## BANDICOOTS, QUOLLS AND POTOROOS

NSW Government program eradicate foxes has seen a slow increase in numbers of native species. Fox baiting programs are coordinated in association with local landholders, Landcare and other organisations. Trapping and shooting are used in association with baiting. Baiting programs have been shown to generally have minimal risk to native animals, however there has been the accidental poisoning of domestic and working dogs. If you suspect your dog has been poisoned by eating 1080 (the commonly used bait) it is important to get the animal to a vet as soon as possible because the prognosis is poor if fast action is not taken.

Over the past three or four years, we have had a small number of bandicoots taking up residence in our garden. Bandicoots are nocturnal marsupials that build a shallow burrow to protect themselves from predators. They emerge at dusk to hunt for grubs and beetles, along with roots, tubers and some fungi. If you discover small holes dug in your garden, you too may have bandicoots nearby. Vulnerable areas in gardens can be fenced off with wire mesh to prevent them from being disturbed, however bandicoots generally move to new food sources as one area becomes depleted, so they may not be a long term problem. Bandicoots are protected in NSW, so it is illegal to trap them without a license.

encouraging is evidence of Equally spotted-tailed quolls being observed in the

Shoalhaven area. Monitoring undertaken by the Office of Environment & Heritage and the University of Wollongong of the sparse local population has shown around twenty quolls living in Barren Grounds Nature Reserve and Budderoo National Park. Camera data have shown that one male roams a territory of around twenty square kilometres. The news is not so positive for the long-nosed potoroo, whose numbers continue to decline.

We live in a fragmented landscape of urban, agricultural and remnant bush land. By continuing to rehabilitate native vegetation, local Landcare groups ensure that this habitat is maintained and perhaps improved. If you would like to get involved, you can volunteer with Berry Landcare (4464 3241). www.shoalhavenlandcare.org.au lists other groups within the Shoalhaven region, as well as articles of interest, a notice board, and a link to loan various pieces of equipment for members.

#### SHOREBIRD UPDATE

I was fortunate over the summer break to accompany a volunteer to visit the Shoalhaven Heads shore-birds' nesting sites. Amongst other things, we observed a pair of Pied Oystercatchers that has so far successfully raised a pair of chicks, however it was concerning to see paw prints in the sand of either a dog or a fox. Shore birds remain vulnerable to feral pests including cats, and to predatory birds. While it is a beautiful, serene part of our local area, it was a little sad to see how few birds are nesting in this relatively inaccessible area. BirdLife Australia is always looking for people to get involved, either as a volunteer, attending events and activities, contributing to the online database, or simply by making a donation. #### Free Berry Alliance / Town Crier Cooler Bags at the Berry Christmas Parade

The Berry Alliance and Berry Town Crier continued our policy to encourage sustainability; to re-use and recycle.

We were at the Christmas Parade on 2nd December (outside the Berry IGA – thanks Lee! and the Organisers) with our latest sustainability item give-away – a Cooler Bag. This followed on from our re-usable cloth bags 4 years ago and our Keep Cups (4 years ago) and our donation of 750 cloth bags to the Boomerang Bags group for distribution as well as substantial funding and sponsorship. These re-usable cooler bags are important for your shopping. Health guidelines recommend using one along with ice packs or cooler bricks, to transport perishable goods to ensure they stay at or below a critical temperature to avoid bugs growing.

We sourced them from within Australia, they are black and have our logo and print on them.

The bags were given to local Berry residents at the Christmas Parade and proved very popular. Though we did get a number of wags asking if there was a bottle of wine in it as well. Talk about Christmas Spirit!

Thank you to all those local people who said such kind words to our team about how much they appreciated our efforts and supported us and in particular the Berry Town Crier. We have decided that we will give some more away after the holiday season when it is easier to determine locals, so we will be at the Berry Buy Local prize draw in Broughton Court on Wednesday 31 January 2018 at 5.30pm – we will be there from 5pm and for some time following the draw. Please look for us. All you need to do is come and see us at our tables, show your identification (with name and local address) and you will be given a bag (until stock runs out). We are also asking community members to register their email address with us for urgent or emergency notices from the Berry Alliance.

## Forum Meeting Held on 14 December

127 people attended the meeting, including State Member Gareth Ward and Clrs John Wells, Patricia White, Annette Alldrick and Nina Cheyne

#### **Gareth Ward Update**

- Work has started on the new Ambulance Station at North St and KV Rd. Although not permanently manned, the 6 new officers will provide a 24-hour service.
- Tenders for the Berry to Bomaderry highway upgrade will be called for soon.
- Three tenders are being considered for the Albion Park Rail bypass project.

#### Resident concerns with Bypass road noise and visual impact

Windsor Drive residents are concerned about the visual impact, noise and lack of privacy due to the height of the new road. Also, lights from the new roundabout are shining into backyards. There was an overwhelming support for asking RMS to address the issues.

# Resident concerns with right turn off Highway into Croziers Road

Residents explained that the dangers of accessing Croziers Rd from the Highway have been made worse by an increase in FEBRUARY 2018

traffic volume from the Sandtrack since the Bypass opened. Interim safety measures are proposed, including a designated right hand turn lane similar to the one at Strongs Rd, and a prominent 80kph speed limit sign positioned close to Mullers Rd. There was an overwhelming support for requesting these safety measures.

#### Berry Estate Trails Project Communications

CIr Wells described the engagement processes to be followed for each trail as part of the communications protocol agreed with concerned landowners, Derek Jorgensen for the Project and Chamber of Commerce reps. The trail from town to Austral Park Rd is the first identified for public consultation. Others include Agars lane, Berry to Gerringong, and Wire Lane. The landowners will update the Forum on adherence to the communications protocol. The Committee is very grateful for CIr Wells' assistance.

# Update on Planning Proposal to Rezone Land South of Hitchcocks Lane

The Proposal will result in an additional 120-150 dwellings. Huntingdale will eventually total 280 dwellings, resulting in up to 430 new dwellings to the west of the existing town, which numbers 480 dwellings. The Forum Committee will pursue the inclusion of a vegetated buffer between the Highway and the development site, as shown in Council's approved DCP.

# Significant Changes Proposed for Huntingdale Park Development

A Section 96 amendment has been lodged by SET Consultants and Pindan, the developer. Significant changes are proposed for Stages 8 & 9 (based on a bush fire assessment), and residents are extremely concerned about the loss of a public reserve and a reduction in the size of the riparian area along the creek line. SET and Pindan representatives claimed that the main reason for loss of public space was Council not wanting to take responsibility for maintenance. Since the Forum meeting the S96 amendment has been withdrawn.

#### Update on Major Upgrade proposed for Apex Park Toilets

Council has recommended building a new amenity at the Apex Park site in 2018/19.



# **Happy Sounds Shoalhaven**



Happy Sounds Shoalhaven is a new singing group for people living with dementia and their carers. Dementia does not discriminate and neither do we – our group will be welcoming and inclusive, open to all. Through the shared joy of singing, we aim to promote wellness in ageing; reduce social isolation; and provide an opportunity for participants to make meaningful connections with other people in their community.

Dementia is the term used to describe the symptoms of a large group of illnesses which cause a progressive decline in a person's functioning. It is a broad term used to describe a loss of memory, intellect, rationality, social skills and physical functioning. There are many types of dementia including Alzheimer's disease, vascular dementia, frontotemporal dementia and dementia with Lewy

Bodies. Dementia happen to anybody, but is more common after age 65. (Dementia Australia, 2017). More than 413,106 Australians live with dementia, currently 244 people are joining the population with dementia each day and there is an estimated 25,938 people living with younger onset dementia. (The National Centre for Social and Economic Modelling NATSEM (2016)Economic Cost of Dementia in Australia 2016-2056).

# "Paul Bongiorno comes to Berry"

"What's happening to the Australian Press? Newspapers are sacking journalists...newspapers become thinner, investigative journalism is shrivelling. The shrill voices of bigoted pundits dominate the airwaves. Governments of both sides hate the ABC.

Where do we find the real story? Is the era of trusted journalism over? Find Out -- Paul Bongiorno is coming to Berry.

Respected veteran political broadcaster and commentator, and four time Walkley Award winning journalist, Paul Bongiorno, will visit Berry on Sunday, 4th March 2018, to speak at a public forum.

Paul Bongiorno was educated by the Christian Brothers at St Patrick's College in Ballarat and originally trained as a Catholic priest. He holds a Master's Degree in Theology from the Pontifical Urban University in Rome. He left the priesthood in 1974.

Paul's television career began in 1974 with Seven Network in Melbourne. He then moved to WIN TV Wollongong, before joining Network Ten in 1978. Before making the move to the nation's capital in 1987, Paul covered state

politics for Network Ten in Brisbane. It was there he established his reputation as an exceptional investigative journalist, winning four coveted Walkley Awards for investigative journalism as well reporting state politics and writing for The Bulletin magazine.

Paul Bongiorno was Network Ten's National Affairs Editor, a position he held after handing the reins of the Parliament House Bureau in Canberra to Hugh Riminton. From 1991 till 2010 he was Bureau Chief and Political Editor. Bongiorno hosted Ten's national Sunday morning show, Meet the Press, from 1996 until 2012.

In June 2014, he took voluntary redundancy from Network Ten and in August of that year he became a regular contributor to The Saturday Paper.

One of Australia's most trusted, experienced

and respected political journalists, Paul was a key part of Network Ten for more than 35 years and is also a veteran member of the Canberra Press Gallery. He is also a regular political commentator on the ABC's Radio National Breakfast program with Fran Kelly. In the January 2014, Australia Day Honours List, Bongiorno was made a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) "For significant service to the print and broadcast media as a journalist, political commentator and editor." # The History of Bushfires in the Berry Area:

2017 - The hottest year on record in NSW. If the summer rains don't come we must plan to combat bushfires that may. Berry has not had a major bushfire since 4th December 2002. A metal grinding spark started a fire in Agars Lane near Coomonderry Swamp. It jumped over Gerroa Road and burnt out Seven Mile Beach National Park along to the Beach Road car park. It is worth considering the history of major bushfires in our area, when they occurred, what damage they did and how extensive they were.

January 14th 1939 was reported as a "Black Saturday for Yalwal when bush fires burnt out everything except the Post Office and Anderson's and Fletcher's property. Yalwal was never rebuilt. These fires swept through the whole of the northern Shoalhaven. All of the mountains around Berry were ablaze. Kangaroo Valley was swept by flame. The calamity saw the formation of the Bush Fire Brigade. The Brigade at Nowra was formed in January 1940, closely followed by others." "March 1964: 5 dead, 530,000 acres burnt out - houses, farms, forests of the Snowy Mountains, Southern Tablelands, and Nowra." This fire burnt out large areas of Kangaroo Valley and areas around Berry.

"September 1968 to January 1969 was a major fire season with 2,000,000 Ha burnt out,150 houses and 80 other buildings lost and 14 deaths. This conflagration included the South Coast, Blue Mountains and Illawarra areas".

The September 14th 1968 fire at Berry is well remembered by local residents. It started in Bundewallah and due to a hot strong North Westerly wind spread along the escarpment to the North of Berry. Fire fighters using bulldozers attempted to build fire breaks where access to the escarpment was possible. It was stopped late on the first night at Woodhill Mountain Road but the next day it flared again and continued along the escarpment to Tomlins Road ridge. Dave Rumble and others recounted this event. Dave was one of those who fought the blaze. When these earlier fires occurred Berry was surrounded with open pastoral land. These blazes burnt the thickly vegetated upper areas of the escarpment. Today much of the open pasture has been replaced with forest and bush. Forest vegetation is now much more extensive and closer to the township. This presents a danger to our community. The technology and know-how involved in fire fighting has advanced enormously since those times but it is important that we support and take notice of the NSW Rural Fire Service and their advice on how to protect our properties. <rfs.nsw.gov.au/planand-prepare/know-your-risk>



# Two small local native feature trees - Whalebone tree and Scentless rosewood

Whalebone and Scentless rosewood can be planted as small feature trees, a hedge, or as potted plants in a courtyard garden. Both plants are hardy and tolerate a wide range of soils, sun or shade, but require good drainage.

The common name **Whalebone** refers to the strong flexible timber that was used in the 18th and 19th centuries as a substitute for baleen to make the stays for women's corsets. The timber was also used to make handles for axes and other tools.

The common name **Scentless rosewood** refers to the timber, which, unlike other rosewoods, does not have a strong fragrance. However, the flowers have a scent which is very attractive to butterflies.

Whalebone (Streblus brunonianus) is a large shrub or small tree which forms a broad shady canopy with a graceful weeping habit. It is suitable for either a formal or a more relaxed garden setting and can be pruned if necessary. An interesting feature is the variable size and shape of the leaves. Separate male and female flowers appear in spring, the male flower being more obvious to the naked eye.

Small round green fruits form a few months after flowering and turn yellow and squashy when ripe, attracting many local birds including Cat bird, Brown pigeon, Topknot pigeon, and Lewin's honey-eater.

**Scentless rosewood** (Synoum glandulosum) is an attractive ornamental large shrub or small tree. It grows moderately quickly, fruits early, and can be grown as a potted plant. In 2-3 years it will grow to about 1½ metres and produce flowers and fruits.

The fruit capsules are ornamental and very attractive to many species of birds. The capsules ripen to a pale orange colour and break open to reveal shiny dark chocolate coloured seeds embedded in a bright red aril.



Whalebone and the Scentless rosewood are common trees in remnant bush in the Berry area and would make a handsome addition to any garden.

The soft and fleshy nature of the seeds of both these plants is an indication that the seeds can't be stored, so once collected, they need to be sown without delay. They germinate readily and reliably and tubestock is available in the nursery.

The best time to visit the nursery is between 3.00pm and 4.00pm on Thursday afternoons during term time, after the children have finished their practical lesson.

A special thank you to the Seed Collectors and Plant Prop volunteers for your help during December and January. Summer is a very busy time in the nursery sowing seeds, pricking out and potting on seedlings and watering. The plants just don't seem to know summer is holiday time.

## **BERRY MUSEUM**

Last December the Berry & District Historical Society wrote about how Sir John Hay had ensured that the railway line from Kiama in 1893 went through the Berry estate. He also had the Berry Central Creamery built alongside the railway in 1895 and it became the largest in the colony, churning out 25 tons of butter a week.

Later the Station was lengthened to accommodate the especially long trains that ran for the Berry races, with the racecourse situated behind the Berry Central Creamery. All this made Berry an important rail centre.

Near the Railway Station's entrance is the former residence of the Berry Station Master. An old timber cottage, now surrounded by cyclone wire fencing, it is part of the State Heritage Listed Berry Railway Station group and dates back to 1892. Though in a state of neglect today, it is a very rare example of an early design railway residence, predating the standard designs of 1899. Owned by RailCorp and last used as a Scouts' Hall, the building has been empty since about 2009

Many in the community as well as the Historical Society are very mindful of the historical significance of the building and for over 6 years have been communicating with RailCorp regarding its future. During this time, despite being surrounded by fencing, the building has continued to suffer from neglect.

Some community suggestions for the building have been: a café, Tourist Information Centre, Shared Office Work Space, Bike Hire, or the replacement of the building by a memorial plaque and landscaped public space.

Last November the Station Precinct Development Manager for Sydney Trains, advised that 'we are working on all our railway residences to develop a program of reinstatement and re-use which will encompass all of the residences with the exception of two, (including Berry) which are deemed to be beyond repair.

In the mean time I will certainly remain open minded if there are any other feasible alternatives that can be considered'.

We feel it is an important part of Berry's heritage and it is important to find a way forward for this building – releasing it from its unsightly state by either restoring or replacing it.

# FIRE PERMIT UPDATE

The Bush Fire Danger Period commenced in Shoalhaven Local Government Area on Friday 1st September 2018 and anyone wishing to light a fire during the BFDP must now obtain a permit prior to burning. To apply for a permit, contact the NSW RFS Shoalhaven Fire Control Centre on 4424 4424.

It is a legislative requirement that property owners provide a minimum of 24 hours' notice to their local fire authority and all adjoining land owners. Penalties apply for failing to comply.



### COUNCIL DECISION PENDING ON BOMADERRY 50 METRE POOL

With some Shoalhaven community members expressing concerns about the alternative solutions to the 50-metre pool in the proposed new Shoalhaven Nowra Regional Sports and Community Precinct, in Bomaderry, Shoalhaven City Council is ensuring residents have an update on the progress of the Precinct.

Currently, Council has adopted the Shoalhaven Community and Recreation Precinct Masterplan. This plan was developed through extensive community consultation that commenced in September 2015 and was presented to Council in December 2016. This consultation included public meetings, discussion, public submissions and comments about the 50-metre pool. The report was presented to Council in December 2016 and adopted.

The proposal included adding a 25-metre x 8 lane indoor pool, a learn to swim pool, a children's/beach entry pool and hydrotherapy pool which are included in the community pavilion which forms part of the new development.

The Bomaderry Aquatic Centre 50-metre outdoor swimming pool is nearing the end of its serviceable life. Extensive works are required on the outdoor pool shell, heating units, hydraulic and filtration systems. The servicing costs also continue to increase, reaching the point where these costs are no longer sustainable and, increasingly maintaining a reliable service will become operationally difficult.

In 2014, the forecasted cost of continuing to operate both the Nowra Aquatic Centre 50-metre pool and the Bomaderry Aquatic Centre 25-metre and 50-metre pools all year round, presented a net operating loss of \$1,025,181. In the financial year 2016/17 the net loss for these two facilities increased to over \$1,1 million.

The proposed rectification works were costed at \$2.12 million (total costs excluding interest payments); however, these costs would have also significantly increased since this time.

The Bomaderry Aquatic Centre outdoor 50-metre pool plant room, kiosk and amenities are 39 years old and need a major upgrade. The upgrades would only allow for a like-for-like refit and not improve the overall appearance or functionality of the facility, nor increase the longevity of the mechanical services.

The indoor pool was opened in 1986 and has had some recent improvements such as painting, tiling, and replacement of cubicle partitions, however the building and pool have aged.

Under the current masterplan proposal adopted by Council, which considered current demand and future demographic changes, there is increased demand on indoor pool space for all year round use to meet both casual use and program needs for learn to swim classes, gentle exercise programs and lane walking. These would be met by: increased lane space; a dedicated learn to swim pool, a dedicated hydrotherapy and rehabilitation pool with inclusive access, and a children's/beach entry pool.

Benchmarking and planning have identified that maintaining two 50-metre heated outdoor pools within 3km of each other is financially unsustainable. Throughout NSW local government areas benchmarking has shown that there are few Councils that have invested so heavily in aquatic and leisure facilities at the same level as the Shoalhaven.

Based on established planning and provision principles of one (1) local aquatic facility per 10,000 – 40,000 people and one (1) district aquatic facility per 40,000 – 70,000 people, the provision of one (1) 50 metre swimming pool is meeting the benchmarks and is capable of servicing and meeting the needs of the northern Shoalhaven community now and well into the future. The population of the Shoalhaven is just over 100,300 people and has 12 swimming pool

facilities including two sea pools -  $7 \times 25m$  pools, 2 leisure pools and water play parks, 7 toddlers pools, 1 hydrotherapy pool and  $5 \times 50m$  pools (including 2 sea pools).

The cost difference to the Shoalhaven ratepayer in building a 25-metre indoor pool and a 50-metre indoor pool is approximately \$7million with \$240,000 in additional annual operating costs each year. Business planning forecasts to keep both 50-metre pools and to ensure an affordable usage fee without loss, is unsustainable.

Director of Finance, Corporate and Community Services Craig Milburn said, "We are planning for the Shoalhaven's future and to operate two 50-metre pools within 3km does not make a good business case in protecting the ratepayer dollar and in keeping both pools sustainable. We are not trying to close the pool down, rather replace it with better infrastructure so it can be enjoyed by more people and last longer. The inclusion of aquatic leisure and play facilities for young children and families is a growing trend. Our aim is to achieve a holistic sports precinct that caters for all sports, brings jobs to our community and new services such as hydrotherapy, better athletics tracks and a modern facility." The approach is consistent with the recent consultant findings and recommendations for future facility provision.

Councillors will receive a briefing and report over the next month for their further consideration and recommendation. \*\*
