up Leaders' Get Together



Editor of the Berry Alliance Town Crier, Nancy Davies spoke about how she can assist contributors, space and word limits as well as the importance of everyone's assistance with meeting the deadline each month.

We then went around the room and one or more representatives gave a brief description of what their community group did, future plans and projects and anything they may need some assistance or support with.

There were some wonderful plans and projects coming up and as always, we went away with a positive view of what our Berry community meant.

A clear and common theme though was that of "renewable volunteers" – recruitment of new volunteers and replacements for those who are looking forward to retirement or more travelling or more rest or just getting tired. Such is the commitment that the issue has been overcome over the years with a number of people staying on longer than they may have wished. Many of our groups share the common problem of volunteers getting older and not being replaced as quickly as people leave.

In short, we need more volunteers for several our community groups.

This was discussed as well as some possible solutions, assistance and methods. Things such as:

- Tell your community groups story as to what you do on a week to week basis and where a new person would be welcomed and assisted and valued – this could be a special article each month in the Town Crier:
- Create a position or positions with a short volunteer description and have that as something to hand to possible volunteers
- Be willing to listen to new ideas and a different point of view. Just because something has been tried and failed before doesn't mean it will not be of benefit or worth trying again.
- Ask members and friends to "Bring a Friend" and ask these people to consider joining the group.

The Alliance has considered this issue further and agree that it needs as much help as we can provide so we have decided to have a "Berry Community Group Expo" where our community groups who wish to participate can have a stall and show their wares, have a handout aimed at new members and recruits, sell food and coffee etc. – show us your thing or what you do and what fun you have doing it and the benefit it gives others.

We have already had some discussions with others including the Berry Chamber of Commerce and we have lots of ideas as well as consultation and planning to go but we are starting now and aiming at September. The Town Crier will carry the publicity, the Berry Alliance will also assist with costs. It could be a fun day and a celebration of our community. So please consider joining a community group, send us any ideas you may have, and we may see you at a future Community Group Leaders Get Together.

Berry District Park

The Berry District Park area provides a unique opportunity to reinvigorate the northern edge of the township of Berry following the introduction of the Berry bypass road. The area is already popular with the local community and visitors, with a great diversity of active sporting and passive recreation activities.

The area referred to as 'Berry District Park' is located on the northern edge of the township of Berry. The site has an extensive frontage to North Street, with a secondary frontage to Woodhill Mountain Road on its eastern side. The northern extent of the District Park will be bounded by the new Princes Highway/Berry bypass road, which was recently opened.

Project Vision

Broadly, the vision for the Berry District Park is to provide unique recreation facilities that build on the existing successes of the area and facilitates future opportunities to improve and supplement broader community needs. A Concept Plan has been produced to illustrate the wide variety of infrastructure proposed for the Park.

What is currently happening?

Naming Engagement

Council is currently seeking nominations for the naming of the park area (currently referred to as 'Berry District Park'). See the section below for further information.

Once the information from the Children's Consultation and Naming Engagement is compiled and the detail design is complete, the plan will go on exhibition for 28 days. Following the exhibition, the design will go out to tender.

Name Your Park

Council is currently seeking nominations for the naming of the area currently referred to as 'Berry District Park'. The park is located on the northern edge of Berry and bounded by the new bypass road.

The vision for the park is to provide unique recreation facilities that build on the area's existing sporting complex. A wide variety of infrastructure is planned for the park, including several different play spaces aimed at different ages, a flying fox, pump track, Learn to Ride facility, bike wash station,

picnic facilities, dog park, pathway circuit, increased parking, and more!

The park will be Nature Based and will reflect the Town of the Trees.

Sustainable

In 2016 over 750,000 electric cars were sold worldwide. The US was an early adopter of the technology, with sales of around 50,000 vehicles in 2012, increasing to over 150,000 sales in 2016. In 2015 China surged ahead in electric car sales, topping 200,000 vehicle sales, and around a further 340,000 vehicles sold in 2016. European countries France, Sweden, Germany, Norway, Netherlands and the UK accounted for 215,000 electric car sales in 2016. Canada and Japan round out the top ten countries in the electric car market. Electric cars now account for 29% of all new car sales in Norway.

Australian has been has been slower to embrace this new technology, despite being known as early adopters of technological innovation. This is due to a variety of reasons; lack of cohesive government policies, high upfront vehicle costs, and lack of charging facilities to allow ease of travel between major towns and cities. Nissan, Renault and Hyundai plan to join Tesla in the Australian market, introducing models priced between \$35,000 and \$50,000. These brands will invigorate the market, with current Tesla models generally priced in the \$90,000 to \$210,000 range.

With modern vehicles being generally less prone to breakdown, the NRMA has changed its business model, and is looking to new and innovative ways to support motorists. The predicted uptake of electric vehicles in Australia means cost savings for motorists, with reduced CO2 emissions, and fuel security by lessening our dependence on imported petrol and diesel fuels. Electric

cars are also predicted to be cheaper to run per kilometre.

Late last year the NRMA introduced its first fast-charge station at the Homebush headquarters. In October the company announced plans for a network of over forty fast-charging stations throughout New South Wales and the ACT, to be located approximately 200 kilometres apart on major highways. Berry has been identified as a key location for a charging station, both for weekend visitors, and travellers heading south. Further sites along the South Coast to the Victorian border have been identified, along with a planned inland route heading south to the snowfields.

Shoalhaven Council have been working in partnership with the NRMA to identify a suitable site in Berry, on the corner of Albany and Victoria Streets in the on street parking area opposite the Showground. Amelia Starr, NRMA Senior Manager - Shared Value Programs, is part of the team liaising with Council staff. Responses from the community so far have been very positive.

community so far have been very positive. Construction of the charging station is expected to start mid year, and take one to two weeks, once approvals and equipment supply are confirmed. Vehicles are safe (from a charging perspective) to be left whilst being charged; the fast charge takes around half an hour. The charging station will be remotely monitored; meaning if there is a fault it can be remotely diagnosed and often fixed remotely. Alternatively a technician would attend the site to effect repairs. The charging station will comply with Australian

electrical standards, and have extensive safety functions in accordance with the open international electric vehicle charger standards.

The NRMA is committed to ensuring that their network of charging stations is powered by renewable energy, with the likelihood that energy will be purchased through the current power network. A direct link to solar panels is impractical given the amount of energy required for a standard charge.

Fast charging takes on average half an hour; this gives an 80% charge to the battery, which promotes the life of the battery. The charging stations have been designed to be suitable for a variety of plug configurations. The planned network of charging stations will be the largest of its kind in Australia. It will be free for NRMA members to use, and initially free for non-members too.

Having a charging station in Berry will be an additional boost to visitor numbers in town, both those who choose our town as a destination, and those travelling further south. Those visitors will be pleasantly surprised by the changes in town since the majority of traffic was diverted away from Queen Street, which has made Berry more inviting as a destination or an interim stop off point.

Kerry O'Brien, one of Australia's most distinguished journalists, and Dr. Helen Caldicott, physician and noted anti-nuclear campaigner, will appear together in a Berry Conversation on Sunday, September 16 at the Berry Public School Hall.

Winner of six Walkley Awards, including the Gold Walkley, Kerry O'Brien was the editor, presenter and interviewer for the 7.30 Report over fifteen years; the presenter and interviewer at Four Corners for five and at Lateline for six. His acclaimed four-part interview with Paul Keating was broadcast by the ABC in 2013 and appeared in book form in 2015.

He has interviewed many world leaders including Barack Obama, Nelson Mandela, Mikhail Gorbachev, Margaret Thatcher and Tony Blair, as well as any number of influential figures in the arts, science and business. For two decades he was also the face of the ABC's election night coverage.

Helen Caldicott, a graduate of the University of Adelaide School of Medicine, was a faculty member of Harvard Medical School. In 1971, she played a major role in Australia's opposition to French atmospheric nuclear testing in the Pacific.

While at Harvard in the early 1980s she helped to reinvigorate, as its president, Physicians for Social Responsibility, an organization of 23,000 doctors committed to educating their colleagues about the dangers of nuclear power, nuclear weapons and nuclear war. On trips abroad she helped start similar medical organizations in many other countries; their umbrella group, International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War, won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1985. She also founded the Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament (WAND) in the US in 1980.

The author or editor of eight books, she has been the recipient of many awards and honorary degrees, the subject of three award-winning documentary films, and was named one of the 20th Century's most influential women by the Smithsonian Institution.



Jennifer Turpin is a public artist with twenty vears' experience creating kinetic installations engaging water, wind, and light as a sculptural media. 

Q FEVER

Berry Medical Centre can now offer you the Q fever vaccination

We have had a number of local cases of Q fever in Berry

Q fever is a bacterial infection that can cause a severe flu-like illness. For some people, Q fever can affect their health and ability to work for many years. The bacteria are spread from animals, mainly cattle, sheep and goats. Even people who do not have contact with animals may be infected, such as family members.

It is an infection that is spread in the air and we have come to learn is relevant for native animals as well. It is recommended for dairy farmers, farm workers, people clearing landing (including mowing), stockyard workers, wildlife workers, people living near stockyards, or pet breeders. A safe and effective vaccine is available to protect people who are at risk. Screening is required to identify who can be vaccinated.

Have you checked the George St park recently? The buffalo grass sprigs planted by Turfco are providing a green shimmer over the bare earth and the severely eroded area at the George St entrance has been filled following the installation of a storm water drain. This work was completed by Charlie Bamborough of CKB Civil and, as with Turfco, was donated as a contribution to the community. The Garden Club is most grateful for the generous support for this major project. The next stage will see the installation of a crushed granite path by Ferncroft Rural.

Unseasonal hot weather, combined with daily watering, has kept our grass in the park happy. Other members of the plant world, however, seem a little confused. Berry folk are commenting on the spot-flowering of shrubs and trees well before their usual time of late Winter or Spring. Some trees are showing autumn foliage, others are hesitant. The increasing unpredictability of weather patterns seems to be reflected in a blurring of the seasons.

The news that the Elm Leaf Beetle is now in the Berry area is concerning. Their presence is first marked by a "shot hole" pattern on the leaves, followed by browning and



members. A font of gardening knowledge and advice, John Gabriele has been a presenter on the ABC's Compost Heap since 1996. Now working at a senior management level within TAFE NSW, we are pleased that he still has time to return to Berry, this time to speak on "Reconnecting with Nature through Gardening".

HELP SAVE

THE RAILWAY STATION MASTER'S RESIDENCE



The Berry Railway Station Precinct, which includes the Station Master's Residence, Yard, Signal Box and Station, has State Heritage listing. It dates back to 1892. Although it is in a state of neglect today, the Station Master's Residence – being the cottage adjacent to the Berry Railway Station and last used as the Berry Scout Hall - is a very rare and unique example of an early design railway grouping, predating the standard designs of 1899.

The Station Master's Residence is extremely important to the historical character of Berry and holds an important place in the history of the town. It is owned by RailCorp and has been empty since about 2009.

Many in the community as well as The Berry & District Historical Society are very mindful of the historical significance of the Residence and for a number of years have been communicating with RailCorp regarding its future. During this time, despite being surrounded by fencing, the building has continued to suffer from neglect.

Berry is the historical gateway to the Shoalhaven and many visitors to the area travel by rail arriving at our historic station only to be confronted by the Residence in its neglected, derelict condition. This will be more obvious this year as the 2nd June is

the 125th Anniversary of the opening of the rail line from Kiama to Bomaderry. Celebrations are planned.

The Station Master's Residence is under threat of being demolished.

However, there are viable options for its future use including its reconstruction in accordance with heritage guidelines. Some community suggestions have been: a café, Tourist Information Centre, bike hire or shared office work space.

The community is being asked to support the signing of a Petition to prevent the demolition of the building. The Petition can be found at various locations around town.

Alternatively, you can send a letter to our local State Member, Gareth Ward at kiama@parliament.nsw.gov.au or his Electoral Office at 102 Terralong Road, Kiama. NSW 2533 requesting the Residence not be demolished, and that viable options be followed up.

The Conservation Committee plan to ask Gareth Ward and relevant representatives from RailCorp to attend a Forum meeting to discuss the issue.

Forum Meeting Held on 19 April

57 people attended the meeting, including Clrs John Wells and Patricia White, and Director of Planning & Development, Phil Costello.

Bangalee Motel DA

Stuart Coughlan presented material provided by Berry Historical Society, which explained that the area surrounding the proposed development was the site of the original private town of Broughton Creek, which predated the town of Berry. It is the oldest area of settlement and has some very significant heritage listed properties, along with the Pulman Street Heritage Conservation Area (HCA).

Council's Heritage Advisor has stated that, with regard to the heritage context, the heritage significance of each of the surrounding heritage properties and the HCA is not adversely impacted by the proposed development. She has recommended approval of the application with no conditions. Our view is that the heritage assessment is seriously flawed as it fails to consider the impact on the overall heritage context and setting within which the development will sit. It also disregards the significance of the site being the gateway to Berry, which Council had previously stated would be a critical element of its assessment.

Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging proposal for Berry

Amelia Starr presented on NRMA's plans to spend \$10 million creating Australia's largest EV fast-charger network. It aims to connect key tourism routes to help drive business in local communities. Berry is seen as a key destination for enabling EV journeys and the preferred site is the parking area on the corner of Albany and Victoria Streets opposite the Showground.



Berry Landcare projects and activities

Jim Jefferis, Chairman of Berry Landcare, presented a summary of projects and activities in the Berry Surrounds. His presentation is available on the Forum website.

Changes Proposed for Huntingdale Park Development

The developer advised that the application would not be finalised prior to the Forum meeting. A separate meeting will be arranged for the developer to explain the application so that the community can make an informed assessment of the revised proposal.

Council Special Rate Variation (SRV)

Council is seeking IPART approval to retain the 13.2% SRV (approved as a one-off increase in 2017/18) as a permanent increase. Special variations are also being requested for the next three years - 5% in each year including the rate peg of 2.5%.

Berry District Park

Council is currently seeking nominations for the naming of the Park. To submit a name, fill in the form on Council's website before 30 April (forms are also available from Berry Public School and Berry Post Office). A shortlist of names will be displayed from 1 May and you will be able to vote for your favourite name between 1-14 May.



BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD AND FIRE PERMITS

The statutory bush fire season finished on 30th March 2018. Fire Permits are no longer required in the Shoalhaven; however, some rules still apply. Before you light, you must give 24-hours' notice to your neighbours and 24-hours' notice to the RFS Shoalhaven District office (4424 4424) if your fire is in a rural fire district. Just because the bush fire season is over, it doesn't mean that fires are not a risk and as the land owner you have a responsibility to ensure the safety of others.

Death in the Environment:

Spring celebrates birth so why not think about death in autumn.

Animal: A couple of months ago a vehicle hit and killed a wombat on the side of Tindalls Lane. It was under the roadside canopy of trees and was not close to anyone's driveway. It has undergone the process of decay in the sight of passing cars. Initial decay saw crows and foxes scavenging the body. This was followed by the bloating period with attack by maggots and beetles. The third stage of the decomposition saw the fluids and other nutrients purge out on to the surrounding vegetation immediately ground killing around the carcase. This process deflated the remains to a flat mat of fur and bones. The current state of the dead animal is the advance decay which will leave just the skeleton. The spilled nutrients will create new life in the area. Nothing is lost.

Vegetable: On land adjacent to the new highway the contractors have placed many large logs adjacent to the alignment fencing where they will decay. In some places they have left large dead trees standing like ghosts at a safe distance from the traffic. These may be considered 'eyesores' by the passers-by many of whom come to Berry because of its natural beauty. These dead trees, however, can be nesting or perching places for birds and local fauna. They will decay and be eaten by wood borers and termites. New life will be created.

Mineral: These processes have been going on in the Berry area for literally millions of years. Fossil collectors in the Broughton area have found many large numbers of Brachiopod in the exposed strata along a Creek in Broughton Vale. These are mussel like Marine animals from the Late Permian. 260 million ago



this Broughton formation was a Near-Shore Marine and Volcanic environment, part of the Southern Sydney Basin. It was part of the Gondwana continent and was situated at the present day position of Ross Ice Shelf. The density of these fossils in the rock indicates that they were an extremely fecund species that has been overwhelmed by a cataclysmic volcanic event.



MEN'S SHED ZONE CONFERENCE

The Berry Men's Shed hosted a Zone Conference in April inviting 17 local Sheds to attend. Over 80 Shedders attended on the day to discuss a variety of subjects including safety in the workplace, training procedures, welfare of members, setting up new Sheds and dealing with the NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme). Executives from Australian Men's Shed Association Liz McDonald and Melissa White spoke to the members about applying for grants and Shed insurance.



A Safe Place

There are hundreds of verses throughout the bible that command and encourage Christians to care for widows, orphans, refugees and the needy. The one thing that each of these groups of people have in common is that they are vulnerable. Their situation often leaves them physically, relationally and financially less secure. While we know that God loves everyone, we also read that He has a particular concern for the vulnerable.

To the fatherless he is a father. To the widow he is a champion friend. To the lonely he gives a family. To the prisoners, he leads into prosperity until they sing for joy. This is our Holy God in his Holy Place!

Psalm 68:5-6a (TPT)

As a child, Jesus was a refugee, and for much of his ministry, He was homeless. He knew what it was like to be vulnerable. In Matthew 26 He likens the way that we treat the vulnerable with how we treat Him. He says every time to clothe or feed someone, it is as if you clothe and feed Him. The reverse is also true whenever we fail to feed and clothe someone, we fail to do so for Him.

Jesus leaves us with no doubts about what is expected of us. The Church should always be a place where the vulnerable in society feel safe and find love and acceptance. Unfortunately, if you read the news you will find countless stories about how the church has been the opposite. If Jesus had a grave, (which He doesn't) I imagine he would turning in it with anger of the things that were done in His name.

As a church, we take this very seriously. We want to make sure that we are above reproach when it comes to safety. We don't want to leave any room for any kind of abuse to take place in any of our ministries. All our volunteers are screened and trained in safe practices.



Best chance for your plants

Autumn is planting time The journey from seed to seedling is not

always straight forward and often quite precarious, so having grown a healthy seedling, we need to give it the best chance to flourish by :-

- Selecting the most suitable plant for your site and local conditions.
- Planting out when the soil temperature is above 15 degrees Celsius.
- Selecting tube stock that is growing strongly with roots emerging from the base of the tube.
- Ensuring your plant has been 'hardened off' sufficiently to cope with conditions outside of the nursery.
- Preparing the site and planting hole.
- Protecting your new plant during dry, windy and very hot conditions.

Preparing your plant for planting out in the garden

- Fill a container with water enough to cover the soil in the tubes to be planted.
- Immerse the plant in the pot up to the soil level for about 10 minutes. Any air bubbles will be displaced and the root ball will be thoroughly wet.
- Remove the pot and allow it to drain.

Preparing the planting hole

- Dig a hole twice as wide as the root ball of the plant and deep enough so that the roots will remain straight.
- Loosen the soil around the sides and at the base of the hole. If the soil is heavy, add some gypsum.

- Fill the hole with water and allow the water
- If the water will not drain away after 12-24 hours, build up a mound of soil.
- Put ½ teaspoon of water saving crystals and a little blood and bone into the hole and cover with soil or compost.
- Plant the prepared plant and back fill the hole with compost and loosened soil. The roots of the plant should be planted at the same depth as they were in the pot. Press down firmly with your hands. Stamping down with you foot can damage the roots.
- Water in thoroughly then apply a thick layer of mulch. Keep the mulch away from the stem of the plant. Water thoroughly and deeply for the first few weeks.

Wire cages or tree guards may be necessary to protect the plant from grazing animals.




