

The Berry Celtic Festival this year highlights the Celtic nation of "Ireland" and introduces a number of additional features to the Program. Along with a day full of entertainment including the spectacular jousting medieval knights, there are various workshops for Irish dancing, traditional tunes for kids, Gaelic singing, instrumental sessions along with country dance.

The Berry Forum

Forum Meeting Held on 11 April

122 people attended the meeting, including Deputy Mayor Patricia White. 51 Forum members advised that they would not be able to attend the meeting, but wanted to communicate and record their support for the Committee's position on 'temporary' functions centres and inappropriate tourist accommodation development on rural land. The following matters were covered at the meeting.

'Temporary' Function Centres

Around 90 objections have now been lodged for both the Strong's Road and Tindall's Lane DAs, and a resident of Tindall's Lane spoke to the Forum about the adverse impacts that would be experienced by residents on surrounding properties.

The Forum Committee has informed Council about a 2015 Court judgement that provides a clear precedent for refusing the current applications.

Forum members voted overwhelmingly in favour of the Committee opposing the 'temporary' function centres at the Council Development Committee in May, with only two votes against.

Tourist Accommodation Development in Shoalhaven

The intent of planning legislation is to balance development interests, environmental interests and the public interest. However, several areas have been identified where the intent of tourist accommodation development legislation is not reflected in its current wording.

The statewide Local Environment Plan contains omissions, misguided amendments and weak definitions of permitted land uses in rural zones, resulting in anomalies and inconsistencies that create loopholes for opportunists who do not subscribe to the intent of a balanced approach to development. Since the matter was first raised in the February 2016 Forum meeting and again in the June and August 2016 Forum meetings, the Committee has lobbied the Department of Planning and Council to address the inconsistencies in the planning legislation, whilst at the same time opposing developments that seek to take advantage of them. In doing so, the Committee finds itself labelled by some opponents as anti-development.

Forum members voted overwhelmingly in favour of the Committee continuing its discussions with Council and the Department of Planning, to promote effective regulation to stop the proliferation of inappropriate tourist accommodation development in rural areas.

Beach Road Planning Proposal

An update was provided on zoning changes and minimum lot sizes. The PP will be going on public exhibition shortly. Concerns raised by a resident in Campbells Run were explained.

Apex Park New Toilets

Plans for the new toilet block at Apex Park are available on the Forum website under News updates. Council has advised that there is insufficient budget for the twelve cubicle block and alternative configurations are being considered.

Berry Heritage Matters

NEXT FORUM MEETING IS ON 13 JUNE 7.30PM AT THE SCHOOL OF ARTS

The current state of heritage protection for the Berry village in the Shoalhaven LEP was discussed, particularly the lack of Heritage Conservation Areas that could protect streetscapes and the village centre. Council's intends to investigate the addition of 2 HCAs and 29 properties to the LEP, subject to the Heritage Study currently being undertaken, community consultation and then approval by the Department of Planning.

COFFEE AND **Friends**

The speaker on the 22nd May at 10am will be Rev Dr David Millikan. David is a retired Uniting Church minister who has been a resident in the Brogers Creek/Woodhill Mountain area for the past decade.

David was Head of Religious Broadcasting for the ABC for 7 years before going into the Ministry.

He has come to be regarded as Australia's leading expert on cults and has given expert testimony in a number of court trials. He has taught the NSW Police, and made specials on cults for Four Corners, 60 Minutes and Channel 7 Sunday Night. David will talk about some of his encounters with cults, including his recent dealings with The Little Pebble. He is currently featured in the Women's Weekly following a recent case concerning cult leader Serge Benhayon.

Everyone is welcome.







Berry Riding Club Riding Fun for Everyone

Recycling the plastics that Council doesn't collect	The REDcycle program collects suitable plastics to be transformed into outdoor furniture, signage, bollards and other products. You can recycle biscuit packets (outer wrapper); bread bags (without the tie); bubble wrap, cellophane and large sheets used to wrap furniture and other products for delivery; cling wrap; Australia Post plastic sachets; chip, chocolate and snack wrappers (including silver-lined) wrap; netting produce bags (remove metal clips); rice bags; clear plastic wine bladders; squeeze pouches (e.g. baby food) with lid on; potting mix & compost bags; zip lock bags; and green (polypropylene) bags. Plastics should be clean, dry, and cut to A3 size in the case of larger items. Not suitable for collection: rigid plastics; plastic containers & bottles; bread bag ties; medication blister packs; film negatives and x-rays; balloons; adhesive tape; tinsel; coffee bags; drinking straws; foil, foam and polystyrene; clear vinyl packaging (e.g. quilts & bedding); rubber and latex; foil based wine bladders; and laminated materials. To learn more, visit the website: www.redcycle.net.au TerraCycle was established in 2001 as a means of dealing with hard to recycle items, with the goal of making these zero waste products. The company now runs programs in twenty countries, diverting plastics otherwise headed to landfill. Andrea Francis has been recognised for her contribution to community and social services at the 2019 Shoalhaven International Women's Day Awards.

On the 9th March, Shoalhaven City Council mayor Amanda Findley presented the honours in front of about 80 people at Meroogal house, Nowra.

Andrea Francis was acknowledged for her contribution to Community and Social Services. Andrea has been helping local community groups, churches and volunteers with advice and auditing support for over thirty years. More than twenty years ago she cofounded A Taste of Paradise Farm, (with her husband Tim). A Taste of Paradise is a Berrybased, not for profit charity that supports, at risk and disadvantaged young people from the Shoalhaven, Illawarra and the Southern Highlands.

Andrea's financial and accounting support has been integral to allowing A Taste of Paradise to continue its remarkable work. The charity does not receive any direct Government funding, so Andrea's financial skills, monetary support and selfless contribution has been paramount to the organisation's ongoing operation.

Children aged five to eighteen, are referred to ATOP's day programs by government child welfare workers and welfare agencies, and demand for the farm's services continues to grow. The children spend time on the farm with the animals and the environment, being introduced to new skills while they are mentored and assisted to overcome the difficulties they are encountering in their lives.

^{CC} Many of the young people that come to our farm have become disillusioned with life. They've been let down by the people and authorities who are meant to help them," says Andrea. "Through interacting with our animals, the natural environment of the farm and through the therapeutic benefit of seeing results from your own work, they begin to find their place in the world and realise that they can create opportunities for themselves and determine their own future.

Effective Fox Trapping:

The diverse and scenic natural environment is the reason many of us live here and native wildlife is a vital component. Foxes are the greatest predator of Native Fauna. There are many ways to kill foxes - baiting, ejectors, shooting; but regulations preclude their use on properties smaller than 10 acres. Trapping is a legal option, however some of us have not found it easy to entice a fox into a trap.

The recent well attended workshop organised by Project Manager David Rush has persuaded Land carers to keep trying. Patience is necessary. Avoid anything that will deter the fox, such as any human smell on bait or trap. Wear gloves. The bait, typically chicken necks, is first pegged out around the trap which is disabled with a cable tie. Ideally an infrared wildlife camera is used to monitor movement around the trap. A couple of weeks of fox evidence in and around the trap is enough e to then place the lure inside the trap. Only when the fox is comfortable going in should the trap be set.

Prior to setting a trap arrange for somebody with a fire arms licence to swiftly and humanely despatch the fox. On no account should the animal be left in the sun during the day. Get together with your neighbours to group fund the purchase of a trap. (Bishops in South Nowra has solid ones for \$365) A fox trapping workshop is being held in Robertson on Saturday 27 April. Contact David Rush (davidr@npansw.org.au) for register or to learn more about funding available for landholders in the Berry Corridor.

Local native plants with edible fruits

Podocarpus elatus – Plum pine and Carpobrotus glaucescens – Pig face

PLANT PROPAGATION PROPAGATION NURSERY

Year 3 children have been having fun pronouncing and writing the botanical names for the seeds or seedlings they have planted.

They recognised the Plum pine in the school forest and along the street verge opposite the railway line and Pig face from seeing the plant in gardens, parks and t the beach.

The Plum pine is a very handsome conical shaped long lived tree.

It makes an attractive hedge or a specimen for a large garden, but can be pruned to shape and kept in a pot for years because of it's slow growth.

Although Plum pines are conifers, they don't produce cones.

The curious fruits are made up of 2 parts, a hard seed and an edible swollen stem. When ripe the fruits are purple and have a refreshing mild flavour and a soft fleshy texture. Both male and female trees are necessary to produce fruit, so planting more than one is recommended.

The tree enjoys rich moist well drained soil in sun or shade and is adaptable to a wide range of conditions from the escarpment to the coast.

Pig face is a local succulent ground cover with pink flowers. It develops edible fruits and can be propagated from leaf cuttings.

Pig face grows well in full sun and once established in free draining sandy soil, requires very little water. Plants at 7 Mile Beach help to protect the sand dunes when inundated with high tides and windy conditions.

Stock up on veggies picked that day

When you walk through the rear gates of Berry Showground on a Thursday afternoon the market atmosphere draws you in. With more than 20 farmers, growers and makers setting up their stalls each week, this is a true farmers' market where you can chat to the person who grew those leeks, or the mushroom grower or even the person who made the filling for that tasty pie you've just devoured.

With a focus on fresh produce, you can always find some new and different fruit and veg at the produce stands. Like the cucumelons grown in Kangaroo Valley and on display at the Kangaroo Valley Producers stall. Kirsty and Andrew run the stall and showcase a range of fresh produce as well as olives, salad dressings and eggs from a variety of producers from the Valley who have combined to bring their products to Berry customers.

Further in to the market, under the cow sheds, you'll find Buena Vista Farm from Gerringong where Adam and Emmy stock leafy greens, fennel, carrots and a range of homegrown herbs, as well as the latest addition to the Buena Vista range, goats cheese. Well worth stopping here.

Also under the cow sheds is Strong Organics and Spotted Gum Farm. All your vegetable needs are catered to by both these growers who pride themselves on the high quality of their produce, picked fresh on market days just for you. Ask Chanel from Strong Organics about the mini cauliflowers – perfect for 1-2 people. And if leafy greens are your thing, then Wade from Spotted Gum Farm can help you out.

And if all this talk of great produce has got you thinking you might grow some of your own, you can pick up a range of seedlings from A Taste of Paradise stall, where you can also grab a dozen eggs to whip up an omelette for your breakfast with all your fresh produce for the week.

The Berry Farmers' Market operates from 2-5pm (winter trading hours) every Thursday afternoon under the cow sheds at Berry Showground (except Thursday, 9 May due to the set up for the Berry


