Street parade commencing at 9.30am with Pipe Bands & Celtic Clans.


Full day of entertainment at the Berry Showground with a mix of musical items plus a traditional haggis hurling contest.

Tracks to the Future

The shareway (footpath and cycle way) between the Railway Station and Victoria Street along Alexandra Street next to the Showground has a little more work to be completed.

- Our seat ends have arrived and the timber and the rest of the installation is currently underway. Thanks to a couple of our members and the Berry Mens Shed – all being arranged by lan Parker from our Committee. Soon there will be two seats along the path for people to rest on.
- The garden beds near the Showground entrance and Gilliam Street are still a work in progress and we are arranging more soil and some mulch to finish these before the planting is done. Again we have lan Parker arranging this with some assistance.

When these two matters are finished our 2011-2012 project will be complete. The Tracks Committee are very happy with the many positive comments we have received about this and it is proving to be a very popular pathway. Our next project – a Shareway along George Street from Victoria Street down past Berry Public School to Albany Lane has hit a snag and may be delayed or broken into 2 or 3 stages. Unfortunately our Committee was not successful in our application through our State Member Gareth Ward to the State Government

for some funding to help with this and we now have to re-visit our plans. If we break it into stages and are successful in applications for funding assistance from other groups or other areas we may well be able to do at least one or two stages of this project this year. Perhaps the provision of safer drop off points for parents and carers dropping off or picking up kids at the school will be the first priority as this is a current issue with the school and the P&C. We will keep the community informed on our progress.

Meanwhile, we are still looking for donations and contributions for our future projects if you can assist us. Also, if you would like to come on to the Committee and assist us we would welcome some new help.

There is an article in this month's Town Crier calling for people interested in a Tour de Berry event and this is a fundraising opportunity for the tracks Committee.

Call for Bypass Community Reference Group to be Reconvened

As reported in the last edition of the Berry Town Crier Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) is now undertaking a detailed cost review of a southern alternative route for the Berry Bypass as well as continuing work on their "preferred" route which goes to the north of the Berry township.

This southern route review and assessment is running in parallel with the continuing work on the RMS "preferred" route and concept design to the north of Berry. As part of this process; the RMS held meetings of the 4 Working Groups concerning the RMS Preferred Route to the north of Berry relating to the following issues:

- 1. North Berry precinct
- 2. Kangaroo Valley Road Interchange and Victoria Street precinct
- 3. Berry bridge and northern interchange
- 4. Austral Park Road interchange and heavy vehicle rest area

Many Berry residents participating in these working groups are getting frustrated at the lack of progress in resolving key issues of concern in relation to the design of the Bypass. The RMS called for submissions from the Berry community on their revised alignment in December last year. This revised alignment contained many design improvements compared to earlier RMS designs particularly the lowering of the Berry Bridge and moving the alignment away from North Street. However, there remained areas of concern to residents including the lowering of the alignments along North Street and the loss of connectivity between Berry east and Berry west caused by the design of the Kangaroo Valley Road interchange. Neither of these issues has been satisfactorily resolved. The RMS has ruled out lowering the road and providing a pedestrian bridge across the Bypass at the western end of North Street. They have not yet adequately responded to design suggestions from community members to simplify the design of the Kangaroo Valley Road interchange to provide improved pedestrian and cycle access from west to east Berry and lessen the impact on Mark Radium Park and the adjacent trees.

There is very limited time to resolve these issues before the bypass environmental assessment is submitted to the Department of Planning under the Part 3a approval process. It will be very difficult

to make amendments to the concept design once this approval is received. RMS have only held two meetings for each of the working groups since the December submissions and Berry residents involved in the working groups report that RMS seem to be treating this as an urban design exercise rather than addressing the fundamental design flaws in revised alignment. Too much valuable time is taken up with presentations by consultants at a conceptual level which add limited value to the issues of concern.

One area which has drawn very limited criticism from residents is the Berry Bridge and Northern Interchange where there is acceptance that the design is the best possible considering the constraints of topography and flooding. This is because the Community Review Group (CRG) convened in August last year was invited by RMS to nominate members to attend a joint two day design workshop on the Berry Bridge and Northern Interchange. These community members introduced some creative thinking (previously rejected by RMS) which reduced the height of the bridge and moved it further from town.

This type of creative thinking is needed now to resolve the remaining issues with respect to the northern alignment. Design deadlines are looming fast and some breakthrough thinking is needed now. Better Options for Berry (BOB) have written to Gareth Ward member for Kiama to request him to urgently request the RMS to reconvene the Bypass Community reference Group.

This group has demonstrated in the past a capacity to hold the RMS accountable and work constructively to deliver outcomes for the best interests of the whole of Berry.

These Working Groups are having further meetings and the RMS has been making all their notes from these meetings available on the RMS web site. It is important that Berry residents continue to attend these meetings to ensure the hard won gains on the northern route are not lost. For instance the height of the bypass where it passes parallel to North Street could end up meters higher if the current plans for diversion of Town Creek are not supported or a review of road design results in higher grades in this area.

SPECIAL MEETING TO CONSIDER BERRY PLANNING ISSUES

Shoalhaven City Council will be holding a Special Development Committee meeting in mid May to consider submissions to the Shoalhaven Local Environment Plan (SLEP) relating to the township of Berry and surrounding areas.

When the draft SLEP was exhibited last year over 3000 submissions were received covering the whole of the Shoalhaven. The Berry Alliance was actively involved in this process and held two public forums on the impact of the SLEP on Berry and prepared background papers and pro forma submissions on issues of concern to the community. Many residents from Berry made submissions although Council have refused to advise us of the number of submissions specifically relating to Berry. However Council have recognised that the number of submissions warrants consideration of Berry specific issues in a separate meeting of Council's Special Development Committee.

The issues identified by the Berry Alliance of particular concern to Berry residents were:

1. Important Issue for Berry - Lot Sizes in Huntingdale Park (DCP 70)

The Berry Alliance fought hard on behalf of local residents to have lot sizes in the Huntingdale Park development reflect existing patterns of development. The idea was that lot sizes should gradually increase as you got further from town. After considerable consultation and debate Development Control Plan 70 was passed by Council in 2004 which reflected these principles. In particular part of lot6 DP1115338 was designated with minimum lot sizes of 2000 square metres and open space was provided. This has not been recognised in LEP 2009 where the whole of this land is designated with a minimum lot size of 500 square metres. This has the potential to double the housing density in this development.

It is recommended that SCC change lot sizes on the lot size mapping to ensure lot sizes match those in DCP70.

2. Changes of Zoning of Rural Land in Beach Road, Agars Lane and Bundewallah Road Berry

Land zoned as 1(c) Rural Lifestyle in the previous Local Environment Plan (LEP 1985) has been moved into R5 Large Lot Residential zone in the draft SLEP. Under LEP 1985, and the subsequent NSW Government Commission of Enquiry in 2001 into 1(c) Rural Lifestyle Zonings, these lots are protected from further subdivision. The Commission of Enquiry supported the limits on the number of such lots contained in LEP1985. This has been lost in LEP2009. For instance lots previously zoned Rural 1(c) in Beach Road and Agars Lane Berry are suitable for small scale agricultural use and need the protection of rural lots against further subdivision and alienation of valuable agricultural land. Other lots in Bundewallah Road Berry currently zoned as 1(c) Rural Lifestyle are suitable for small scale agriculture whilst others are adjacent to land that is of high conservation value and need the protection of Environmental zoning. They will not have such protection in the R5 Large Lot Residential Zoning in SLEP 2009.

We recommended that SCC add zones RU4 Primary Production Small Lots and E4 Environmental Living to SLEP2009 as outlined in LEP Practice Note PN11-002 and move land previously zoned as 1(c) Rural Lifestyle in LEP1985 into these zones depending on their current land use, minimum lot sizes and proximity to land of high conservation value. This was considered at a meeting of Council's Special Development Committee on 4 April and supported by Councillor Guile from Berry. Council officers have been asked to do a desk top study on affected areas previously zoned Rural 1(C) to determine their suitability for zoning other than Residential R5 prior to the re-exhibition of SLEP after submissions.

3. Height of Buildings

This is a most controversial issue which will impact the pattern of development Shoalhaven wide. The current LEP states in clause 33 "a building must not be erected to a height greater than 2 storeys, including car parking space, above natural ground level, without consent of council". SLEP states in clause 4.3(2)"the height of a building on any land is not to exceed 11 metres except where the maximum height is shown for the land on the height of buildings map". Council have stated they intend to include height of building maps for any areas covered by DCPs. In Berry this will cover the town centre and land zoned R2 low density residential. This means that the rest of Berry and surrounding areas can have 11 metre high buildings. This is of particular concern for the medium density zoned land in Berry and Huntingdale Park. We recommend that SCC remove the reference to 11 metres in clause 4.3(2) and include height of building maps on all areas of Berry to reflect the existing form and scale of

4. Biodiversity Protection

A number of residents, particularly those involved in the local Landcare groups, have suggested that the SLEP needs to include mention of corridor protection in its aims, it needs to show the entire corridor on its mapping and it needs a Biodiversity protection clause to reject DA's that would preclude the movement of wildlife or otherwise destroy the functionality of a corridor. The sensitive areas that are mapped are protected by biodiversity clauses in section 7 of the SLEP. However, these biodiversity clauses are weak compared to those used by neighbouring Councils such as Kiama. This has been dealt with by Council and it has been decided not to strengthen the biodiversity protection in SLEP. Whilst this is not a Berry specific issue, local Landcare representatives wish to raise their concerns with Councillors in an effort to reverse this decision.

5. Land Uses in Rural Zones

Residents are concerned and want to maintain the viability and scenic quality of rural land in the Shoalhaven. Rural primary production land is zoned RU1 however there are a number of permitted uses in RU1 zoned land such as offensive industries, air transport facilities and mining which are considered incompatible with primary production. Rural landscape land is zoned RU2 and again there are a number of permitted land uses such as caravan parks (and mobile homes!!) which should not be permitted on rural landscape land.

These land uses were debated by Council at a meeting on 23 March and it was decided to keep them in SLEP despite the concerns raised by Councillor Gareth Ward and other elected councillors who supported our position.

6. Jaspers Brush Airfield

The Berry Alliance has already held one public forum on the proposed DA for a Sky Diving Facility at Jaspers Brush Airfield and this issue was also raised at our SLEP forum in September 2011. A majority of the local community are opposed to the establishment of the sky diving facility but have some empathy with the local recreation pilots who want to continue to use the airfield. These same residents do not want Air Transport Facilities as a permitted use in the RU1 zone that covers Jaspers Brush Airfield.

At the Special Development Committee meeting on 8 March a majority of councillors rejected a recommendation from professional Council staff to exclude Air Transport Facilities as a permitted use in RU1 zones. There is sufficient opposition from other elected councillors that this could be turned around at a full council meeting.

Review of RMS Working Group Presentation - Monday 16th April

Austral Park Road Interchange and Heavy Vehicle Rest Area

The RMS Project Officer reviewed the actions taken by RMS since the Meeting of 5th March. Austral Park HV Facility redesign to accommodate comments from previous meeting was presented. Sound Footprint Map of the Austral Park HV Facility was presented. Nungarry HV Facility upgrade design was presented. The pros and cons of the alternative solutions to the HV Facilities were discussed. Additional Environmental studies are required at Nungarry. Cost estimate differences were presented: - Nungarry \$5.1m - Austral Park \$5.7m. Nungarry HV Facility Upgrade removes the serious safety issues of inadequate deceleration and no acceleration lane. Nungarry HV Facility will continue to be used if Austral Park HV Facility is built requiring continuing double maintenance expenses. When RMS Inspectors use Nungarry HV Facility the absence of acceleration and inadequate deceleration lanes requires the reduction of the speed limit of all southbound traffic on the Highway to 80 Kph. Truck drivers have complained about the absence of the acceleration Lane and will probably not use the facility if Austral Park HV Facility is built. The Nungarry HV Facility Upgrade will require separate funding outside the Princes Highway Upgrade funding.

Broughton Village Interchange

The redesign of the Broughton Village interchange without the Austral Park HV facility was presented. Two options were shown with variations to Northbound off ramp to Southbound on load ramp intersection. Option 1 as T-Junction, Option 2 as Slip Lane. Shoalhaven Council Engineer present suggested a third option. Project Officer stated that the interchange redesign resulted in a preferable solution of the interchange.

Toolijooa Ridge Cutting

The Fauna Crossing at the Toolijooa Ridge cutting was discussed. Rope Bridge over the road and the dedicated Fauna Underpass were compared to the vegetated Land Bridge as recommended by the RMS Toolijooa Ridge preferred Option Report (2009). RMS Environment Officer advised the vegetated bridge cost was prohibitive and DEH had said that it did not represent value for money, however he was prepared to meet separately to discuss as wallabies, kangaroos and others cannot transit the current designed crossings.


Saturday 31st March 2012 saw the second Berry Riding Club Dressage competition being held under clear blue skies. Allison Dillon and Belcam Centucky 1st in the Elementary 3B and 3C with Keira Byrnes and Fox Hill winning the Medium 4A and 4B. 1st placegetters for Advanced were Julee Jones and Mac (5A), and Kim McDonald and Reveller 5B. Foxground and Berry bypass

Update



Community working groups looking at the design of the northern alignment

RMS has held a number of working group meetings with community members interested in discussing various design aspects for the northern alignment of the Berry bypass. Various design ideas have been discussed and published on the project website at **www.rta.nsw.gov.au/fbb**. RMS encourages feedback from the community.

Discussions at the northern bypass workshops have included many ideas which are being considered by the design team. At the same time, the Technical Investigation Group is doing a comparative cost analysis of a southern route.

RMS would like to thank the Berry community for its contribution to these discussions. We are getting closer to a decision being made about going ahead with a northern bypass or doing further environmental investigations if a southern bypass route becomes the preferred option. The Minister will be making this decision from the research and findings currently underway.

A summary of the ideas and discussions developed during the working groups are outlined below.

Berry bridge and northern interchange

- Discussion on the latest concept design including a proposed access road to connect properties north of Berry to the northern interchange.
- Consideration of a second northbound off-ramp at Woodhill Mountain Road.
- · Opportunities for tourist signage for Berry.
- Urban design treatments for the proposed bridge and northern interchange. Four short-listed design options for the Berry bridge were presented to the community working group for community comment. Copies of the design options are available from the Berry project office or the project website at www.rta.nsw.gov.au/fbb.

North Street precinct

- Exploring whether the alignment could be further lowered without affecting the performance of the highway.
- Urban design treatments for the proposed noise wall. Three short-listed options (see opposite) were presented to the community working group for comment. Please provide RMS with your comments by 11 May 2012. Call 1800 506 976 or email foxgroundandberrybypass@rta.gov.nsw.au.
- Urban design treatments and recreational opportunities for the residual land between North Street and the bypass.
- Pedestrian and cyclist connectivity between North Street and Kangaroo Valley Road.

Kangaroo Valley Road interchange and Victoria Street precinct

 Urban design treatments for the Kangaroo Valley Road bridge.

- Investigating alternatives for moving the northbound off ramp or whether it is feasible to move the interchange further south.
- · Options for reducing the footprint of the interchange.
- Traffic movement impacts on local roads following the upgrade.
- Pedestrian / cycle connectivity across the highway.
- Reviewing the impacts of closing Victoria Street and making the southbound on ramp one way.

Austral Park Road interchange and heavy vehicle rest area

- Reviewing the latest concept design of Austral Park Road interchange and the southbound heavy vehicle rest area.
- Discussing the upgrade of Nungarry heavy vehicle rest area as an alternative to building new facilities at Austral Park Road.
- Impacts on the flora and fauna wildlife corridors.
- Noise and visual impacts.

Southern Berry bypass route review


The Technical Investigation Group is still working on its cost review. This review involves considering a number of technical investigations and the ideas of community members. Some of these ideas are relevant to the northern option, so they are being considered by the designers at the same time as the northern option community workshops are deliberating. This will ensure a 'like for like' comparison in the cost review, which will be published in the final report.


RMS held a community Q&A session on 30 April 2012 to discuss the decision making process and the progress of the review. The findings from the report are subject to an ongoing independent review to ensure that the southern route review and the inputs from the community are being properly considered. At the conclusion of the independent review, RMS will provide a recommendation to the Minister for Roads for consideration.


Other news: Berry to Bomaderry upgrade

Changes to Berry Cemetery

The Berry Alliance is happy with the following recommendations after an extensive consultation with the Berry community.

We hope that Council will endorse these recommendations at the next meeting.

We take this opportunity to thank the Council Committee and Chair Clr Bob Proudfoot who allowed the Berry Alliance President to make a formal presentation to the Committee seeking some changes to the recommendations from staff. (Removal of the Liquid Amber trees and retention of the Date Palm tree). These recommendations were then voted to be included in the recommendations to the full Council Committee for their final decision.

The matter of the post and rail fence along Kangaroo Valley Road was agreed to be retained and there has already been quotes for the replacement of this fence and the cost will be covered by a separate budget item within the department. The retention of this fence was a clear view of the community during the consultation process and we appreciate the department accepting that view and implementing it so quickly.

Berry Alliance

Recommendation:

Shoalhaven City Council Policy Resources & Reserves Committee has recommended the following to Council:

- 1. a) Council implement measures to manage the allocation of burial places within Berry Cemetery as follows:
- i) The proposed holder of a burial licence resides or at the time of their death resided within 10km radius of Berry; or

- ii) The applicant is able to declare by statutory declaration that the proposed holder of the burial licence has or had a strong or proven family connection with the Cemetery, i.e. forbears buried in the Berry Cemetery; or
- iii) The applicant pays a 33% surcharge for the burial licence, based on the scheduled fee for a burial licence at the time of the application where conditions (i) and (ii) above cannot be clearly established.
- b) Vacant burial places to be allocated among original graves, subject to a heritage assessment to be undertaken in the original part of the Cemetery.
- 2. Unused burial licences, issued more than 50 years ago, be revoked for re-allocation, in accordance with the Crown Lands (General Reserves) Amendment (Sustainable Burials) By-law 201.
- 3) Vehicular access within Berry Cemetery be restricted by:
- i) The issuing and control of entry permits for vehicles over 3 tonnes gross weight, including the weight of trailers being towed by the vehicle.
- ii) Restricting and controlling vehicle access to sensitive parts of the cemetery through the use of bollards and other planned obstructions.
- iii) Limiting the time visitors' vehicles are allowed to remain in the cemetery (sign posting)
- 4) Management of trees within Berry Cemetery:
- i) Implement a Camphor Laurel eradication and reinfestation control program.

- ii) Removal or replacement of other trees be carried out, with exception of the date palm which is to be retained or relocated within the cemetery, in a planned way to make additional space available for burials, taking into consideration the Tree Management Plan.
- 5) Construct a new memorial garden and columbarium area at the entrance side of the cemetery at the earliest opportunity utilising funds of \$77,000 from the Bereavement Services Capital Works Program (Job No 75891).
- 6) Remaining funds currently assigned to Bereavement Services Capital Works Program (Job No 75893 Shoalhaven Memorial Gardens Covered Outdoor Area) of \$37,000 be used to provide additional funds for the Stage 1 construction of the new Memorial Garden & Columbarium at the Cemetery.
- 7) Savings of \$5,000 from Job No 75843 – Cemetery Crematorium Plant and Equipment Fund be used to provide additional funds for Stage 1 Construction of the new Memorial Garden & Columbarium at the Cemetery.
- 8) The Liquid Ambers along Kangaroo Valley Road should all be removed and replaced with appropriate native species that do not grow as tall and do not have the invasive root systems that liquid ambers have.

Well it has been a long time since I wrote an article for the Town Crier and I have had a few people encouraging me to start again so here goes. Firstly, I have heard some comment that Berry does not have a police officer anymore, this is incorrect. Berry has one officer but being only one it often means the station is not maned. Berry Police have a mobile number which is 0428222496. This number will be on when I am working and feel free to call it or leave a message for non urgent jobs. For urgent jobs it is always best to call 000 and if I am working I will attend and if not Nowra Police will. I hope locals are starting to notice some improvements to the station with a lot of work being put in for the 150th celebrations. The station will be open on 1 May for those interested to have a look at the old cells and to maybe meet the resident ghost! If you have a group that wishes to see the station on another date that can be arranged by making contact with me on the above mobile or the station number, 4464 1404.

Those of you who are registered gun owners will know that we are checking all firearms and storage safes in the area at the moment. If you have not heard from a police officer could you please contact me at Berry Station as it is possible that we may have missed some of you. If you have unregistered or unwanted firearms I can assist you with there disposal which is far better than getting caught with them.

I will now go through the past month or so of incidents that have occurred locally.

On 14/04/12 between 1am and 10am one of our very popular restaurants, Silos had a break and enter which was very serious.

If you happened to be driving past that location and saw anything or any vehicles during that time please let us know. On 31/03/12 Turfco had an attempt break and enter with some damage done. That was between 11:00pm and 6am on 02/04/12.

On 30/03/12 the tip on Agars Lane had some property stolen during the night with an early model white Ford Falcon sedan and 2 males sighted.

WEEDS

It is not hard as a gardener to get disheartened by the sheer magnitude of the weeding exercise. Here are a few tips for effective weeding. For a garden with local indigenous plants, the first challenge is to know what is classified as an environmental weed. A good start is the booklet distributed by Shoalhaven Council "Weeds of the NSW South Coast". Importantly this also describes the "look-alikes". As total eradication of weeds is not possible it is best to improve the ratio of natives to weeds. If they get a head start they will thrive. To avoid killing the natives you must be able to distinguish them from the invaders both as seedlings and as mature plants. The booklet advises how to control the weeds. Your local Landcare contact can also help. The Landcare rule is not to kill anything you don't recognise.

To get ahead of the aliens requires a strategic approach. Hit them when they are exposed and vulnerable. One approach is to take advantage of the way plants spread their seed and propagate. This can be by wind, water or animals, including humans or by suckering. The flowers are the identifying feature of the plant and the fruit are the vehicle of dispersal. Generally plants of the same species flower and then fruit concurrently. With many there is a time between flower and fruit, typically Moth Vine. The appearance of the flowers will identify where the plants are so that they can be removed or treated before fruiting. Some disperse seeds from the blown flowers and these must be gathered when in early flower, typically Fireweed. Madeira vine propagates from tubers on the vine and requires scraping and poisoning the base of the vine.

As plants species flower at specific times all through the year it pays to be aware of the plants in flower around you when in the country side. This has other rewards especially in spring. We recommend these booklets: "Weeds of the NSW South Coast and "Grow Me Instead"."





WRESTLING FOR REAL

I have never really got into it. Friends have, but I just don't see the point. Millions of people watch it every week. Many grown men get dressed up in the most bizarre outfits to support it. What am I talking about? Professional Wrestling. I am not talking about the type of wrestling that we would see at the Olympics, but the type of professional wrestling that involves make up, costumes, chairs flying, and general chaos. The type of wrestling that involves names like 'Stone Cold Steve Austin', 'Hulk Hogan', and 'The Rock'.

If ever I have been somewhere and this type of wresting has been on TV, I try to talk to the people about the fact it is not reality. But they don't care; many people love the theater of it all and enjoy the show as entertainment. And of course they always try and tell me that it is not setup, and that each bout is real and nobody knows who is going to win.

Well I meet each week with many wrestlers right here in Berry and our surrounds. Wrestlers that look just like you and me. These are people that are not just putting on the act; they wrestle for real...wrestle with big issues, wrestle with things in their own lives, wrestle with local issues, wrestle with global concerns and the biggest test of all...they wrestle for real with God!

Followers of Jesus don't have all the answers, we are wrestlers. In our church we want to



RED CROSS - BERRY BRANCH



March was Red Cross Calling month, an annual event to raise funds for Red Cross services throughout Australian and the Asia Pacific. This year Berry Branch was pleased to transfer a total of \$2,363.15 in funds raised during Red Cross Calling. For the first time, throughout Australia, Red Cross members were permitted to collect from Australian Naval Bases. We wish to thank the staff of HMAS Albatross for assisting our members by giving generously and making our members feel valued and welcome - in one hour, \$1003.15 was raised, a just reward for our members who met at 6 am to make their way to Albatross. Good one!

Disaster Relief and Recovery Work is still our primary focus - with 6000 people having been affected by floods in NSW alone. Regional Manager Judy Harper stated that 'locally, we have had volunteers assist at Goulburn and Bega centres, while other volunteers were on standby to assist at Queanbeyan for some time. We also had 8 local volunteers travel to Moree to assist with the Recovery Centres and Outreach work, and a number of volunteers went to Wagga Wagga as well. Very positive feedback has been received from FACS about the competence and availability of our volunteers.'

Locally, the Red Cross has a Retail Store in Schofields Lane, Nowra run by loyal hardworking members of the Nowra Branch. Recently there has been a campaign to address an urgent need for donated items. 'Don't ditch it, regift it!' do you ever receive gifts that well, hmm? Why not regift it to our Red Cross Shop. 'Red Cross stores rely on good quality donations of clothing, bric-a-brac, toys, books and all store profits support the work of the wider Red Cross'.

There will now be a combination of volunteers making calls to clients from their own homes as well as volunteers making calls from the new office in Nowra. Berry Garden Club

After two weeks of dry weather, I write this article during heavy rain. Members of the Garden Club visited a local garden this morning; a landscaper's exotic garden filled with interesting bamboos, palms, bromeliads, ferns and lush tropical foliage plants. The site is sheltered by walls of bamboo and overhead foliage from trees and palms. Members were fascinated by the variety of colour and pattern in the bamboo stems. Concern is often expressed at the invasive nature of these plants, however when purchasing bamboos take care to choose those of a clumping nature. Apart from the very attractive stems, leaves were varied in size and shape. Of great interest is the trunk shape and pattern of palms, some plaited, some triangular, others ringed and smooth. Leaves of the Fishtail palm, Caryota urens attracted attention; as the common name implies the leaves are shaped like a fishtail. It is grown as a source of sugar in South East Asia. This is the palm admired by visitors to Cairns Airport where it is grown en masse.

Deciduous trees in Berry and surrounding areas are beginning to display their autumn colours, a wonderful time to admire nature's handiwork, enjoy different leaf shapes and the range of yellow, orange, red and purple tints. Admiration never ceases. Some members of my family live in Queensland and Northern NSW; I send them leaves to emphasise what they are missing. This is a superb time to visit the Blue Mountains Botanic Garden Mount Tomah, apart from the superb colour of the autumn foliage, many trees and shrubs will be displaying

colourful fruits. Viburnum, Berberis, Holly, Rowan may grow well in the Berry district; however the fruit display often requires a colder climate.

An article entitled 'Swanning around; the tyre swan in the Australian garden' recently appeared in Australian Garden History magazine. According to garden historians, the tyre swan is Australia's contribution to garden ornaments. Writer of the article is Richard Heathcote, Director of Carrick Hill Historic House and Garden located at Springfield in Adelaide's foothills. Richard has purchased four tyre swans and these will be displayed in the proposed Australian Gardening Museum at Carrick Hill. Historian James Broadbent is quoted as saying a decade ago 'the ornithology and habitat of this endangered species is, as yet, improperly studied. Until verified sightings are recorded in Europe, Asia or the Americas, it must be assumed to be an indigenous species (both black and white) of mainly coastal Australia, ranging in latitude from Tasmania to northern Queensland. Sightings in WA have yet to be confirmed. Its habitats appear to be determined by their eco-systems.' I know of two people in Berry who own one of these ornaments, they may have to keep them under lock and key.





MEDIA RELEASE

BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD ENDS 29 MARCH 2012

The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period in the Shoalhaven Local Government Area ended Saturday 31 March 2012. From 1 April 2012 fire permits will no longer be required for the Shoalhaven Local Government Area.

"Although fire permits are no longer required, property owners must still exercise caution and follow guidelines regarding the use of fire," said James Morris Media Officer Shoalhaven. "Residents must notify neighbouring land owners and their local fire authority at least 24 hours before burning, as well as taking appropriate action to ensure containment and control of their fire so it doesn't escape and cause damage. "Penalties still apply for failing to notify neighbours that you are lighting a fire and for allowing fires to escape.

"Even though the weather is cooling down and there has been significant recent rainfall locally, there is still the potential for fires to threaten life, property and the environment." If residents do wish to conduct burning activities, they should ask the NSWRFS for advice, permits and approvals and:

- Give fire authorities and neighbours at least 24 hours notice.
- · Check weather conditions/Total Fire Bans.
- Delay the burn if concerning winds are forecast.
- Create adequate fire breaks.
- Have adequate water resources and fire fighting equipment on hand.
- Supervise the fire at all times.
- Call Triple Zero (000) immediately if fire escapes.

"We encourage people to seek advice from their local NSWRFS Fire Control Centre on how to safely conduct hazard reduction activities such as slashing, trittering and burning, and how to prepare their homes for the next bush fire season," said James Morris Media Officer Shoalhaven. Satellite Subsidy Scheme closes 30 April 2012

Applications for the Australian Government's Satellite Subsidy Scheme will close for the Berry area on **30 April 2012.**

The subsidy is only available in areas that need satellite TV because a local TV tower is not being upgraded to digital.

If you live in the Berry or Kangaroo Valley areas, you should check your eligibility today to avoid missing out on the subsidy:

The Satellite Subsidy Scheme subsidises eligible households' installation of satellite TV equipment, including a high-definition Viewer Access Satellite Television (VAST) set-top box and satellite dish.

The VAST service provides all 16 free-to-air digital channels from the ABC, SBS and commercial broadcasters, plus a dedicated regional news channel.

Eligible households make a one-off contribution of \$220 for the installation. There are no ongoing fees or charges to access the VAST service

If you are receiving the full rate of the age pension, disability support pension, carer payment, Department of Veterans' Affairs Service Pension or Department of Veterans' Affairs Income Support Supplement, you may be eligible for VAST installation free of charge under the Government's Household Assistance Scheme (HAS). If you are eligible you should have received a letter from Centrelink, but you can call 1800 556 443 if you have not received a letter but think you may be eligible.


