

Over the years, the Berry Men's Shed has received many acknowledgements and awards for their services to the Berry Community. A number of certificates have been received from Schools in the Shoalhaven where we have introduced a Scholarship programme which has now been running for 6 years.

We received a visit from the Kiama Men's Shed last week and they were very impressed with the equipment we had available to make a variety of items.

Our Annual Christmas sale is set down for the first Saturday in November and we are working on a large range of quality merchandise ideal for Christmas. This is our major fund raiser for the year and the proceeds go towards our Scholarship program. Fleece, Fibre and Fabrics at the Berry Museum

This August and September visitors to the Berry Museum might detect some unfamiliar movement in one of the back rooms, where Berry Spinners and Weavers are holding an exhibition and a spinning demonstration to celebrate 40 years as an association. Our members have contributed examples of past and present achievements to share with interested visitors.



The exhibition includes examples of yarns produced from the fleeces of various breeds of sheep, and alpaca, that has been spun and plied by group members. There are also examples of knitted and woven items that feature the natural colours of the fleeces from sheep raised specially for the purpose. In case this leads you to think that the yarns are all black and white, or shades of grey and brown, there are also examples of dyed yarns.

Dyeing yarn is an art form at which some of our members are acknowledged experts. Whether using commercial dyes or experimenting with dyes extracted from Australian native plants and trees, the search for new colours and colour combinations is neverending.

And what do you do with all the wool, fibre and yarn? Many members of the group choose to knit or crochet their yarn, or felt their fibre. Others choose to weave wool, cotton, linen or silk using innovative patterns they create themselves or that they've found by searching the weaving literature.

The passion that drives people to create colourful yarns also drives a search for ever more innovative patterns and designs and a desire to create fabrics that are lovely to touch and gorgeous to wear.

Berry Spinners and Weavers are at the Berry Museum until the end of September. Museum opening hours are Saturdays 11-2; Sundays 11-3, School Holiday weekdays 11-2.

'Temporary' function centres

It's possible that the DA for Strongs Road may go to the 6 August Development Committee meeting. An update will be emailed via the Forum Newsletter on Thursday 1st August.

Concerns with Email Sent To Chamber Members

The Chamber of Commerce Committee has recently advised members of its communications with Council about -'Temporary' Function Centres and Public Toilets in Berry. The following extracts have raised concerns with the Forum Committee -

"As you may be aware over the last few months there has been a lot of noise regarding Temporary Function Centres and the Council rules that regulate them."

"Following discussions with Council, our analysis leads us to consider the best location for new facilities to be the section of Alexandra St between Queen and Princess Streets. We would welcome any feedback from members on this subject so that we can assist council in delivering the best possible outcome for visitors to Berry.'

'Temporary' Function Centres - Council has received more than two hundred submissions (many signed by two residents) objecting to the DAs for Strongs Rd and Tindalls Lane, and the dangerous precedent they would set. RMS has warned that approval would

lead to destruction of the ambience of the area and a reduction in the land values of neighbouring properties. It is disappointing that communication of these serious issues affecting people's lives is being trivialised as "a lot of noise."

Public Toilets in Berry - Until recently. Council's website stated -

"Extensive community engagement has been undertaken since 2013 with the resident group for Berry (Berry Forum) and the Berry Chamber of Commerce and Tourism. Many sites have been investigated. The Berry Forum held a vote on four site options in October 2017 and over 60% preference was to refurbish the public amenities at Apex Park. After detailed investigation the most cost effective preferred option ... refurbishment or replacement of the existing Apex Park public amenities."

Notice of the vote was published in the Town Crier and there was a very clear community preference for Apex Park, Council's preferred site. The site in Alexandra St, south of Queen St by the park received by far the lowest number of votes. The Alexandra St taxi rank site was discarded by Council due to inadequate distance for safe vehicle turning. However, we are reliably informed that councillors are being lobbied to get the Berry community's preference and Council staff's decision overturned.

NEXT FORUM MEETING IS ON 15 AUGUST 7.30PM AT THE SCHOOL OF ARTS.



We'd Love For You To Join Us.....

On the 30th July, Zontians around the globe celebrated the International Day of Friendship. In particular they celebrated the friendships, fellowship and dedication to the Zonta mission that has made a difference for countless women and girls around the world.

As part of this mission the Zonta Club of Berry will be holding a birthing kit assembly day on the 17th August 2019 at the Uniting Church Hall, Albert Street, Berry starting at 9.30am.

The birthing kit cause is a project of Zonta International and is administered by the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia), an organisation dedicated to improving the conditions for women who give birth at home in developing countries.

In the developing world, half a million women die annually, many from infection, tetanus and haemorrhage. For every woman who dies in childbirth, around another 30 women (15 million) incur injuries and infections, many of which are often painful, disabling, embarrassing and lifelong. Birthing kits save lives and reduce suffering providing for a clean birth.

The kits are basic and include six items – a plastic sheet, soap, two gloves, sterile scalpel blade, three cords and five gauze squares. Kits are distributed to countries including Papua New Guinea, Afghanistan, Myanmar, Madagascar, Sudan, Tibet, Vietnam, Ethiopia, Uganda, Kenya, DR Congo, India, East Timor and other countries.

The Zonta Club of Berry is delighted with the success of their fundraising campaigns, and generous donations from organisations and individuals. This success has given us enough funds to purchase the items needed to make up 1000 kits, each costing \$5.00.

With at least 60 volunteers needed to assemble these kits, members of Zonta are looking for volunteers to assist on the day. Anyone who can spare a few hours to help out and enjoy a fun day can call Mary Seelis on 4464 1191 to register.

Ground covers and grasses – worth a second look

Native ground covers and grasses form an integral part of a balanced bush plant community, growing close to and in forested areas, along some rural roads and lanes, at the beach, close to waterways and even in urban areas on road verges.

The value of native ground covers, grasses and ferns is often under estimated.

Some advantages of retaining naturally occurring ground covers and establishing some new areas in a bush garden include:

- Longer natural vegetation forms protective habitat, nesting materials and food for birds, lizards, frogs and small mammals.
- When established, ground covers help to prevent perennial weed infestations by reducing the ability of weed seeds to germinate
- They provide a living mulch which protects soil loss from wind and water erosion, especially on sloping sites and creek banks.
- Prevents moisture loss from the soil and acts as insulation from extremes of temperature.

Mixed native grasses and herbs have been planted in the School Tree Orchard. They will gradually spread and grow between and over the mulch, creating a natural bush-like appearance.

Native ground covers can even be mown. In fact, mowing promotes their growth.

If you'd like to grow ground covers for your bush garden, call in to the nursery and we will show you what to plant and how.

Following a number of requests the Berry Alliance and Town Crier have decided to provide these as a service to our community.

The Berry Forum tell us that they are available on their web site when contacted.

Council have an excellent D A Tracking service on line. All you need to do is go to https://shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/Planning-amp-Building/ Development-application-tracking and enter the DA number from the left hand column. You can view all details there as they arise and you can make a submission on any DA.

We found that some close neighbours have been unaware of a DA being submitted as Council are only obliged to write to immediate neighbours informing them of the application. This will sometimes surprise close neighbours as it does not apply to immediate neighbours who are not on the same road for example. We believe that the local community want to know about some Applications and are often affected by an Application even if they are not on the list of people to be informed directly. You may be a tenant for example and any notification goes to the owner of the property (ie the ratepayer). You both may wish to make a submission.

In his dissertation on architecture, Leon Battista Alberti – the original 'Renaissance man' – wrote: 'We shall therefore borrow all our rules for the fixing of proportions from the musicians'.

It is not surprising that the question of proportion should be an important theme in

Alberti's book, but how did the musicians get involved? It turns out that there is a mathematical link between visible proportions and audible proportions, or harmony, and that Renaissance architects were well aware of this link. They saw it as proof that their architecture could participate in the harmony of the whole cosmos. One of them, Filippo Brunelleschi, took the idea further in his invention of 'linear perspective' and thereby, incidentally, revolutionised western painting.



The Crisis of Loneliness

The 2018 Australian Loneliness report found that one in four Australians experienced loneliness each week. Commentators highlight a movement towards working and relating through screens (as opposed to face to face), an increase in single person households and the erosion of the nuclear family as significant contributors to loneliness. Some leading health and well-being experts have identified loneliness as a major public health crisis. The UK government are so concerned with the issue that they have appointed a Minister for Loneliness. I expect that each of us will experience loneliness at some point in our lives.

The Psalmist writes

To the fatherless he is a father; To the widow he is a champion friend. To the lonely he makes them part of a family. (Psalm 68:5-6a TPT)

This passage speaks of a God who is the comforter to the lonely. He is as close as a good father is to their children. Loneliness can be somewhat combated by the realisation that we are never truly alone. God is always with us and ready to hear our prayers. It also speaks of a God who places us in families. The original Hebrew word translated family is also the word for home or household. The Jewish household could be filled with those naturally related, servants, guests, distant relatives and friends. It was not limited to our view of a nuclear family. Could another interpretation of this passage speak of God placing us in a home or in a close, safe community? We often speak of Berry Community Church as a home or as a family. We work very hard at being a people that welcome everyone and anyone in. We encourage our people to be part of our smaller connect groups and provide many opportunities for people who will sit, listen and be present with people who are in a hard place. We try to be as best an example of the kind of family that God places people in. If you'd like to join us, you'd be most welcome.

BERRY GOLF CLUB

Did you know that Berry once had its own Golf Course?

In 1941 some local enthusiasts started the Berry Golf Club on land fronting Kangaroo Valley Rd in the area of the present Thomas Close. It was enabled by negotiations with local landowners Dave Host and Ern Patterson.

Members contributed £ 100 (approx \$ 8,000 today) towards the course and assisted by golfer Fred Hale, a 9 hole golf course was designed and excavations completed for the sand greens. Sump oil was mixed with the sand because the plain beach sand was continually being blown away.

Bank Manager, Bill Leck was the first Club President and school teacher Alec Scardoni, was Secretary. Following Presidents were Frank Sims, Curt Moy & finally Jim Priddle who remained as President until the closure of the club in 1960.

The first official competition played on the course was in March 1942 with afternoon tea provided from a billy on an open fire. The official Club house was erected in 1944 thanks to the generosity of the Priddle Family and others, at a cost of £ 289.

During WW1 the Club held its first Open Day in April 1945 and raised over £ 12 for the Red Cross

However, in 1946 the lease of the Host property was terminated as Mr Host sought compensation for the Holes (Greens) that were dug on his property. A further section of nearby Peterson's farm was acquired and due to the labour of the members, a new nine hole layout came into existence.

Dairy cows had the run of the course during the week and 80 year old Greenkeeper Harry Hoare cleared the fairways of the cow pads and made the course ready for the weekend. Len Kneaves and Jack Higgins were two of the outstanding golfers in the earlier days of the Club and when Berry was admitted to the White Horse Cup Competition games were played in the morning, and social golf in the afternoon. High tea and hijinks then lasted until well into the night.

In 1960, however, the hosting of the White Horse Cup was the Club's final function.

Tea Bags and Science:


When soil litter decomposes it emits carbon dioxide. The Arctic tundra is emitting vast amounts as the land heats up. Soil scientists have been measuring the decay rates to better predict the ramifications of a warmer world. Such research demands a universal scale against which they can compare differing sites and situations. They were using handmade tiny bags and filling them with dead plant material to measure decomposition. This was tedious and difficult to be exactly universal. During a tea break some Ecologists noted the similarity of the standard tetrahedron tea bag. They could replace their handmade bags.

The rate of decay is two staged. First the organic microbes consumed the easily degraded organic material. The remaining material is more resistant and takes longer to break down. Two types of bag were chosen – Redbush (woody) and Green (leafy). The exhuming and weighing of the two types of bags, 2-3 months after internment, reveals the phase and extent of decay. The Tea Bag Index was born. Last year the first global comparative study of soil litter decomposition was published. Being able to make such global comparisons is a huge leap forward for soil scientists. Ongoing experiments in the Arctic using the humble tea bag are leading to better modelling of the effects of Climate Change on the huge amounts of carbon in the tundra soil.


