Everest Assault – Full Steam Ahead

35 YEARS AGO, THERE WERE OVER 1000 CASES OF POLIO RECORDED EVERY DAY. ROTARY CLUBS INTERNATIONALLY DECIDED THEN TO TAKE ACTION TO ERADICATE THIS CRIPPLING DISEASE. WE ARE WINNING BUT THERE IS MUCH MORE TO DO - RECENT WILD POLIO OUTBREAKS HAVE SHOWN THAT THE FIGHT IS NOT OVER.

The "Everest Assault" trek to Everest Base Camp in April to be led by Berry Rotarian Ken Hutt is powering full steam ahead. It is an innovative example of how one small Club can make a difference in raising funds for Rotary's EndPolioNow campaign. The Trekking Team has 20 members from Berry and surrounds, plus 11 porters and two guides. The team leaves Berry on the 16th March with all members currently fundraising and training hard for the challenge – all being committed to playing their part in helping to eradicate Polio with each to raise \$2000 for the PolioPlus campaign. You can support the trekkers in raising funds, through a GoFundMe page accessible from the Rotary Club of Berry's website www.berryrotary.org. au or you can donate to our special PolioPlus account at BSB 082 435 Acc No 358187017 – the smallest donation of \$1 is enough to immunise 3 children.

Ken Hutt continues with a bigger challenge for PolioPlus ... by planning a World Record Everest Assault. The Nepalese Government have now given him permission to make an attempt to fly a paraglider from the summit of Everest – the first time this has ever been granted. And he is meeting Government officials whilst in Nepal with the Trek.

If you have an interest in the arts and enjoy learning and socialising with like-minded people, join ADFAS Shoalhaven at their upcoming lectures.

On Thursday 7 February we'll welcome Jenny Bowker who lived in Cairo for four years and worked closely with the Egyptian Tentmakers – men who do superb fine appliqué panels which were originally used for lining tents. The art is dying, and the Tentmaker's Street that had 247 skilled masters in 1979 is now down to 45. Collections are not held anywhere in Egypt, yet the work is stunning and beautiful. Jenny will talk about the history and development of the Tentmakers' appliqué.

On Thursday 28 February, Jacqueline Cockburn's lecture will examine Rodin's commission for The Gates of Hell. Started in 1882, they were not finished by the time he died in 1917. Taking inspiration from Dante's extraordinary work, Rodin did wonderful drawings and then filled his magnificent doors with figures which would inspire his entire career. Jacqueline will look at The Kiss and his other depictions of characters condemned to Hell for their crimes, and will look back to Dante's poem, one of the most important works of all time

The hour-long lectures start at 7.30 pm and are followed with a light supper and wine.

Scrub turpentine (Rhodamnia rubescens) and Myrtle Rust

Scrub turpentine is a small attractive tree scattered throughout the northern Shoalhaven and the Illawarra area, but it is not particularly common in any one location.

The leaves of Scrub turpentine can be used as an identifying feature because of the distinct pattern of three parallel veins.

Unfortunately, this attractive small tree in the few known locations has been affected by **myrtle rust virus** in the past few years, but some plants appear to be making a recovery.

Myrtle rust virus is a serious threat to plants of the Myrtaceae family.

The disease can cause deformed leaves, heavy defoliation of branches, reduced fertility, dieback, stunted growth, and plant death.

Repeated infestations could adversely affect the ability of some species such as Scrub turpentine to survive in our bush areas.

If you have any plants affected by myrtle rust, please observe the highest level of plant hygiene.

Dandelions

This most common and persistent of garden weeds was the plant featured on the cover of a text book on the birds and bees for schools in England. It was quickly withdrawn for a not so obvious reason. Dandelions (Taraxacum officinale) reproduce by apomixis that is asexually, without pollination. That means all the Dandelions in your neighbourhood are



It gets its name from the shape of its leaves (French for Lion's teeth). The native of

Eurasia and North America was introduced from Europe and now propagates as wildflowers in Australia and worldwide. They are entirely edible from root to flower. The bright yellow flower head is easily recognised and its seed head is so famous it has been the inspiration for sculpture (El Alamein Fountain Kings Cross). It grows in abundance in lawns that cannot be regularly mown.

The genus Taraxacum is classified in the Family Asteraceae with another almost identical plant the Murnong (Microseris lanceolata) or Yam Daisy. The Murnong were the staple food of the original Australians. The root is very tasty and was an important part of pre European agriculture in Australia. Unfortunately the Murnong is now very hard to find whereas it used to cover entire hillsides in golden flowers.

The story of this change of the abundance of this plant is revealed in the popular book "Dark Emu" by Bruce Pascoe (Magabala Books). Bruce Pasco is one of the guest speakers at "Berry Conversations" - Sunday, April 7th, Berry Public School.





Following the move by Neil Percival to Young in July last year, and a successful search for a new Senior Minister, the Rev Simon Chaplin will be inducted as the Rector of St Luke's in the Parish of Berry on Tuesday, 5th February.

Simon and his wife Amy, along with their 3 children, Liam, Lily and Annabel, have moved to Berry from Oak Flats Anglican church where he had been Assistant Minister for the past two years. Prior to that he was the assistant at Malabar in the south east of Sydney for 8 years.

"Once we moved from Sydney to the beautiful South Coast we knew we wanted to stay for as long as we could" said the Rev Chaplin "So when we were invited to serve at Berry we were delighted with the opportunity. We have heard so many good things about the church, the countryside, but especially the people of this town. We hope as a family to be of help to this church, but also to the whole community as we share the love of Christ."

Simon studied at Moore Theological College from 2005-2008, graduating with a Bachelor of Divinity. He also has a Bachelor of Science (Hon) degree from UNSW and worked as an Industrial Chemist before entering



the ministry. The experience gained in his previous ministry roles in preaching, leading services, co-ordinating youth groups and children's ministry have prepared him well to take up the position of the Senior Minister at St Luke's.

Simon is committed to ministry of the Gospel but also has a desire and willingness to build relationships within the broader Berry community.



Currently Professor at the Jumbunna Institute for Indigenous Education and Research at UTS, , he has had a varied career as a teacher, farmer, fisherman, barman, fencing contractor, lecturer, Aboriginal language researcher, archaeological site worker and editor. His book Fog a Dox won the Young Adult category of the 2013 Prime Minister's Literary Awards. His most recent book is the *Dark Emu: Aboriginal Agriculture and the Birth of Australia,* which won the NSW Premier's Book of the Year Award in 2016.

Of Rembarranga and Tiwi descent, **Marie Munkara** was delivered on the banks of the Mainoru River in Arnhemland by her two grandmothers and spent her early years on Bathurst Island. Her first novel, Every Secret Thing, won the David Unaipon Award in 2008 and the Northern Territory Book of the Year in 2010. She has written two children's books, Rusty Brown and Rusty and Jojo, and another novel, *A Most Peculiar Act*. Her most recent book is a memoir, *Of Ashes and Rivers that Run to the Sea*. Marie is presently working on the TV miniseries for *Every Secret Thing* and her next novel.






