Plastic Free July and the war on Waste

Many readers will have seen the recent three part documentary series War On Waste that aired in May on ABC television. If you missed it, all three episodes are available for viewing online on ABC iview until January next year. While this is not the place to repeat all the facts and statistics the show presented, a few stood out for me:

- Food waste thrown into landfill is a source of methane, a greenhouse gas far more potent than carbon dioxide.
- We're still buying and disposing of too much cheap fashion, which becomes a major contributor to landfill.
- High-fired glass such as wine glasses and incandescent light bulbs should not go in the recycling bin.
- Take away coffee cups are not disposable. That last fact may surprise you. Many people believe that the paper cup can be recycled. Unfortunately, to make a paper cup impervious to liquid, a fine plastic film must be applied. That means the cup cannot be recycled with other paper and cardboard items, and contaminates recyclable paper and cardboard loads. Further it will not break down in landfill. The plastic lid may be recycled, but to use an item for less than five minutes is hardly environmentally aware. Speaking to café owners around town I got various answers regarding the cost of their take away cups. One café owner told me it costs them 23c per cup. While some cafés offer a discount for customers who bring a reusable cup, it was pointed out that it should not be up to the business to subsidise the choice of the consumer. Instead, adding the real cost of the take away cup, would give

consumers a more informed choice; whether to accept the additional cost, to buy their own reusable cup, or to simply stay put for the couple of minutes it takes to enjoy a coffee.

France has banned disposable coffee cups (along with other plastic cups, plates, food boxes and cutlery) with the new law coming into effect in 2020. Australian laws lag behind in this area, and in single-use plastic shopping bags. Communities such as ours are making efforts to cut down on plastic bag use, but until legislation bans these single use items, we will continue to see them clog up our waterways, poison our marine creatures, and add to landfill.

The only way to effect change is to demand it at the highest levels. In 2002, the Bangladesh government imposed a total ban on single use plastic bags, with countries such as Taiwan (2003), Rwanda (2004), Eritrea (2005) and China (2008) following suit. Plastic pollution remains an environmental issue in those countries. Some Australian states have already banned single use plastic bags, but the ABC documentary clearly shows that the legislation is flawed, with loopholes that still allow retailers to give away plastic bags.

While you can like a Facebook post or sign a petition about banning bags, the most effective way for consumers (and voters) to make an impact is write to our relevant policy makers. Politicians will take more seriously those people who take the time to write a letter about particular issues.

Two Years Old and Growing Fast

It's the Forum's second anniversary and the number of residents receiving our regular email updates has grown to 800+. Our bi-monthly public meetings continue to be well attended and generate very positive feedback.

A great outcome was achieved at the June Forum meeting with community endorsement of the new Master Plan for Berry District Park. The project has been a showcase of how the Forum can work productively with Council in bringing community stakeholders together to develop a solution that is acceptable to all parties.

The project's momentum has been greatly assisted by the support of Clr. John Wells, who proposed an amendment to Council's 2017/18 Budget to allocate \$165,000 for detailed design and engineering work, which will make it 'shovel ready' and eligible for State Government grants. Councillors unanimously accepted the amendment.

Gareth Ward has also committed to lobby on our behalf to obtain significant grant funding.

revised Master Plan for the Berry District Park, progress on the Bypass, the status of the Green Bronze Plaque project for historic buildings in Berry, and an overview of the background to the increase in land values and Council rates.

Berry District Park

The Park will be a core piece of infrastructure that will play a strategic role for both the town and visitors with the imminent completion of the Berry Bypass.

Recently, the District Park Review Group (DPRG), a joint initiative of the Forum and Council chaired by James Robinson and Clr Wells, recommended to the Forum Committee that a revised Master Plan for the District Park be put forward to Council for adoption.

The Master Plan was collaboratively developed on 4 April by key stakeholders and users of the Park through a workshop process devised and run by the DPRG The primary highlight of the workshop was confirmation that the

identified competing uses of the Park can in fact be designed to exist harmoniously together. During the detailed design process the Forum will seek and welcome further community input and comments on individual aspects of the site design. For example the specific siting, architectural and landscaping treatment of components such as public amenities and the proposed fitness stations are expected to undergo more detailed review.

The revised Master Plan was presented to the Berry Forum meeting on June 8, as was the background to why the redesign was needed, and the process used to develop the Master Plan. The meeting endorsed the recommendation that the Master Plan be put to Council for adoption. Both the recommended Master Plan and the background report can be found on the Forum website.

The Forum Committee would like to thank the members of the DPRG for their excellent work, and now looks forward to working closely together with Council, key stakeholders, park users and the Berry community more broadly to progress the Berry District Park project as quickly as possible to being shovel ready.

The next Forum Meeting will be held on Thursday 17 August.

The Courthouse has some outside employed help coming in to do some major pruning and clearing as well as our long term commitment of someone doing the lawns and hedges and our own Committee with Geoff in particular looking after the fountain doing the fences, gates, steps, lighting and other necessary maintenance. With the garden volunteers (along with our co-ordinators Kim, Rick and Geoff) the daunting job of keeping the gardens and buildings looking good at all times is less daunting, in fact, achievable.

A special thank you for the fun group on

June 7, we look forward to a continuing fun

and productive effort.

Some of the major works on the list are: pruning of the Port Wine Magnolias; trimming plants as appropriate to allow the lights in the garden to do their job; removal or pruning of a couple of Junipers next to the Statue of Justice so the statue can be seen and the hedge can grow back; pruning and shaping the crab apples in the blossom walk; removal or reduction of the strelitzias which are taking over; some pruning to keep leaves and debris out of the gutters; a gravel top up on the paths; replacement of the back fence and gates; moving some of the seats and trimming plants around them for a better look and quite a lot more.

The roses are to be trimmed by representatives from the Berry Garden Club and this is used as an outing or teaching others in the club how to prune roses. There is also consideration being given to thinning the roses and moving them to allow for sufficient space as they are very crowded which precludes perfect pruning and the finished look.

Following the completion of the painting of the outside of the building last year the gardens being continually looked after is very important.

Our photo shows a whole lot of our members and some special guests at the "Paint Party" following the completion of the painting late last year.

Special guests included Gareth Ward (Member for Kiama) handing President Rick a cheque from a successful grant application to assist in the painting; Clr John Wells (representing Council who also contributed to the painting). 

Why are native plants grown in tubes, not round pots?

Square tubes have internal ridges which encourage roots to grow vertically. Any roots that have a tendency to grow horizontally will be redirected downwards.

Round pots allow horizontal roots to develop and unless plants are regularly repotted, the roots will grow in a spiral form and will never straighten, even when planted in the ground. The plant will become pot bound and never develop to its full potential.

After native seedlings are planted into tubes, they are placed in a crate which allows free drainage and air movement and space for the roots to grow and to be air pruned when they emerge from the base.

The best stage for planting tube stock is when the plant is growing strongly and when the roots are emerging from the base and when the soil temperature is above 15 degrees in autumn or spring.

Native tube stock planted in a well prepared hole will grow vigorously and will often 'catch up' to a plant that is larger and considered to be more advanced.

Tube stock plants are less likely to suffer from transplant shock if the root system is more developed than the foliage.

Optimum root development at an early stage, rather than attractive foliage development, is the key to success.

When planted correctly, the plant will send roots deep into the subsoil to access deep moisture, rather than rely on surface moisture. This helps the plant to endure times of drought.

Many local native plants will develop roots that are 4 times as long as the stem before they will develop more foliage

Jousting Knights a Real Hit at the Berry Celtic Festival


It was standing room only when the medieval knights resplendent in shining armour mounted on their trusty steeds took centrestage at the recently held 11th annual Berry Celtic Festival.

THE GREEN **PLAQUES PROJECT**

The Berry & District Historical Society is very glad to report that the bronze circular plaques are now in place on the selected historical buildings in Berry. The Project has proved to be very successful and we have already noticed visitors pausing to read the plaques and to take pictures of them.

The plaques have been installed on:

- The Museum, Post & Telegraph Office, Berry Hotel & Wilson's Store in Queen Street
- The Uniting Church's former Wesleyan Chapel in Albert Street
- The Anglican Church in Princess Street
- The CWA Building, Agricultural Pavilion and the Old Presbyterian Manse in Victoria Street
- The Old Council Chambers in Alexandra Street
- The Railway Station

The site for the last plaque, which will be on the School of Arts is being prepared by Council.

The project will be officially launched by the Shoalhaven Mayor, Amanda Findley, on June 29 at the Museum and the Society would like to thank once more Shoalhaven Council for its Tourism Grant and also our own local Berry Community Activities Centre for its generous donation towards the plaques.



The well-known RAHS Historian Bruce Baskerville has been following the project and has asked for feedback for his future plaques article and a few days ago we were visited by a representative of the National Museum of Australia who is working on a scoping study for the National Museum, examining local plaques and historic marker projects in communities.

Whilst preparing the Museum for the installation of its plaque, the strip of white lead paint was removed from the front of the building, revealing the original lettering - E.S. & A. C. Bank.




Our first get together was on the 24th May at 10am In Wesley Hall at Berry Uniting Church.



Got questions?

A study conducted in the UK in 2013 found that children ask their mothers an average of 288 questions a day. The amount of questions decreases as the children age, but the complexity rises. The toughest questions were found to be; "Why is water wet?", "Where does the sky end?" and "What are shadows made of?" Asking questions is a normal part of being human. In fact, it is believed that it is a uniquely human thing to do. Apes have been taught sign language and are able to use this ability to converse with humans. However, they have never asked a single question.

We all have questions. Some of them have quantifiable answers, such as; What is one plus one? or; How many hours are there in a day? Some questions however do not have nice, easy complete answers, like; Why does something happen to my mood when I hear a certain piece of music? or; Why do I feel alone? or; What is the purpose of my life? These are the kind of questions that hang around. They might be the kind of questions that we ignore, or just accept that we will never know the answer to.

Jesus often communicated in questions. He very rarely gave straight answers to questions, preferring to answer tough questions with other questions or sometimes stories. These stories were often provocative and raised further questions for those listening. Read through any of the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John) and you find Jesus asking many questions of his followers and those around him. He never disregarded questions or shied away because they were too difficult. He says in Matthew 7:7 'Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.' The bible is full of people asking questions of God. It's a normal part of relating to him. At Berry Community Church, we are going to create a space for anyone to come and ask their questions about purpose, meaning and God. From July 23rd, we will be running a 9-week course called 'Alpha', which is all about asking and discussing the big questions in life. Absolutely everyone is welcome to join us as we share a meal together, watch a video and discuss the questions we have. CELEBRATING 40 YEARS



The continuing story of Berry's dynamic garden club...

In March we told how the BERRY & DISTRICT GARDEN CLUB INC was established in 1977. In the 40 years since, it has played a significant role within the Berry community.

almost every garden in Berry.

In 1988, the Bicentennial year, the Club held its initial Flower Show, and Esther Deans, an expert on no-dig gardening, was the guest speaker.

In 1990 the Club held the first Berry Gardens Festival. It was a modest affair being run with very limited resources and with a membership of about 50. Eleven gardens were opened and the takings were over \$10,000. To date, the Club has contributed over \$600,000 to local, not-for-profit organisations, including \$90,000 to the Shoalhaven Linear Accelerator Appeal

During the second Gardens Festival in 1991 interest was gauged about the feasibility of establishing aged accommodation in Berry. In fact, the \$2,000 given by the Club in 1991 opened the community fundraising appeal and encouraged other donations. This eventually led to the construction of the Berry Masonic Village.

Also in 1991, the Garden Club was asked to take over the running of the Berry Camellia Show which it combined with its Flower Show

Projects In the late 1990s Dayne van assisted through this include: Apex Park, the School of Arts, Berry Court House, David Berry Hospital, Berry Railway Station, Berry Public School and Camp Quality, public footpaths and park benches for seating.

ON-GOING HELP AND ASSISTANCE

Regular garden groups work at the Berry Court House, the hospital, and as required at the School of Arts, the RSL memorial, and in Apex Park - especially prior to the Gardens Festival. The Club also donates prizes in some of the pavilion sections of the Berry Agricultural Show, including one in honour of foundation and life member Betty Miles.

The latest Garden Club project is the landscaping of a large new public park at the northern end of George Street. All funds raised by the very successful plant propagation and sales team go towards this initiative.

Bree and John Pegrum presented a landscape plan for Apex Park to the Berry community including the Berry Garden Club.

The Club contributed to the cost of erecting the rotunda, which now serves as the club logo. Funds were saved from the next three Garden Festivals for this purpose. The rotunda was opened in 1999 by the mayor amid much ceremony, including a pipe band.

In the years after that the Club funded the bridge, the flowering cherry trees, the shade cover over the children's play area and recognised Arbour Day for several years by planting a tree in the park.

On Australia Day 2000, the Garden Club provided documents for the time capsule installed by members of the Berry Apex Club in Apex Park.

During the Alexander Berry Festival in 1979, the Club donated a Taxodium for the visiting dignitary to plant in Apex Park. It donated a Magnolia Grandiflora again in 2001 for the Minister of Agriculture to plant in the Berry Showground during the celebrations of the Centenary of Federation and a Magnolia Soulangiana was planted in the grounds of the Berry Bowling Club to celebrate its centenary in 2012.

Fire Permit Update

The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period in the Shoalhaven Local Government Area ended on 31 March 2017. From 1 April 2017, fire permits will no longer be required for the Shoalhaven Local Government Area.

"Although fire permits are no longer required, property owners must still exercise caution and follow guidelines regarding the use of fire," said Superintendent Mark Williams.

"Residents must notify neighbouring land owners and their local fire authority at least 24 hours before burning, as well as taking appropriate action to ensure containment and control of their fire so it doesn't escape and cause damage.

"Penalties still apply for failing to notify that your intentions of lighting a fire and for allowing fires to escape.

"We encourage people to seek advice from their local NSW RFS Fire Control Centre on how to safely conduct hazard reduction activities such as slashing and burning, as well as how to prepare their homes for the next bush fire season," said Superintendent Williams





Antechinus:

The Brown Antechinus (Ante-chinus. stuartii) is a small mar-supial that is common to the Berry area and may be mistaken for the introduced House Mouse. The females are smaller than the males. Head and body length - m. 106mm - f. 94mm. They are uniform greyish brown above and greyish underneath. The head comes to a point at the nose. The tail is moderately hairy and thin, about the same length as the head and body.

Their behaviour during the mating season is interesting. Both sexes nest communally until May and then become more solitary up to the mating season in Spring. The males become increasingly aggressive through winter. Both sexes mate promiscuously and each litter of 6 to 10 can have multiple fathers. Each baby occupies one of up to ten teats and are dragged around awkwardly. The survival rate is high and after 5 weeks they are left in a nest of dry plant material in a hollow log or tree trunk. At the end of the mating season none of the males remain alive. This is due to the stress of the breeding season. Shortly after weening, at about 90 days, the association of mother and offspring ends. The males move off to



other territory and the females remain. This annual turnover of the gene pool prevents inbreeding.

Their short life span provides an opportunity for scientists to research their dispersal. DNA testing of blood samples, collected over a period of years, can indicate the rate of Antechinus movement around local bushland. This offers information about the connectivity of the landscape, predation by feral animals, and changes over time. Antechinus are an important species in the on-going monitoring of the Berry Wildlife Corridor

Gembrook Tree Planting:

A National Tree Day activity will be held at 'Gembrook' on the 30th of July. Gembrook is owned by RMS and will be sold after completion of the Berry Bypass. To enhance the Berry Wildlife Corridor, Berry Landcare will be planting trees in a 20m wide fenced corridor along the Eastern property boundary. Smoke alarms save lives

The NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) is reminding Shoalhaven residents to check their smoke alarms following several house fires in the local area.

NSW RFS Inspector Chris Palmer said local brigades are concerned that some people still do not understand the importance of having working smoke alarms in their homes. "Recent house fires indicate the need for regular testing of smoke alarms and maintenance of chimneys. The severity of damage could be reduced if regular maintenance is undertaken" Insp Chris Palmer said.

"Smoke alarms and a home escape plan can give you the early warning and crucial moments needed to safely escape a fire

"Only working smoke alarms can alert you and your family, so it is vital that you test your smoke alarms once a month and change the batteries annually."

The NSW RFS and Fire and Rescue NSW (FRNSW) recommend all residents change their smoke alarm batteries at the same time they wind their clocks back at the end of Daylight Savings.

Anyone who hasn't changed their smoke alarm batteries in the past year should do so as soon as possible.

"All Shoalhaven residents should take just a few minutes this weekend to test their smoke alarm and check the batteries, to increase their family's chance of surviving a house fire," Insp Chris Palmer said.

"The cooler months are the deadliest time of year for house fires in Shoalhaven, as people spend more time indoors using heating, lighting and electrical appliances.

"Whilst these alarms are both are in line with Australian Standard AS 3786, research demonstrates that photoelectric alarms appear to provide a faster warning for detecting smoke, and may increase the opportunity for early warning," said Inspector Chris Palmer.

"A house fire can strike at any time and a working smoke alarm could mean the difference between life and death for your family."


