

DA for Bangalee Motel



DA17/1359

Description: Proposed construction of an additional 16 motel rooms to be contained within two x 2 storey buildings with associated parking at the Bangalee Motel

Submitted: 05/04/2017

This Development Application has been in Council for over 6 months now.

The current position is that the applicants were due to submit to Council a couple of final items to complete their DA.

These were:

1.A photo montage or mock-up of the completed DA

2. Heritage Assessment

The Berry Alliance has been following this DA with interest and has been in direct touch with the Council over a number of procedural issues and we have now been assured that once these items have been received then Council will be in a position to consider the DA

We have also now been assured by the Director of Planning, Phil Costello, that there will be a "Community Information session" held and following that presentation that further submissions will be allowed for approximately two more weeks.

Our concern has always been one of procedural fairness. It is ludicrous to close off community submissions prior to all the information being provided by the applicant. We have always held that a well-informed community makes better decisions (submissions in this case). When Council would not even consider the application until they received further reports from the

applicant why then would the community be able to make the best-informed decision. We are pleased to say that the new Director is now very aware of our community's wish to be well informed and properly consulted on such important issues as this DA, right on the northern gateway to Berry and in a heritage area and during time of fundamental change in the business community following the Highway realignment.

The Berry Forum passed a unanimous vote requesting a community information session some months ago and until recently Council were still prevaricating. The Policy of Council outlined in the Community Consultative Body document has now been drawn to their attention and there appears to be no question that an information session will be provided.

We also raised the issue of who gets notified when a new report or submission by the applicant is given to Council. It is put up on DA Tracking but they seem to think that they (Council) need only to inform anyone who had previously made a submission. In our view this is short sighted and inadequate. Immediate neighbours, close neighbours, those in the community who would like to make a submission but were waiting for all the documentation to be submitted before they make their considered submission are overlooked. There must be a better way to do this by Council if they want genuine and helpful community consultation.

We have written to Council about these issues and offered them free space in the Berry Town Crier to publicise an information meeting.

"Rockfield Park"

Development Application Decision 18-10-2017

This was breaking news on 18th October. No doubt Berry residents will have heard a lot about it by the time the Town Crier November issue is received. But it has been a contentious issue and has to be in the Berry Town Crier.

The Land and Environment Court has upheld the Joint Regional Planning Panel and Council's decision and refused the Development Application for 801 Kangaroo Valley Road, Bellawongarah known as "Rockfield Park" on 18th October 2017.

The Court essentially said the development did not meet the requirements of clause 5.13 of the Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan

2014 and that it could not be considered to be an eco-tourist facility.

The Court stated that amongst other issues the development was contrary to the public interest specifically in respect to concerns regarding traffic and road safety and that these risks were unacceptable and the development application should be refused. Council had recommended a refusal of the Application to the Joint Regional Planning Panel. The Joint Panel had agreed with Council and refused the application. The Applicants then appealed to the Land and Environment Court who have upheld the original refusal and given detailed reasons.

Forum Meeting on 12 October - 89 people attended the meeting, including CIrs Patricia White and Joanna Gash.

Berry Bypass Update (Ryan Whiddon RMS)

- Ryan explained the upcoming traffic impacts associated with laying of the asphalt surface.
- Residents expressed serious concerns about dangers associated with turning right at Croziers Road and asked that RMS review the situation.

Planning Proposal to Rezone Land south of Hitchcocks Lane - There was agreement that the Forum should oppose the Proposal on the following grounds.

- The only land that should be considered for rezoning at the appropriate time is the Long Term Investigation area (identified in the Shoalhaven Growth Management Strategy).
- Any 'shortage' of land for development should be viewed in the context of the Moss Vale Rd major land release, not just the Berry township.
- There are potentially serious safety issues with an overall development containing more than 400 homes (incl. Huntingdale Park Estate) with only one entry/exit road.
- Rezoning of rural land should not be

considered until the Huntingdale development is completed and its full impact on Berry's infrastructure is understood.

DA for Bangalee Motel Expansion - Council has been asked to hold a community meeting once it has received the Heritage Assessment and other reports it has requested.

In response to concerns expressed by the Forum that the northern entrance to the town must be in keeping with the heritage nature of Berry and welcoming to visitors, Council responded – "Like the Forum, we also value the significance of gateway sites and this will be a critical element in our assessment."

Additional Public Toilets in Berry

- Council will make the final selection from the list of the four site options.
- Residents expressed their views on the potential sites and a lively, cordial discussion ensued before a vote was taken to place the four options in order of preference.

- The voting results clearly show an upgrade to the Apex Park facility is the number one preference.
- We will be sharing the results with Council to emphasise the clear preference of the Berry Forum.

Edward Street Timber Bridge - It was agreed that the bridge should be replaced with a concrete culvert, rather than being permanently closed to through traffic.

Council Rates - Council is proposing that the 13% one-off special rate variation for this year be approved as a permanent increase, and that an increase of 5% be applied in each of the next three years.

AGM - The Committee membership for 2017/18 was endorsed and all office bearers have been re-elected to their positions - David Carter (Chairman), James Robinson (Vice Chairman), Stuart Coughlan (Secretary), Laurie Watson (Treasurer), Mary Beare, David Brawn, Garry Broadbridge, Margot Claringbold, John Cullity, Marilyn Kellett, Gail Paton, John Underwood.

Next Forum Meeting is 14 December at School of Arts - Xmas Drinks beforehand at 7pm.

Paths to Nowhere?

The newly built roundabout at North Street, Queen Street (old Princes Highway) and Woodhill Mountain Road has raised a problem.

During the planning stages the Berry Alliance were talking to the RMS and Fulton Hogan about the final plans including pathways for this piece of road infrastructure.

Sadly our many requests and submissions have not only fallen on deaf ears there has been what appears to be an error in the positioning of light poles and pedestrian access.

We have been working on continuing our work of completing footpaths and cycleways in Berry and wanted to take the opportunity for a circuit to be completed in this area.

There is currently a path from Camp Quality Park down next to the creek and through the park and finishes at the Skatepark. A lovely path but is not part of a circuit.

The RMS trumpeted that they would provide a footpath next to North Street and the newly aligned highway starting from the Kangaroo Valley Roundabout north to turn in to the Skatepark and connect up to the Camp Quality footpath. – Great.

We asked the RMS to extend this footpath to the new roundabout and then to the carpark at Camp Quality Park. Makes sense, given the RMS has to use the Australian standard on the roundabout which includes pram ramps and safety crossings.

The roundabout is now built and there are safe and beautiful safety crossings and pram ramps then a short piece of footpath but they all end nowhere!

One new footpath points up Woodhill Mountain Road and from it you can see the NOVEMBER 2017

start of the footpath in Camp Quality. So very close yet no connection.

One new footpath points up North Street and from it you can see the new footpath coming the other way down North Street but alas, it turns into the Skatepark area and comes no further. So very close, but no connection.

The worst part is that this latter crossing and pathway pointing up North Street wistfully is now blocked for a future connecting footpath because somebody has built a light tower right in the middle of where the footpath would need to go!

Some would say they did this on purpose but I am assured that it is much more likely to be another answer.

We still hold out hope of a sensible outcome. We have contacted our local State Member for Kiama, Gareth Ward with this problem requesting that the RMS finds the money and builds both connecting footpaths or he tries to find some funds to complete the job from another source. The Berry Alliance has offered to assist if it is needed and we have every confidence in Gareth and his persuasiveness.

We have a reply from Gareth and he is awaiting a response to his written enquiry. We appreciate your efforts Gareth and hope you can assist us as you have with our projects in the past.

So, go and have a walk and have a look at the new roundabout and what we are talking about. You would laugh if it wasn't so silly.

Lots of improvements to the Historic Berry Courthouse

Recently we have been busy making a host of improvements to this wonderful historic building including:

Pruning back the private hedged garden – it now looks clean and fresh and waiting for rain! We used local tree specialists Dave and Camilla Kelly and their team at DC Tree Care who have done a great job once again. Thanks guys.

Rejuvenating the Rose Garden around the fountain – we have totally revitalised this garden – thinning the roses to make them all in one line and allowing space for them to grow to their full potential. They have been a little cramped recently. Now we just need some rain! We used Ryan and Katie from Mountain Echo Landscape and Horticulture and they were great as well! They sourced a fantastic metal divide / guard to separate the gravel from the garden and it looks so good we are going to use it (and them) elsewhere in the garden soon.

Building a new back corner fence and double gates – this has been widened to make it easier to allow small vehicles such as coffee trucks, mobile pizza ovens or trailers of mulch or gravel into the private garden. Again, we used a great local, Jim Kellett – handyman, and his team. The new fence is strong and looks good and does exactly what we needed it to.

We have purchased 75 white "Gladiator" chairs (sometimes known as shield chairs or wedding chairs) for the Courthouse. These really raise the standard and are available to hire in the garden. They are weight rated to 120kgs and look great.

The volunteers that help with everything deserve a big thanks. From the various Committee members who are always helping and running projects to the volunteers in the garden. A lot of the gardening work is performed by a Tuesday group of volunteers from the Berry Garden Club who have really carried on well from Trish's team after all her hard work. There are a few plans in the pipeline and the gardens will all be upgraded over a period of time. Many thanks to Kim, Marty, Geoff, Jill and all the others who have advised and assisted.

The Committee is so happy with the results to date and the bookings are strong for weddings at the Berry Courthouse.


OPEN DAY 1 NOVEMBER 2017

WATER RESTRICTIONS AND WATER SAVING TIPS

February and March this year saw weeks of consistent rain, with our wettest day this year of 124 mm rainfall recorded on 3 March. Those prolonged weeks of rain have been followed by a very dry year, aside from some reasonable falls in June. The dry spell has meant stressful conditions for livestock, and affecting our gardens and the bush, with evidence of dead and dying trees, including large native specimens.

In September, Shoalhaven Council announced the possibility of introducing water restrictions. The last time we experienced water restrictions was in early 2010, so we have not had to be conscious of our water usage for the last seven years.

There are plenty of simple of tips for saving water, from washing fruit and vegetables in a large bowl rather than under the running tap, diverting grey water to your garden (to areas on non-edible plants), turning the tap off when shaving or brushing teeth, and only



using dishwashers and washing machines with a full load.

Make sure you don't have any dripping taps; it seems an insignificant thing but a dripping tap can add up to 2,000 litres of water wasted in a month. If you haven't already done so, consider changing your shower rose to a low flow model, and installing a duel flush cistern to your toilet. To further ensure your property's water efficiency, check for and repair any leaks in pipes. An easy way to confirm whether you have any leaks is to turn off all appliances and taps, and have a look at the reading on the water meter. After an interval check again, if the reading changes it is evident there is an undetected leak somewhere.

Doing your watering in the garden early or late in the day will minimize evaporation. A deep watering will encourage plants to

develop deep roots. Mulching garden beds helps keep the soil moist, as well as adding nutrients to the soil. Healthy plants will deal better with stressful conditions. Pruning plants back will also lessen their need for water. For new or replacement garden plants, choosing local native varieties with low water requirements will also mean less maintenance, and encourage bird life.

Car washing can be done on the lawn, to maximize the water runoff. By using a broom or rake in preference to hosing down paths and driveways, you can further minimize water usage in the garden.

LANDFILL REDUCTION RECYCLING PROGRAMS - TerraCycle offer a range of free recycling

programs, which are funded by manufac-turers and retailers and are designed to keep from landfill items that may not be accepted by councils for recycling. These include Espressi, Nescafe and L'Or coffee capsules; toothbrushes & toothpaste tubes; personal care and skincare products; used contact lenses and blister packs; Whole Kids' food pouch and snack packaging; and plastic mailing satchels. As part of the TerraCycle program, L'Occitane en Provence will accept back their empty products and offers a 10% discount on any purchase. Many of these programs offer drop off locations. Not being in close proximity to drop off points isn't a problem; by registering for any of the programs TerraCycle offers a free postage service. Simply print off a label, box up your returns and post them. Visit the web page for more information: terracycle.com.au

APPLIANCE REPAIRS – When small household appliances break it is tempting to throw them out and buy a new one. Most can't be recycled easily because they are a composite of plastics, metals and other components. That means they end up in landfill. Instead, I made the choice to have two kitchen appliances repaired; a food processor and an espresso coffee machine (not the capsule type). Ewing Electrical in Nowra fixed both appliances for a fair cost. Not only do I feel good about keeping stuff out of landfill, I saved money, and the money I did spend stayed in the local community and provided local employment. I highly recommend getting an opinion whether an item can be repaired before rushing out to buy a new one.




BERRY CWA 2017 NEWS



The John Hay Memorial Fountain

The deterioration of the Sir John Hay Memorial Fountain in the Showground is a cause of great concern. The tall, white marble and sandstone fountain in the north-east corner of the Showground, near the Children's Play Area was erected in 1915 as a memorial to Sir John Hay who had died in 1909. After inheriting the Estate from David Berry, Sir John Hay made many improvements and additions to the town, at his own expense.

On October 14, 1914, The Shoalhaven Telegraph reported:

'Lady Hay is giving Berry Council 200 pounds to meet the cost of turning portion of the Park (the Showground) into a children's corner. A memorial fountain, costing 150 pounds will perpetuate the memory of Sir John Hay, while serving a useful purpose. The other 50 pounds will be expended in fencing and providing attractive features for children.'

and other damage caused by vehicles. The memorial has been temporarily fenced off to prevent further damage.

The Berry & District Historical Society and the Showground Management Committee are working with the Shoalhaven Council and the National Trust towards the restoration and conservation of the memorial. Funds are being sought from the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage to fund the work which will include an appropriate protective barrier around the fountain.

The Eucalyptus:

The Eucalyptus is the defining tree in the Australian landscape. The plant was collected in Tasmania on Cook's third voyage by David Nelson in 1778. It was incorrectly classified as being in the same genus as the NZ Christmas Bush. In 1780 it was identified as a separate Genus and named by the French Botanist Charles Louis L'Heritier de Brutelle. A friend of Joseph Banks, he was classifying plants in Banks's Kew collection. The name comes from the Greek, meaning "well capped" referring to the form of the fruit. The species he named was Brown Stringy-bark (*E. obliqua*). There are more than 800 eucalyptus species not counting the closely related *Corymbia* and *Angophora*.

The Australian continent has moved across the planet for the last 40 million years. At the same time the general trend of the Earth's climate has cooled. These two trends have balanced each other. There has been no mountain building or large scale glaciations resulting in Australia's amazing stable geological history. This has allowed plant and animals to persist, evolve and diversify in relatively small areas. The flora and fauna are found in small pockets with the boundaries defined within metres. Human intrusion into this million year old stability has had catastrophic results. The clearing of small areas or the introduction of feral animals can wipe out entire species. This applies to Eucalyptus and to the fauna reliant on them.

The identification of gum trees is extremely difficult. To be sure one needs to examine the bark, the leaves, the flowers, the fruit and general form and habit of the tree. Bark can be smooth and of varying colours, to different heights up the trunk, rough, stringy or fissured. Many of these characteristics can vary with the time of year. Leaves come in a variety of shapes from oval to lance like, curved or straight. Venation can be defining. The angle of the venation to the central vain can be unique to the species but is generally 55^ to 70^. There can be an intra–marginal vane. The leaves are usually alternating along the stem but this may not be correct for juvenile plants. The fruit or gum nuts are the most defining feature. Much of this material that is required for identification is inconveniently located at the top of the tallest species of flowering plants in the world. You may find samples on the ground around but you can't be sure it has not been blown in.

Berry has its indigenous eucalyptus species. The most common are *E. saligna-E. botryoides* hybrid and Blackbutt (*E. Pilularis*). These trees have been extensively planted along the new highway.

Spring flowering in gardens and in the bush

During the last few weeks, many of you will have seen the delicate bee attracting clusters of lilac and white flowers of the white **cedar tree** (*Melia azedarach*) and may have been lucky enough to smell the delicate fragrance, too.

Although commonly found on the margins of rainforest, the white cedar has ornamental appeal as a specimen tree in a garden. It is fast growing and hardy, with a graceful habit. The soft lime green compound leaves are made up of many leaflets, creating a lacy appearance. The spreading crown provides dappled shade during the heat of summer, protecting slower growing species and ground covers beneath.

Clusters of yellow fleshy drupes containing a single seed develop during autumn and remain on the tree for many months.

The white cedar is one of a handful of native trees that is fully deciduous

During some (not all) autumn seasons, trees can become severely defoliated by the larvae of Leptocneria reducta moth, but as this occurs just before the tree goes into dormancy for the winter, it does not impact severely on the general beauty of the tree, nor does it affect the tree adversely. It may, however, be alarming for those who have not experienced this phenomena.



Banding is a chemical free method to control the number of developing larvae

- Be prepared in early autumn to wrap and tie hessian cloth around the trunk below the first fork so that the top half of the hessian is folded over the lower half forming a sheltered area between the fold.
- The band of hessian acts as an attractive shelter for the caterpillars.
- Check under the hessian for larvae each morning and remove them with gloves and drown them in a bucket of water
- Repeat this process for a week

Another bee-attracting plant with a citrus fragrance is the **tree violet** (*Hymenanthera dentata*).

During spring, this hardy shrub, (it is definitely not a tree) is covered with tiny pale yellow bell shaped flowers hanging below the leaves. It is common in the bush, but can be used in a garden situation, too, maybe close to a bird bath. It is prickly and favoured by little birds as refuge from larger ones. Small birds can fly in and out without damaging their wings or feathers. It can also be pruned and shaped to retain a bushy habit.

The white cedar and the tree violet are hardy plants, suited to the environmental conditions of the Berry area. Both plants are grown at the school nursery.

If members of the community wish to lay a wreath as a mark of respect feel free to do so.







Gillian Triggs comes to Berry

One of the more controversial figures in Australian society in the last decade has accepted an invitation to speak in Berry.

Emeritus Professor Gillian Triggs was the President of the Australian Human Rights Commission from 2012-2017. Gillian was Dean of the Faculty of Law and Challis Professor of International Law at the University of Sydney from 2007-12 and Director of the British Institute of International and Comparative Law from 2005-7. Gillian is a former Barrister with Seven Wentworth Chambers and a Governor of the College of Law

Professor Triggs' five year term as President of the Human Rights Commission was a controversial one. Tensions between her and the Australian Government increased from late 2014. Numerous government ministers called for her resignation during her term. She was accused of being politically motivated, of misleading a Senate inquiry, of wasting a court's time and of wasting government money.

For her part, Professor Triggs has accused the government of abusing executive power and manipulating the truth. Professor Triggs has attacked Coalition government ministers for interfering with the judicial system and for destroying the integrity of Parliament by peddling "alternative facts".

Professor Triggs will speak to a public forum on the topic "Why are we losing our legal rights?" The forum will take place at 2pm on Sunday 26th November in the Main Hall at Berry Uniting Church. Tickets are \$25 each and are obtainable from Berry Music Centre.

The Bush Fire Danger Period commenced in Shoalhaven Local Government Area on Friday 1st September 2017 and anyone wishing to light a fire during the BFDP must now obtain a permit prior to burning. To apply for a permit, contact the NSW RFS Shoalhaven Fire Control Centre on 4424 4424.

It is a legislative requirement that property owners provide a minimum of 24 hours' notice to their local fire authority and all adjoining land owners. Penalties apply for failing to comply.



The advertising and the cabanas have come down, the crowds have departed and the Garden Club is celebrating yet another very successful Berry Gardens Festival. Visitors may have their personal favourites but everyone seems agreed that the eight gardens, five of them opened for the first time, offered a pleasing diversity of size, style and plantings. Coaches came from as far away as Werris Creek, Moruya, and Canberra, but some who arrived by car had travelled even further. Once one Festival is over and the proceeds donated to local not-forprofit organisations, it is time to start planning the next. Any suggestions of gardens that could be included in our 2018 Festival are most welcome.

The Club's plant team is also rejoicing. Sales raised over \$9,700, all of which will help fund the construction of the George St park. Our nursery shelves are empty and it is time to start gathering and propagating to fill them again. We are always most grateful for the gift of unwanted plants. There was a strong demand for the Hippeastrums, Iris and Clivea, all donated, that visitors had seen flourishing in the gardens despite the drought. With

quality plants.

plant breeders developing new hybrids of these "old favourites", they are regaining popularity. Dozens of Agapanthus, particularly the newer dwarf varieties, were also sold.

The months of dry weather provided a constant challenge to the garden owners, particularly those without town water. Lack of rain has also been a hardship for all Berry gardeners. This has been a time to take note of the more drought hardy plants and to consider them when

planting. Trees, shrubs and hedges have demanded extra watering and mulching. If these plants die, basic garden structure is lost

The Festival may be over but we are still very busy. An enjoyable October trip to Mittagong will be followed with another visit to Highlands gardens in November. There is a return visit from the Werri Beach/ Gerringong Garden Club to host as well as a visiting group from the Garden Clubs of Australia Ulladulla Convention. It really is a season to be out in the garden!



Nepalese School Land Purchase Going Ahead



Back in August, the Rotary Club of Berry called on the community of Berry to assist in raising \$8000. This was to enable the Shree Manjushree Secondary School in the village of Jyamrung, a poor farming area in Nepal, to purchase an adjoining piece of land in order to provide an immediate need for outdoor learning activities plus allow for the future redevelopment of the school.

As there is no alternative, the classroom buildings of the School are still being used in quite hazardous conditions despite having been condemned following the devastating earthquakes of 2015.

A number of very generous Berry residents subsequently made donations totaling over \$3700 to help. Also, Saxon Hilkemeijer has added to that figure after initiating a 'High 5 for 5' program he announced in a Berry Public School public speaking competition where he encouraged students to bring in five cents each week to raise money for underprivileged children overseas,.

"Children make up 25 per cent of the world's population, however we are 100 per cent of the future. That being the case I believe children should be empowered to make positive change in the world. Five cent pieces are pretty underrated by a lot of people... they think their pretty useless, they clog wallets or get thrown into jars but small things can make a big impact. My idea was that if every school student in Australia gave five cents a week for the school year we could raise over \$7 million," he said.



During a trial of this concept at the Berry and Shoalhaven Heads Public Schools, the program raised \$1000 which Saxon presented to the Rotary Club to go toward the purchase of the Shree Manjushree Secondary School land. Saxon is pictured presenting the cheque to Rotarian Ken Hutt and Club President Trevor Barker.

The Rotary Club has advanced the balance of the funds required to proceed with the
