April Alliance and Community Consultative Meetings

At the April Alliance and the CCB meeting the following issues were discussed and reported on:

CB Executive Meeting with Councillors and Senior staff.

Berry Alliance President Rick attended this annual meeting held recently and amongst other things when the matter of Council Policies was raised for input the Alliance raised the issue concerning the lack of consultation on "the Bum Tree Affair" (widening of Gerroa Road and resulting tree removal).

The General Manager agreed to review their consultation process. Council have also appointed a liaison staff member to address Shoalhaven CCB's correspondence and concerns. A Power Point presentation and the Meeting Notes have now been provided by Council.

Safety Around Schools meeting at Council.

The annual Safety Around Schools Seminar was held in March and the Alliance President attended along with the Berry Public School Principal Bob Willets and many other School Principals and senior staff representatives.

Council Staff, school Principals, RMS representatives and Community Consultative Bodies were there to discuss safety around schools

Of particular local note was the issue of extending the school bus zone in Clarence Street. (This issue has now been discussed at the April Berry CCB meeting and it was decided to write to Council saying that the CCB had no issues with this proposal as it had been previously advertised and the community consulted and that work should

go ahead without delay but that the immediate neighbours should be approached for final feedback. The work will result in a safer drop off and pick up zone at the school by avoiding the necessity for buses to swing out wide from the kerb to get past cars parked in front of them (right near the Victoria Street intersection).

Seniors Week

A big thank you to all those who contributed to this annual event. It was an overall success. It had made connections with new local senior residents. Walks went well. The Museum had a good number of visits, the lunch was well attended as was the Berry Men's Shed.

The Berry Alliance invites any ideas, involvement or thoughts for future Seniors Weeks including events and promotion.

Road Works in the Berry Area

The Berry Alliance has been discussing the recent and future road works in our area with Council. As a result of those discussions we have asked Ben Stewart, Director of Assets and Works at Shoalhaven City Council to provide us a précis of current and future major works so we could keep the community informed.

We have also discussed future consultation and how to get the best result for our community and also how best to keep Council informed of what our community sees at important and necessary.

We welcome Council's approach on this issue now and this précis (see below) from Ben.

We also welcome the agreement reached that we would sit down with Council staff to explore important road issues so Council can take those issues raised into consideration.

LETTER FROM COUNCIL:

Shoalhaven City Council is upgrading roads in the Berry area, including Gerroa Road, Coolangatta Road, Woodhill Mountain Road and Bolong Road over the coming months.

Shoalhaven City Council is reconstructing a 1km section of Coolangatta Road. The full width reconstruction of the road will also involve widening the road from its current width of less than 6 metres to 8 metres. The scope of work in this section has considered existing batters, drainage, vegetation, property boundaries, fencing and the amenity of cyclists with an allowance of 1m shoulders outside the 3m wide travel lanes. The contractor Roadworx are expected to commence after the school holidays, weather




permitting. While the road will remain open, motorists are expected to experience delays when travelling in this area.

Roads and Maritime Services have previously advised they will be completing a speed zone review on Coolangatta Road and Beach Road, Berry following requests from residents.

Council management is looking towards early and ongoing involvement of the Berry Alliance and the community in relation to the future stages of Coolangatta Road to be upgraded. The next section of Coolangatta Road that requires rehabilitation is very complex with drainage, mature trees and property boundaries restricting the project, it is proposed to meet with the Berry Alliance and explore these together. This engagement with the community on major road work is to ensure Council identifies issues that need to be considered.

Shoalhaven City Council is also reconstructing sections of Woodhill Mountain Road, Berry in coming months. Councils work crews are expected to commence in the middle of May, weather permitting. This works involves reconstruction of the pavement in two stages to minimise disruption. The work is to commence in the lower sections. Unfortunately due to the recent extreme wet weather, work in shaded and steep areas will be delayed until drier conditions prevail. While the road will remain open, motorists are expected to experience delays when travelling in this area. These works are part funded through the Roads to Recovery program.

Stage 2, of Bolong Road works is a continuation of road and shoulder widening.



These works are currently underway to improve subsurface drainage, shoulders and bitumen sealing on a stretch south from Coolangatta Estate to the old Coolangatta school. This work is funded by the NSW State Government.

Gerroa Road works involves shoulder construction, this will also commence in May. This is a continuation of the work on the shoulders over this 6.5km stretch known colloquially as the "Sandtrack" from the Beach Road intersection south towards Shoalhaven Heads, consideration is being given to the type of bitumen seal on the shoulders based on requests from cyclists and residents. This work is funded under the Nation Building Blackspot Program.

The key benefit of these works is improving road safety. The project teams will ensure that any disruption is kept to a minimum, Council suggests that motorists plan their journey.

South Coast Scoops the Pool

South Coast Dairy Milk virtually scooped the pool at the 2014 Sydney Royal Cheese and Dairy Produce Show winning overall Champion Milk at the Show and receiving 3 Gold Medals and 3 Silver Medals.

Gold Medals were received for whole milk, skim milk and lite milk, and Silver Medals for organic milk, organic lite milk and fresh cream.

Dairy products have a long history with the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW, with a tradition of competitions that stretches back more than 150 years. With around 1,000 entries in various classes, the Sydney Royal Cheese & Dairy Produce Show is one of the most prestigious and competitive events in the dairy industry in Australia. To win a coveted Sydney Royal medal is recognition of excellence in product quality and flavour.

Chairman of South Coast Dairy Paul Timbs was delighted with the results and said that this is the second time that South Coast Dairy has been awarded Champion Milk at the Show, having won it previously in 2007.

"We have won awards nearly every year we have entered the Show, but this year was a great achievement and gives us much confidence for the future in knowing that we have a product that is best in its class."

South Coast Dairy is part of the Berry Rural Co-operative.

A total of 7 farmers are shareholders of the Co-operative and supply their fresh, premium quality milk daily for processing and distribution under the South Coast Dairy banner.

The Cooperative is soon to start construction of a new processing plant adjacent to the Rural Store in Old Creamery Lane, Berry.

ROTARY CLUB PRESENTS The 8th Annual Berry Celtic Festival on 24th May

The 8th Annual Berry Celtic Festival to be held on Saturday 24 May is once again featuring the grand street parade down the main street of Berry before the start of the Festival at the Berry Showground.

If you have not seen the grand street parade before, with all the distinctive colourful kilts and bagpipes playing, then don't miss it this year. It starts at 9.30am from the top of town near Apex Park and proceeds along Queen Street and down Alexandra Street to the Showground.

The parade offers a fantastic opportunity to get close to the bagpipes and drummers. The pipe bands are joined in the street parade with various Celtic Clans, Scottish

Terrier dogs, vintage cars and hot rods. And for the first time, a local craftsman built replica of Chitty Chitty Bang Bang will join the street parade ... this vehicle will astound you.

First off at the Berry Showground comes the marching of the massed bands with the heavenly sound of the bagpipes reverberating around the showground ... you need to be there to feel the thrill of the occasion. Then commences a day full of entertainment with musical items, Celtic fiddlers, highland dancing and singing, lots of stalls to view ... plus the Tartan Warriors.

The Tartan Warriors are always a crowd favourite as they compete against each other to determine the strongest man of the Festival. Along with lifting the amazing 'Stones of Manhood' they also attempt to toss the mighty caber. The Stones of Manhood consist of a set of five huge stones ranging in weight from 100kg to 165kg which are laid out five metres apart, lightest to heaviest with each competitor having to lift all five stones onto wooden barrels. The person who can lift all five stones in the fastest time is declared the champion.

The Berry Celtic Festival is a fundraising project of the Rotary Club of Berry and is proud to have the support of many other community groups and service clubs including Zonta Berry, the Berry Showground Trust, Berry Chamber of Commerce and Shoalhaven City Council. Net proceeds from this year's event go toward the activities of Shoalhaven CanAssist, Berry's Paradise Farm, ROMAC (Rotary Oceania Medical Aid



for Children) and other Rotary projects. Entry to the Showground is \$10 adults, \$5 children or \$20 a family.

REDUCING PART 2 LANDFILL

OUT OF DATE OR UNUSED MEDICATION: Old medications left around the house can be a source of poisoning of small children, and can lead to confusion or mistakes if you don't remember it's original purpose. Don't throw away out of date pills or liquids, or put them down the drain. The chemicals can leach into waterways. Chemists and pharmacies will take any un-required medication, whether it's prescription or over-the-counter, for correct disposal.

PLASTICS, ETC: The Tip will take most plastics for recycling, along with aerosol and steel cans, motor oil, and polystyrene. Plastic bags can be recycled at most supermarkets, along with other plastic packaging materials. Charity shops are often grateful for clean plastic or paper shopping bags for reuse.

BATTERIES: Rechargeable batteries are great in theory, but they aren't suitable for all applications. If you need to use non-rechargeable batteries, they should never go in the bin when they are flat. Both rechargeable and non-rechargeable batteries can leak, and don't belong in landfill. Unlike many European countries, Australia has only recently made battery recycling easy and accessible. All Aldi supermarkets will take your used batteries. The tip has collection points both for household and car batteries, free of charge. Car batteries can also be disposed of during the council clean out.

TYRES: Car and tractor tyres are accepted at the Depot for a fee, but it's worth ringing around as tyre retailers offer competitive rates, which can be a big saving if you have several tractor tyres to dispose of.

GREEN WASTE: As there is no council collection of green waste, a lot ends up in landfill. An alternative is to take it to the tip. There is a small charge for drop off, but while you're there you can pick up a load of free mulch in return!

E-WASTE. In 2011 it is estimated that 24 million metric tonnes of electronic waste material was dumped in landfill across Australia. With the introduction of digital TV, and with electronic items being relatively cheap to buy and expensive to repair, it's likely that figure is now higher. If you are upgrading a still working item, you may wish to give it away, as most items have a low resale value. Try listing your item on the IGA notice board, or online through sites such as Freecycle. The Tip accepts items like computers, laptops, keyboards, and televisions for free. In 2012, 670 metric tonnes of e-waste was recycled locally. Other recycling programs:

MOBILE PHONES. Old phones, chargers and batteries can be recycled. These can be recycled at the local post office through the



MobileMuster program, which has been running for around fifteen years. In that time, the program has saved over seven million handsets and batteries from ending up in landfill. However, it is estimated that only 9% of unwanted mobile phones are recycled.

PRINTER TONER CARTRIDGES. You can drop off used cartridges at post offices or retailers when you buy replacements. If you are upgrading a printer, remember that companies that sell cheap printers make their profit through the sale of the toner cartridges. Large retailers usually display printer specifications, so you can compare how many pages to expect from the life of a toner cartridge for similar printers. Printers that have separate cartridges for cyan, magenta, yellow and black are more economical to use, rather than printers with an all-in-one cartridge system, as you only replace the toner you need.

Hazel King's Gardening News

Recently, a group of club members visited Melbourne's Dandenong Ranges. This beautiful part of Melbourne is home to the famous Mountain Ash, Eucalyptus regnans which, at 90 metres, is the tallest hardwood tree in the world. It is also native to Tasmania. The famous Australian botanist Ferdinand von Mueller measured some of these trees in the 19th century recording a height of 300 feet (100m) making them taller that Sequoiadendron gigantea, the famous USA conifer, the tallest soft wood tree. Australia also boasts the second tallest hardwood tree in the world, the Karri Eucalyptus diversicolor, native only to south-west Western Australia. Literature quotes 'these Australian Eucalypts are not suitable for the home garden'.

Retained Firefighters are a diverse group of people who balance work and family commitments to work on an 'on call' part time basis for Fire & Rescue NSW. They are trained to work as a team, and deal with emergencies such as fires, road accidents and hazardous material spillages.

Retained Firefighters work from their local Retained Fire Station, and work closely with other emergency services such as the New South Wales Rural fire Service, Ambulance Service of New South Wales and the NSW Police Force. They also play a valuable role in their communities by educating those around them in Fire safety


If employed as a retained Firefighter you will complete eight days of training. This includes two sessions of four days each at our training facilities at Albion Park .Phase 1 training will include familiarisation with Firefighting techniques,

use of equipment and work health and safety procedures. Phase 2 will build on this with instruction in first aid, basic life support and the use of defibrillators and rescue equipment. All Retained Firefighters continue to receive ongoing training including fortnightly drills at their local fire station.

Retained Firefighters are paid an hourly rate for attending incidents, training and drills at the station and a fortnightly 'Retainer'.

At the time of "the Bum Tree Affair" and removal of trees along Gerroa Rd, Berry Landcare wrote two letters to SCC, one expressing concern about the extent of the clearing and the other on "The need to mitigate the impact of the current program of vegetation clearance within the easements of Gerroa and Crooked River Roads, and a call for the installation of fauna over and underpasses and arboreal nest boxes."

The letter made the following points:

- Berry Landcarers are local residents and Shoalhaven ratepayers;
- Our main goal is the effective conservation management of ecological and habitat values within the Berry Wildlife Corridor between Barren Grounds Nature Reserve with Seven Mile Beach National Park, with remnant vegetation connectivity having a vital habitat role in the future viability of flora and fauna populations;
- The Berry Wildlife Corridor recognised in the South Coast Regional Conservation Plan and the Southern Rivers Catchment Action Plan, and forms part of the South Coast Regional Strategy; one of ten biodiversity corridors identified in the Shoalhaven to Illawarra sector of the Great Eastern Ranges Initiative.
- The Gerroa and Broken River Road easements occur within this Corridor provides an important contribution to the viability and connectivity of the corridor through Seven Mile Beach National Park and nearby wetlands and littoral rainforest communities on adjacent freehold lands.
- Seven Mile Beach National Park is notable for its high density of arboreal mammals and large number of reptile and frog species. including a resident population of Greater Gliders (Petauroides volans)
- Shoalhaven City Council supports the conservation management of habitat values across its jurisdiction, having made a variety of positive policy statements and resolutions in its State of the Environment Report 2008/12 and its Roadside Environment Management Plan 2000.
- The issue of roadside vegetation is a complex one in which multiple and sometimes conflicting factors must be evaluated, including those of functionality and public safety.
- Concern that ecological and habitat values are not effectively represented in the evaluation process, and that broad scale policy objectives are neither given necessary emphasis or the resources to result in on-ground action and positive outcomes.
- A Review of Environmental Factors was produced for the Gerroa and Broken River Road easement clearing works, but was not made publically available, nor subject Page 24 - The Town Crier

to a period of public comment or review.

- This alienated residents, landowners and road users from the decision process, severing Council's decision from its justifying analysis.
- Without a transparent process, or public exhibition of the REF, there was no assurance that the impact on habitat was necessary, properly evaluated or will be effectively mitigated.
- Future instances will occur in the Shoalhaven where the management of road side vegetation will require evaluation in a context of conflicting issues and interests, including the conservation management of ecological and habitat values, and wildlife corridor interconnectivity, which are now mainstream issues of interest to the general community.
- That Council instigate a transparent assessment process for future decisions on the clearance of significant native roadside vegetation, in which all issues are evaluated and presented in a document subject to public comment, prior to Council approval and the commencement of any works;
- That policy commits to the conservation management of natural heritage, ecological and habitat values are given due consideration; and effective actions are followed through to mitigate identified impacts on ecological and habitat values.
- · The removal of a number of old growth trees from the road easement has reduced the number and distribution of tree hollows suitable for the habitation and nesting of arboreal wildlife, such as birds, possums and gliders, and has increased the distance between the edges of the remaining forest canopy on either side of the road easement. This has significantly compromised the ability of both terrestrial and arboreal fauna, and notably gliders, to pass between the forest habitats except via a hazardous on-ground traverse across the roadway. The latter, exposes animals to impact from cars, and predation by carnivores.
- These consequences will pose a significant risk to the long term viability of the glider colony, the glider population becoming more isolated, or split, in a territory too small and homogenous, and at risk from car impacts and animal predation.
- To mitigate the ecological impacts of the clearing program, and fulfil existing policy objectives and commitments made by Council regarding the conservation management of habitat and wildlife corridor values across the Shoalhaven, Berry Landcare recommends wildlife hazard advisory signage at regular intervals along the road where it parallels native vegetation; installation of nest boxes, especially those suitable for gliders, arboreal fauna overpasses and terrestrial fauna underpasses.
- Wherever the Berry Wildlife Corridor is

traversed by public roads, signage should be erected at either end of the Corridor, which identifies the Corridor and warns of the potential for encountering wildlife;

 Berry Landcare remains dedicated to achieving positive outcomes for both the community and its environment and looks forward to learning of the Council's response to our recommendations and future liaison on the important issue of maintaining the viability of wildlife corridors across the Shoalhaven.


