic and Recreation Institute of Australia for the amount of \$8,000 to enable Shoalhaven Swim and Fitness Centres to host the Institute's Staving Active Program.

The Staying Active pilot initiative will run from January to June this year and will focus on:

- Falls prevention through improving the strength and balance of participants;
- Combining wet and dry activities water based classes improve cardio vascular health and range of movement, while land based classes improve load, bearing capabilities:

# Highly Strung and Sculpture in the Valley, the 2017 KV Arts Festival

Since 2007 the Festival has brought to the valley artistic greats such as sopranos Yvonne Kenny and Emma Matthews, guitarists the Grigoriyan Brothers, pianist Simon Tedeschi, novelist and poet David Malouf.

Belinda Webster says: 'This tenth anniversary festival will follow our usual pattern of three concerts in the village hall and several Hausmusik concerts in private homes in the valley, offering music in a more intimate setting. We will also present Sculpture in the Valley, which has evolved into a major show'.

Five harps, a quintet of Japanese kotos, and the more traditional Goldner String Quartet are at the core of the 'highly strung' offering this year. Adding to the mix will be a soprano, an accordion-player, as well as a world premiere of a piece by well-known composer Andrew Ford, with Ian Munro at the piano.

'This will be the first time we've had a koto in the valley', says Belinda, 'and we'll be enjoying five of them in the Sydney Koto Quintet, led by the amazing Satsuki Odamura."

The Goldner String Quartet, Australia's leading string quartet, will provide the Saturday evening concert. Ravel's string quartet will be in the program.

The Highly Strung Harp Quintet will be led by Alice Giles. You can see why the festival is indeed highly strung with a commanding 235 strings, 47 on each harp!

Hausmusik concerts will be held at private houses Alcheringa, Serenata and Wollanderri. Satsuki Odamura, Alice Giles and Goldner players Dimity Hall (violin) and Julian Smiles (cello) will play along with Cathie Travers (accordion), and Annette Tesoriero (soprano). The final treat for this festival will be Andrew Ford's piece In Transit with Ian Munro on the piano.

Sculpture in the Valley, Friday 5th, Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th May, 10am - 4pm will be held at beautiful Cedar Grove. Colleen Fry, Sculpture Director says, "Last festival we extended the reach of Sculpture in the Valley to a wider group of sculptors and this was most successful, despite a week of torrential rain. This year we expect to have a sensational range of artists, and definitely better weather! We are looking forward to a great weekend of sculpture!"

## The benefits of Calisthenics for young dancers

(BASED ON AN ARTICLE BY HAYLEY SIMMONS)

For those unfamiliar with 'cali', it is a multidiscipline dance sport involving dance, apparatus (clubs and rods), gymnastics exercises, marching, ballet, singing and acting. You can easily spot a 'calisthenics girl' by her commitment to perfection and technical exactness.

The following are 8 significant benefits of Calisthenics as a dance form:-

#### Structure, discipline and focus

Within their first year of calisthenics, parents will often comment on how their child's focus and self-discipline has improved. This is because pupils learn complicated apparatus manipulation (clubs and rods) and floor patterning in their routines, and are also challenged to learn and remember five to six 2.5-3.5 minute routines. That's serious brain training! It's confidence-building to say the least.

These Tinies are in the Zone of focus, concentration and teamwork.

#### Variety

Children learn a variety of different types of dance and movement as part of one weekly lesson. There is no time to get bored! And if they don't like a particular dance, they can be more willing to tolerate it for love of the other routines, as each provides something different to appreciate.

## Caters for all personality types – the bouncy kids and the fairies

Many kids do not suit the softness of ballet, for whom calisthenics is a great alternative. They do learn the foundations of ballet technique, so they can pick it up again later if they wish. The softer, more ballet-inclined dancers come into their own in an aesthetic routine.



#### Focus on rhythm

Calisthenics participants have fantastic rhythm, owed mainly to marching, and a strong understanding of the differences between all time signatures. Movements are learned to counts, not lyrics or beats, and precision of timing with the music and each other necessitates counting. Therefore, musical appreciation develops early while young ones still have their in-born sense of rhythm and pitch.

## Strength & flexibility in concert

Dance shows a concerning trend towards encouraging hypermobility at a cost to safety, technique and longevity. Calisthenics has blazed a trail in dance over many years to ensure pupils develop the strength needed to balance out the flexibility, and that coaches are adequately trained to ensure this happens. As part of Level 1 compulsory training, every coach completes a 6-hour standardised Strength & Conditioning module developed and delivered by a physiotherapist and/or exercise scientist.

## Opportunities to perform in a theatre

From the age of 3, calisthenics participants perform in a proper, proscenium arch theatre with technical capabilities. These are team performances, and there are also solo and

duo opportunities. From an early age, a true performer is born!

## A governing body – one each for coaches and members

Calisthenics has monitored safety through Banned Movements, to ensure that pupils do not attempt movements unsuitable to their level of training or the performance environment (a non-sprung stage).

## Value for Time and Money

Up to seven dance disciplines in one weekly class across the year – it speaks for itself! Calisthenics is something you can continue until you are well over the hill, with the Masters section. 

## Berry & District Garden Club News

This will be a memorable year for the Garden Club. Our 2017 activities kick off with a soirée in a beautiful garden in Beach Road followed soon after by our February meeting. Preparations for the Camellia Show and Gardens Festival are underway and planning for our autumn tour to Bright is complete. In November we will participate in The Garden Clubs of Australia Biennial Convention hosted by Ulladulla Garden Club. The highlight of our year, however, will be the celebration of our 40th anniversary. It will be a time to reflect on our history and to share our memories.

By 1977, the Shoalhaven Branch of the Garden Clubs of Australia, based in Nowra, had 170 members and was bursting at the seams. Many people from Berry were members of this Club and they travelled to Nowra each month for meetings. The Club either had to find larger premises for their meetings or limit their numbers. A search for larger premises in Nowra, with the facilities they enjoyed at the Masonic Hall in Moss Street, was unsuccessful. The second alternative was pursued. At this time Nancy Bevan from Berry had been the President of the Club for 3 years. She placed a notice in the South Coast Register inviting anyone interested in forming a garden club in Berry to attend a public meeting on 13 July 1977. Twenty-four people attended the meeting with many more expressing interest but unable to attend. As a result the Berry and District Garden Club was formed with an initial membership of 37. The first President was

Nancy Bevan, the Secretary Beverley Ray and the Treasurer Lillian Wilkins. Two foundation members are still members of the Club - Nancy Bevan, who was awarded life membership in 1996, and Chris Hallahan.

Those who consider geraniums a somewhat humble plant would change their mind if they saw the range that is now available. Our March Guest Speaker, Robyn Bible, is a wellknown geranium enthusiast. Last seen in Berry at the 2016 Small Farms Field Days, Robyn can be found at many plant fairs with her geraniums and pelargoniums and happily shares the joys of growing them with others. Robyn inherited her love of geraniums from her aunt who brought many varieties into Australia from her visits to geranium nurseries and hybridisers overseas. Cuttings were potted up, people showed great interest, and so Robyn's nursery began.

Working so closely with families, to the point of being offered a skin name, but knowing the compromise of accepting same, Sue trod a fine line between black and white cultures. I find it amazing when I read about the work of our Auxiliary; we are such a small group that work to support the ongoing effort of the mission. This past year we have forwarded \$9570.00 to head office to be used in projects in Nepal, India and P N G. Thank you to all who assisted with our street stalls and other fundraising efforts.

Leprosy is curable. But centuries, scientists and health partitioners have retailed remedies with very limited success. Some of these remedies are still in use in developing countries today but unfortunately they can cause much unnecessary harm. In a recent field visit to Timor Leste, stories emerged of traditional healers wrapping arms and legs in banana leaves and burning them. Fire doesn't stop the bacteria and the attempted cure disfigured the patient.

Modern medicine can cure leprosy. A combination of three antibiotics kills the bacteria responsible. It's not always a quick and easy fix. It usually takes a year to complete the course. Patients must take multi-drug therapy every day for a year to complete the course, and collect their doses every day for a year. Novartis, a pharmaceutical company, donates the antibiotics but getting to the people who need it requires extra resources. There is a great urgency in curing someone affected by leprosy. The earlier someone can access treatment, the sooner the bacteria can be stopped.

Seed collection for plant propagation and getting to know more about the local plant and bird population.

Most of us can identify the major weed species 'in our own patch', but less is known about the desirable plants. It is no more difficult to get to know the desirable species, and the good thing is, they are more interesting than the weeds, and can be used for garden landscaping as well as for bush regeneration sites, adding greater species diversity which will provide food and shelter for local native bird and animal life.

During some Plant Propagation lessons, the children are shown how to collect seed from native trees planted in the school grounds. Often in February, the Red cedar (Toona ciliata) releases a lot of seed which is collected for propagating in the nursery.

Outside of school hours, the nursery volunteers organise visits to local properties with a view to learn more about local plants and to collect seed for the children to plant. A plant and bird species list is also recorded for each property visited for future reference. Volunteers at the school nursery are also responsible for collecting and storing seed for a local Seed Bank that has been set up particularly for Berry Bush Links and for supplying seed for the highway landscaping. As we gather more information about this country maybe we will be challenged to take on one or two of the climbs???? Maybe.

Our Ag and Environment Officer, Diedre, introduced us to a new little friend, the Quoll. It is a carnivorous marsupial native to the mainland Australia, New Guinea and Tasmania, is primarily nocturnal and spends most of the day in his hidey hole. Quoll numbers are decreasing due to cane toads,



urbanisation, poison baiting, and predatory animals, e.g. the fox. There are five species, the Tiger and Eastern Quoll being the largest. The Tiger Quoll has a cute pink nose, soft fur and white spots that extend to the tail. Don't be over enthusiastic about having them as a



#### Coachwood Escarpment display:

Over the recent holiday period many Berry people have noticed and commented on a display of soft pink colouring in a band along the slope of the escarpment just below the base of the sandstone cliffs. This is an annual phenomenon but this year it has been very noticeable. This part of the escarpment is classified geologically as "Gerringong volcanic" laid down 250 million years ago at the end of the Permian as volcanic deposits. This forest type takes its name from the tree responsible for the display - "Coachwood Warm Temperate Rainforest". The species dominates at high altitudes on the benches and steep slopes of the escarpment. Smaller stands of the tree can be found in forest remnants further down the escarpment. One beautiful specimen is on the corner of Kangaroo Valley Road and Tourist Road.

Coachwood (Ceratopetalum apetalum) is in the same genus as the popular Christmas Bush (Ceratopetalum gummiferium). Their floral displays are similar. Coachwood usually grows to a height of 25 metres, with a trunk diameter of 90 cm. However exceptional specimens can reach 40 metres and live for centuries. The trunk has distinctive horizontal marks, or scars, which often encircle the trunk. Larger trees have short buttresses. Its timber is light and easily worked. It is used for flooring, furniture and cabinetwork, hence its name. Courtroom 3 of The High Court of Australia is furnished with coachwood. The flower petals are white but the pink colour comes from the calyces that remain after the petals fall. One feature of this marvellous tree is the fawn carpet of fallen detritus under the mature trees in late summer.

There are many of these floral displays taking place in our beautiful landscape throughout the year, from native orchids to Turpentine trees. Surely one of the rewards of living here in the Shoalhaven is the understanding where and when these miracles of nature take place. Join us at Landcare.

## Weed of the Month:

Sacred Bamboo (Nandina domestica) is not a Bamboo. A popular garden plant, it is regarded as a weed. It is listed as an environmental weed by the Blue Mountains City Council, and it is occasionally found in bushland edges and along drainage lines in that region. It has recently been found growing wild on the south coast. Its distinctive red berries while attractive are poisonous to birds. Some of the modern cultivars do not produce fruit, or produce fewer fruit, and are therefore not as invasive.

Stage 1 also includes a dual lane indented entranceway from Schofields Lane which will really improve safety and access. A wash bay area, the erection of the storage shed and spectator shelter will also be part of the amenities. 


