New regulations for short-term rentals - NSW Government

Short-term holiday rentals have been a topic for discussion in the Berry community over some time. Those living near a short-term rental property sometimes refer to them as "Party Houses" and if they are not managed well can be confronting.

Here is a copy of the State Governments media release on a piece of legislation just passed that seeks to address this issue.

"MEDIA RELEASE:

New Regulations for short-term rentals 29 October 2020

A mandatory Code of Conduct will be introduced for short-term rentals in NSW to protect the rights of hosts, guests and neighbours.

Short-term rentals in NSW are increasing in popularity, with the industry generating over \$30 billion each year.

From 18 December 2020, a new Code of Conduct will impose obligations and clear guidance for booking platforms, hosts, letting agents and guests.

A key feature of the Code of Conduct will be the introduction of an exclusion register to help ban disruptive house guests or hosts. Under the exclusion register, strict new penalties will be in place for anyone

Minister for Better Regulation and Innovation Kevin Anderson said the new set of rules will protect the rights for everyone, which put mutual respect front and centre.

misbehaving in short-term rentals.

"The standards are enforceable, with powers available to NSW Fair Trading Commissioner to take disciplinary action, including penalties and exclusion from the industry for repeat offenders," Mr Anderson said.

Broughton Vale / Berry Rural Fire Brigade



Everyone loves a new fire truck and Broughton Vale/Berry have taken delivery of a replacement category 9 appliance (a 600 litre Landdcruiser mounted unit). While our preference is for burning to be undertaken out of the fire danger period, it's been a windy, wet winter. During September/October over 60 burn permits were issued. We also welcomed four new volunteer members who have commenced their basic training. Two members qualified as village fire fighters and two have commenced their Crew Leader qualifications. BTW – our regular TV critic highly recommends the ABC series 'Big Weather'. If you've missed the first episodes, catch up on iView, AND, Apparently Santa will be coming to Berry on Christmas Eve. Keep a look out for the big red fire truck driving around town on Thursday evening.

WHAT TYPE AND SIZE OF TANK SHOULD I GET?

Concrete or steel tanks are suitable. Poly tanks are not suitable, because they melt.


Rural residential properties less than 1 hectare = 10,000 litres Larger rural properties more than 1 hectare = 20,000 litres

WHAT TYPES OF FITTINGS?

On the tank outlet, fit a 65mm (or 38mm) Storz coupling (see picture). These couplings enable fire appliances to connect directly to your tank.

Rotary's Polio Experience Proves Invaluable

In August, after four years with no cases, the African region was certified free of wild poliovirus. Now only two countries, Pakistan and Afghanistan, still have circulation of wild poliovirus. When COVID-19 emerged, the polio eradication infrastructure proved invaluable to helping respond to the pandemic. Polio workers became involved in contact tracing, testing, and educating communities about hand washing and other ways to reduce exposure to COVID-19. No doubt, once a COVID vaccine is available, the polio teams will become even more valuable.



NEW PLAN FOR ILLAWARRA AND SHOALHAVEN





"NEW PLAN FOR ILLAWARRA AND SHOALHAVEN

Monday, 2 November 2020

"A new vision that protects the stunning, natural scenery of the Illawarra Shoalhaven hinterland while focusing homes and jobs in existing centres will promote prosperity for the region over the next 20 years.

"The updated draft Illawarra Shoalhaven Regional Plan 2041 includes a strategy for Metro Wollongong Health Precinct, a hydrogen hub at Port Kembla and earmarks West Lake, Nowra-Bomaderry, Bombo Quarry and existing centres for 30,000 new homes and more than 45,000 new jobs.

"A green grid connecting parks, open spaces and bushland with cycleways and pedestrian pathways will make the region's natural beauty more accessible to residents and visitors. "Minister for Planning and Public Spaces Rob Stokes called for the community to have their say on the plan which contains 30 objectives to guide land use over the next two decades.

"The Illawarra Shoalhaven region has transformed from its industrial and steel-making base into an innovative service, creative and knowledge-based economy," Mr Stokes said.

"This plan is about building on that transformation while preserving the unique rural coastal character which has made the region such an attractive place for people to live, visit and do business.

This is the last opportunity to have your say, make your submission on this important document.



Albion Park Bypass

Gareth Ward has announced that the Albion Park Rail Bypass is due to open mid next year and that the \$630 million project was tracking more than 12 months ahead of schedule. The next milestone on the project is the third East West Link traffic switch, currently scheduled for the end of this month.

The 10 kilometre bypass between Yallah and Oak Flats will complete the 'missing link' for a high standard road between Sydney and Bomaderry. Two of the project's 13 bridges are now open to traffic, with crews pushing on with work on other bridges as well as utility relocations and major earth and road work.

Planning Proposal

Rezoning south of Hitchcocks Lane

The following amendments are proposed to Shoalhaven LEP 2014:

- Rezone the subject land from RU1 Primary Production to R2 Low Density Residential. A low-density residential zone is considered appropriate for the location on the urban edge of Berry.
- The majority of the land is proposed to have a minimum allowable lot size of 500 m2, consistent with the general minimum allowable lot size in Berry.
- A row of larger lots is proposed along the southern boundary and perimeter road, with this area having a minimum lot size 700 m2.
- One quarter of the subject land area is proposed to have a minimum lot size of 350 m2, allowing for smaller lots sizes to be considered to provide greater housing choice

Proposed changes to Shoalhaven DCP 2014, draft Chapter N3 Berry Residential Subdivision that will guide the design of any future subdivision and housing development include landscaping, verges and tree planting, road design and shared paths and maximum floor area ratios.

All submissions must be received by **Friday 8 January 2021.**

Planning Proposal -10 Victoria Street, 'Arbour Retirement Village'

Council advise that the Proposal will be on public exhibition until Friday 4 December. The PP, an Explanatory Statement and supporting documentation are available for viewing on Council's website.

The PP seeks to amend the Shoalhaven LEP to rezone an area of approximately 7,665 m2 at the north-eastern corner of Lot 6 DP 1204186 (10 Victoria Street) Berry, to allow residential use of the land for seniors housing. The Arbour Retirement Village is centrally located on the property.

The following amendments to the Shoalhaven LEP 2014 are proposed:

- Rezone the subject land from RU1 Primary Production to R2 - Low Density Residential (Fig 6 in PP)
- 2. Amend the minimum lot size map to reduce the minimum lot size from 40 ha to 500 m2 (Fig 7 in PP)
- 3. Reduce the height of buildings from 11m to 8.5m

Proposed Upgrade to Queen Street in Berry - UPDATE

There have been further developments since the Friends (of the Berry Town Crier) Newsletter (13-10-2020) and the November Town Crier was published following our publication of the issue being raised by the Berry Chamber of Commerce and Industry and their letter.

Council have advised that the Queen Street traffic facility project has been delayed and is now scheduled to commence in February 2021.

This now affords our community an opportunity to make a submission to Council on this project.

Remember, there is a hard copy of the 3 maps in the Berry Community Notice Board outside the pharmacy that the Chamber of Commerce arranged and there is a link to the three A3 plans below.

There have been a number of points and concerns raised from our community already including:

Best access to parking places (both current and proposed – eg Boongaree;

proposed raised road crossings are not necessary or appropriate for noise and other reasons;

why change the road now, can we not wait until it settles in then make those decisions; prefer that the funds were expended on a beautification of Queen Street.

From our enquiries of Council, it appears that there have not been any traffic studies and or projections of how this treatment will affect traffic flows in surrounding streets leading up to this project. Council inform us "that the Queen Street Traffic Facility Project is funded by NSW Government, in

partnership with Council, as part of the State Black Spot Program. This program provides engineering treatments to address locations where there are clusters of crashes. The NSW Road Safety Strategy 2012-2021 aims to make NSW roads safer and reduce the risk, incidence and severity of all crashes on the road network.

"In the five-year period between July 2012 and June 2017, when this project was nominated, there were five crashes along Queen Street in the shopping precinct. The crash data from Roads and Maritime Services justifies the need for the proposed treatment. Since July 2017 to date there has been an additional three accidents with two of these being serious to moderate injuries."

Road Safety is very important, we know.

Please make your views known, in support or not, with your ideas and views – if you hold a view then make a submission.

Corridor Sports

Since opening in 1899, the Berry Experimental Farm, has changed purpose many times, and in the process, acted as a barometer of contemporary values and issues. Its establishment reflected Alexander Hay's interest in developing better dairying practice across the, soon to be sold, Berry Estate lands. In 1934 it became a Child Welfare training farm for boys. Consistent with social values at the time, treatment was often harsh and un-empathetic. In 1977 it was re-opened as a holiday home for the underprivileged, and finally become the Sport and Recreation Centre in 1991.

The property originally supported tall native forests, and perhaps rainforest vegetation, which was cleared in the mid nineteenth century for pastures and agricultural fields. These supported the Berry Estate and the subsequent institution's research and training objectives.

With growing awareness of native habitats and erosion control, 660 metres of the Broughton Creek bank was revegetated in 2005 by Shoalhaven Landcare. This riparian vegetation is now 20m tall.


Since 2019, an additional 1100m of boundary plantations have been established. These will form wildlife corridors linking Broughton Creek with the Moeyan Hill forests and are part of the Berry Bushlinks Project. This is a partnership between Berry Landcare, participating landholders, and the National Parks Association of NSW, with funding from the NSW Environment Trust.

Last October, sixteen volunteers from Wollongong University planted 421 tubestock across 400m of the property boundary. Their involvement was a personal commitment to offset the carbon emissions of their modern lives.

Through partnership and a diverse range of volunteers, the Centre now shows a way forward in which agriculture can coexist with a sustainable biosphere.

BERRY PIONEERS

Did you know that Berry has a heritage-listed cemetery? Located off Kangaroo Valley Road on the north-western edge of the town, this cemetery holds the remains of our pioneering families. Some of the names you may recognise – Boyds, Croziers, Agars, Strongs – are some of the early dairying families, many of whom came from Ireland. The land for the old cemetery was donated by David Berry in 1865, and the oldest headstone is that of Thomas Mawle in 1866. The cemetery was divided into four areas, with "roads" separating the Methodist, Presbyterian, Roman Catholic and Church of England sections. The old section is clearly demarked, as the graves are oriented east-west in the Christian Teutonic tradition, whereas the newer graves are aligned with the lot boundary which fronts the roadway.

Not all of the graves have headstones. Not all families could afford it, and some had no family here, while David Berry was known to pay for paupers' burials. Indeed, around 1900 the cemetery was said to be full, and a new cemetery was established at Harley Hill, on Beach Road. Burials resumed around 1914, following the subdivision of land which enlarged the original space available. Records of early burials do not appear to have been kept, and the earliest map dates from 1915.

The history of our Berry Cemetery is linked to the history of the dairy industry, both here and on the North Coast, and to the fascinating story of David Berry and the vast Coolangatta Estate. Unfortunately the historic old section of the cemetery is in a poor state, with large

camphor laurel and gum trees causing damage to the graves, and this is concerning as the cemetery has historical, genealogical, archaeological and scientific significance.

There appears to be support for the formation of a Friends of Berry Cemetery group. If you are a relative or are interested in joining, please contact Friends of Berry Cemetery via email friendsofberrycemetery@ yahoo.com This group will act to preserve and protect the historic pioneer section of the cemetery, and support Shoalhaven City Council in its maintenance.

COVID DECEMBER 2020



Where to start? So much is said, written and broadcast about COVID 19.

Theodore Roosevelt observed a century ago "Nobody cares how much you know, until they know how much you care "So we should keep this light.

Currently one fact stands tall: spatial distancing, masks and tracing: WORKS.

This is the central plank of public health messages. Please do not doubt COVID is a significant health risk, to each of our patients. COVID has been tough. This year has been tough.

Real suffering. Bushfires, storms and COVID. Every life lost counts, and every one of the patients lying sick and alone in Shoalhaven Intensive Care Unit represents deep angst.

Family and loved ones in hospitals and across borders have been held apart because of COVID restrictions.

People who measure mental health in the population will tell you there is more anxiety, depression, domestic violence than ever. We have no reason to think Berry is immune.

The experts quote a surge in demand of thirty % for Mental Health Services. Just seven% of the health budget is spent on mental health which accounts for Fourteen % of the total health burden. These figures would have to be pretty rubbery to me. Don't tell me you won't get depressed if you have a heart attack or a cancer diagnosis. Mental Health suffering is there in the shadow of every serious illness. So the big players in this sort of care, like "Headspace", are calling for more funding.

It is terrible to think there is even a turf war here, and you must ask "how much funding to big organisations helps small rural towns like

During this year, General health care utilisation has fallen, a lot: 40% less visits to the GP or Emergency, testing for all illnesses is down by 30%. That translates to later diagnosis. That is not good, you don't need more figures to know that.

Now to exciting news. No new cases, no local spread. At the surgery we have swabbing diligently: nothing. To the pathology companies and the hospital, also: nothing, nothing local, for months. Big exhale.

Now the vaccines are coming. This represents a real hope and optimism that we can bring the virus to heel. The AMA supports initiatives that improve speed and efficacy of the Therapeutics Good Administration (TGA) to approve the vaccines, but you can't cut corners and despite restrictions, we are placed to be one of the countries that can afford to step back and see which horses win the vaccine race. The speed with which medical research and government have swung into action this year has been breathtaking. How these new novel vaccines work and then how we get it to our patients, will all become clearer soon. Please know, we will be doing everything possible to get vaccines out to everyone as soon as humanly possible.

As a side note, astrologers did predict a year of upheaval, based on conjunction of Saturn and Pluto. Previous conjunctions occurred at the fall of the Roman Empire and the outbreak of World War 1. Interesting, but it's not science. Science and humanity will shine a light to a brighter 2021. Please trust the science and have faith in humanity's resilience.

BERRY SHOW 2021 ... WITH A DIFFERENCE

A lot of things in our life have had to change because of the Covid-19 pandemic. The Berry Show, our much-loved and long-running event will also be different for 2021, as it is not possible to hold it in its usual form due to current Covid-19 restrictions. When discussing the Show as a committee the consensus was: if we can put on a show (no matter how different from usual), we should put on a show.

So on 29 & 30 January 2021, the Berry Show will primarily be an agricultural, horticultural and community judging event.

We invite entries for livestock: horses, dairy cattle, beef cattle, and poultry; and entries for the Pavilion (produce, art and crafts). The Pavilion Chief Steward particularly wants to encourage our local exhibitors to take part. The full details of how to enter and the closing dates will be available on the Berry Show website from the start of December.

While we invite these entries, this event will look and feel different to our traditional Show. A lot of things will be absent, such as sideshows, animal nursery, rodeo, entertainment and fireworks. There will be limited food outlets. Socially catching-up with friends is normally a good part of coming to the Show, however, at this time please bear in mind the need to physical distance. The show will run Friday and Saturday 7am until 5pm.

We will be hosting a one day limited woodchop program with men's, ladies and junior competitions.

We will still be running a socially distanced sponsors area and will be in contact with our sponsors shortly to discuss the changes.

We expect everyone who attends this event to comply with the Covid-19 restrictions of physical distancing and hand sanitising and to understand that these measures are in place to help keep us all safe. In accordance with NSW Government guidelines we will also be requiring digital registration at the entry points to the Showground.

This event is a celebration of the rural nature of Berry and districts, albeit in a smaller way than the usual Show. The Berry Show Committee and Stewards are working hard to organise this event under difficult circumstances that have never before even been contemplated.

This will be a ticketed event and numbers are limited. Tickets will be available online. Our schedule will also only be available online later this year.

This is grass roots showing, like we haven't seen in Berry for many many decades, if ever.

We know this sounds very different to anything you or we ever imagined. Please understand we are doing this for our love of agriculture and for continuing the Berry Show tradition through any adversity. We hope the community and sponsors will understand and support us through this time.

We have restarted the regular monthly meetings at the village on the 3rd Wednesday of each month starting at 9.30 am - you are all welcome to come along and support our local group.



WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT FIRE AT BUNDANON THIS SUMMER





Have you visited Bundanon recently? Experience Bundanon's new program this summer.

Following the catastrophic climatic events of last summer, Bundanon presents *We Need to Talk about Fire,* a series of exhibitions and conversations with speakers from across the community who share Indigenous knowledge systems, stories of community action, healing initiatives and creative responses to find a way forward.

Three new exhibitions are presented at the Bundanon Homestead.

Photographer Ruth Maddison was caught in the vortex of the fires at Eden and recorded the drama of dark skies and the role of local evacuation centres. In the weeks after the fires, she was called on by friends and neighbours to document their resilience in rebuilding their homes. A series of photographs captured by Maddison during this period forms her exhibition *When No Birds Sing*.

Spark A Reaction is a new exhibition featuring posters by Wendy Murray and local workshop participants. Bundanon commissioned posters by Murray themed around the bushfires and environmental issues arising from climate change. Both Maddison and Murray's exhibitions are now on view.

Gamilaraay/Wailwan/Biripi artist r e a recently spent time at Bundanon as an Artist In Residence, developing a new body of work in relationship to the latest fires in the Shoalhaven. The result of r e a's residency is a new photographic installation titled *Imprint*, and will be on view from the first weekend in December.

In December, Bundanon will lauch a new series of commissioned films produced by celebrated film-maker Bridget Ikin and Bundanon, and hosted by Wesley Enoch AM.

The films include a series of important conversations between Wesley and community leaders and experts, including Vanessa Cavanagh (Associate Lecturer, UOW, PhD Candidate - Cultural Burning and Aboriginal Women in NSW), Professor Jason Staples (expert in dynamic bushfire behaviour), Dr. Owen Price (Environmental Risk Management of Bushfires at the University of Wollongong), and Adrian Webster and Jacob Morris (Ngundahmurra, local cultural and Firesticks practitioners). This film series will be available to stream on Bundanon's website in early December.

Visit Bundanon this summer to experience the latest exhibitions and view artworks from the collection in the original 19th century Bundanon Homestead and Arthur Boyd's studio. Wander through the English style gardens and the iconic landscape that inspired one of Australia's greatest artists, Arthur Boyd, or enjoy a bushwalk on one of the walking tracks. DECEMBER 2020



2020 started in Berry with subdued New Year's celebrations. Much of the Shoalhaven district was engulfed in bushfires that brought apocalyptic smokefilled skies, and widespread habitat and property destruction. At the beginning of February, the South Coast fires were finally extinguished, with a week of torrential rain. Then when we thought about getting back to some sort of normality, in March we were forced into pandemic lockdown, which brought great disruptions to school and work life. Many local businesses struggled, but adapted to the new conditions by offering more services online. We have seen a return of tourism to town and have been fortunate so far that we avoided any local Covid-19 outbreaks.

The end of the year is in sight and we have many reasons to celebrate; Christmas and the summer holidays, allowing family and friends to come together again to celebrate and exchange gifts. We encourage our readers to support local businesses when shopping, to choose gifts without excessive packaging, and where possible to purchase products made by companies with strong ethical supply chains. Consider buying vintage and pre-owned items; sometimes a thoughtfully sourced item is more valuable than its modern mass-produced equivalent. Gift wrapping can be sustainable and needn't be single use and straight in the bin or the recycling. Tea-towels, scarves and other fabric wraps can be used or repurposed. Becoming part of a circular economy rather than a linear one is a way to make societies' consumption more thoughtful and sustainable.

SUMMER 2020-2021

With warmer weather comes another bushfire season. Last year, Berry residents were more fortunate than some of our South Coast neighbours. If you haven't already downloaded the Fires Near Me app, it's a vital tool to keep up to date with any nearby fire threats. This summer is likely to be wetter than usual as we are in the El Niña phase of the ENSO cycle. This means possible cooler weather, and heavier rainfall than we've experienced lately. While this means it is a great time to install a rainwater tank (with rebates possible from Shoalhaven Council), it's also a good reason to check gutters and drains to make sure they are free of debris. Along with the Fires Near Me app, the Floods Near Me app is free to download.

With extreme weather it's important to be able to access information and contact authorities. A valuable resource is the ABC emergency service. Access the web page abc.net.au/news/emergency/about/ to find tips to be well prepared. In the case of a power outage a battery-operated radio allows you to keep up to date with current warnings. Check your first aid kit and replace any out of date or missing items, and make a plan with family members about what to do in an emergency situation.

If you are in the position to do so, please consider donating to the local Fire Brigade; the NSW Rural Fire Service web site makes donating easy. Other organizations you may consider are Landcare Australia and NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service.

Sustainability and Takeaway Coffee

The Berry Alliance has been working hard toward a Sustainable Berry over many years and that has included distributing cloth bags and then cooler bags to reduce the impact of single use plastic bags. We also distributed free Keep Cups and encouraged the use of your own reusable cups for takeaways to save on disposal, single use coffee cups. We are continuing that aim still.

The take up and use of Keep Cup style reusable coffee cups was going well with a steady increase and then earlier this year because of the Corona 19 Virus pandemic their use was set right back when coffee shops were understandably hesitant to use them.

Happily, there is now a resurgence of their use and our environment will continue to benefit.

Please always provide a clean reusable cup when you order.

BROUGHTON VALE / BERRY RURAL FIRE BRIGADE BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD AND FIRE PERMITS

A Fire Permit is required for burning activities during the Bush Fire Danger Period in Rural Fire districts and at all times in Fire and Rescue districts around the state. Fire Permits help ensure fire is used safely and minimise the danger to you, your property and the community.

- Just because it's the Bush Fire Danger Period doesn't mean you can't use fire but there are restrictions to ensure fire is used safely.
- Getting a permit is free and easy. Contact your local Fire Control Centre or for FRNSW fire permits go to the FRNSW website.
- There are heavy penalties if you don't follow restrictions or rules.

The key things to remember:

You need a fire permit if it's the Bush Fire Danger Period.

At least 24 hours before burning, you must notify your local Shoalhaven RFS Fire Control Centre (4424 4424) of your intention to burn.

You must also notify any adjoining neighbours (including those separated by a road, lane or waterway) at least 24 hours before burning.

You should always check that there is no Total Fire Ban.

Heavy penalties apply if you don't follow restrictions or rules.

Public Exhibition of Planning Proposal for Hitchcocks Lane Berry and a Draft Development Control Plan (DCP)

(to support the proposed LEP changes and promote high quality design outcomes.)

Council have recently announced this proposal which is an important proposal that will no doubt create a lot of debate and submissions. The good news is that the proposals are now online and submissions open and do not close until 8 January 2021.

From Council 27-10-2020:

"Public Exhibition

Hitchcocks Lane Berry Residential Investigation Area Planning Proposal (PP029) to Amend Shoalhaven Local

Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014 to Allow Residential Development

"I wish to advise that a Planning Proposal (PP029) to rezone land south of Hitchcocks Lane in Berry will be publicly exhibited from Wednesday 28 October 2020 to Friday 8 January 2021 (inclusive).

"The proposal seeks to facilitate residential development on the subject land (currently zoned for rural purposes) and proposes draft planning controls for future development in the area.

"The Planning Proposal (PP029) and supporting information will be available to review on Council's website: https://getinvolved. shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/ from Wednesday 28 October 2020

"About the proposal

"PP029 relates to land south of Hitchcocks Lane in Berry, legally described as Part Lots 762 and 763 DP 1224932 and also includes part of the Hitchcocks Lane road reserve as shown on the subject land map on the following page.

"The PP seeks to amend the Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014 by:

- Rezoning the subject land from the RU1 Primary Production zone to the R2 Low Density Residential zone (to allow the land to be developed for additional residential development)
- Changing the minimum lot size from 40 ha to a mix of 700 m2, 500 m2 and 350 m2 (to allow the land to be subdivided into a mix of lot sizes - please refer to the proposed Minimum Lot Size Map in the PP029 documentation for more information)
- Reducing the building height limit from 11 m to 8.5 m.

"Should these provisions in the LEP be amended, further approval processes will then be necessary to actually subdivide the land and construct housing.

"A draft revised Development Control Plan (DCP) Chapter N3 (Berry Residential Subdivision) has been prepared to support the proposed changes to the LEP and forms part of the exhibition package.

The revised draft DCP chapter includes more site-specific planning controls for the Hitchcocks Lane Residential Investigation Area and updates the Masterplan for certain land west of the Princes Highway at Berry. The draft DCP Chapter can also be viewed on Council's website at: https://getinvolved.shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/.

Some issues that might need information or consideration include:

The Rezoning proposal has already progressed through the "Gateway" process in the NSW State Government and this Planning Proposal seeks submissions on some of the detail, such as Lot sizes, landscaping etc.

Some issues that have already been raised in the community include: traffic – overuse of Huntingdale Park Road; should have an alternative road access to Schofields Lane and the highway; Lot sizes and controls (see DCP changes as they attempt to address this and other issues of dual occupancy, multiple dwellings etc.)

Please note that the DCP that is also there for submissions does attempt to address a lot of these issues. Council are receptive to ideas and submissions from the community to try to ensure that the character or style of the area is protected.



PLANT PROPAGATION NURSERY

LOCAL PLANTS with GRASS-LIKE APPEARANCE

Most of us are familiar with Lomandra and Dianella species that appear in many landscaping situations in private gardens as well as in our parks and roundabouts in Berry.

They are hardy and reliable plants and the long leaves provide habitat for small animals and insects and are a food source for birds and butterflies.

The roots of these plants when established have the capacity to stabilize banks of creeks or sloping sites and reduce the space for weeds to grow.

Some other local plants with a graceful and delicate habit to consider for your garden include:-.

- **Grass flag** (*Libertia paniculata*), is a small plant with iris like flowers along the stem in spring time. It grows well in a shady moist environment. Seeds are slow to germinate.
- Vanilla lily (Arthropodium milleflorum)

 has many pretty white flowers hanging from the stalk. In spite of the delicate appearance, Vanilla lily is tough. The whole plant is dormant in winter returning each spring from the underground tuber.
- Stout bamboo grass (Austrostipa ramosissima) is a non-invasive feathery grass growing in a clump to about 1.5metres. It grows in full sun or light shade.
- **Crinum** (*Crinum* paniculatum) is a larger plant with an architectural appearance. Crinums can tolerate a range of conditions from full sun to shade. The large white flower spikes are lightly perfumed, and appear from November to March.

These plants are easy to grow either directly in the garden or planted in pots in a courtyard space.


Limited stocks of these plants are available at the nursery.

Grass flag (Libertia paniculata)







What are the key indicators of a healthy property market, and how do they impact you?

While the Spring season is renowned as the strongest period for property, 2020 has certainly disrupted the most tried & true assumptions. Thankfully, the real estate market is showing encouraging signs of recovery across the nation which should bolster the confidence of property owners, buyers, and investors alike. Here is a snapshot of key market indicators for the month of October, that signal a positive uplift:

House values increase - The national home value index posted a 0.4% rise in October, moving back into positive month-on-month growth for the first time in six months. This trend was reflected across all states enjoying an increase in values, with the exception of Melbourne which saw a drop of only 0.2% - the smallest since April.

Sale rates increase - Looking to trends in the sale of properties, there has been a marked uptick in consumer confidence across Australia as the uncertainty around COVID-19's impact on the country has begun to lift, supported by Government stimulus initiatives and low interest rates.

Firstly, we have seen the increase in the number of houses listed for sale as people feel more assured to sell their most valuable asset in strengthening market conditions, and secondly the number of houses sold as people are confident in the market supporting their purchase with the support of ample government stimulus. The month of October has seen overall property sales increase by 7%, now nearly on par with the results this time last year.

Absorption Rate - The 'absorption rate' of real estate points to the level of supply and demand, and is a key marker of any healthy economy. While the number of new listings added to the Australian housing market remained low over the six months from March, there was a marked uptick of 25.2% in the month of October yet the total number of listings grew by less than 1%. This suggests that buyer demand exceeds the supply levels, given the stable number of total listings compared to the surge in new listings. THE HAZELBERRY PARKLANDS -BERRY SHOWGROUND

Berry Showground is part of Alexander Berry's original land grant. When David Berry inherited the estate he set aside this area for public use and his cousin, Sir John Hay, at his own expense, had a showground placed on the site, buildings erected and trees planted. Many of those trees still stand today.

The first Show was held in 1884 and except for the war years, has been held annually ever since, with important dignitaries attending over the years, including NSW Governors.

In February 1888 the Broughton Creek Register reported the 5th Broughton Creek (Berry) Agricultural and Horticultural Exhibition, attended by David Berry, as 'the most extensive stock exhibition yet held here, if not indeed on the South Coast'. Its animal enclosures were reported to be'the best designed...at any show in the Colony.' The Grandstand, originally near the Agricul-tural Hall on the corner of Victoria and Albany Streets, was lowered in 1935 and moved further south. In 1988 it was moved to its cur-rent position and rebuilt in its original style.

The Agricultural Hall, built by Isley and Sons during 1887 -1888, saw its first Show of Flowers, Poultry, Caged Birds, Dogs and Household Manufactures in November 1888. Later that year Sir Henry Parkes made a visit to Berry and attended a luncheon there.

On the corner of Alexandra and Victoria Streets is a memorial erected in 1915 to Sir John Hay and the first children's playground there was paid for by Lady Hay.

The nearby rotunda was originally situated in the centre of the Show Ring for judges.

When Sir John Hay died, the Government and the Berry Council purchased the land between them for £ 2,500 (approx \$327,000 today) and the Certificate of Title was made out to the Minister of Lands. It was dedicated as a public park in 1913 with the Berry Council as Trustee and named Hazelberry Park. Then in 1958, the Shoalhaven Shire Council became Trustee, local representatives appointed to administer the area on their behalf and the area reserved for public recreation.

Today this Showground with its yearly Show, monthly and weekly markets and many sporting and community gatherings, continues in its special place in the Berry Community.

BERRY REMEMBRANCE DAY COMMEMORATION 2020

The Berry RSL Sub-Branch Remembrance Day Commemoration Service was observed at the Cenotaph on Wednesday 11 November, and was again well attended by the Berry community including again a Sydney group of veteran motorcycle enthusiasts, in beautiful weather.

Clr John Wells as MC, introduced Mr. Clyde Poulton representing Ray Strong President of the sub-Branch to deliver the opening address that on this day 102 years ago WWI had finally concluded; the focus of the address was the returning AIF veterans efforts in rebuilding of Australia despite their physical and mental scars

Clr Wells and Rev Joel Noonan of the Berry Community Church, led the service in

Berry School School Captains Misses Kayla Smith, Jemima Orme, Masters Liam Chaplin, and Will Page recited the poem "Poppies for Remembrance".

Berry RSL Hon.Sec. Stuart Christmas read the tribute CAPT Eric Wren who survived the War. however he was wounded 3 times in what were hallmark battles in Australia's military history.

He was part of the initial landing at Gallipoli on 25th April 1915, being wounded the next day, on return to action he was part of the Lone Pine action during the August Offensive on the Peninsula. On arrival at the Western Front he was field promoted to Captain, where he was again wounded at Pozieres in July 1916, wounded again on the stretcher necessitating amputation of his right arm. On his return to Australia CAPT Wren was active with the welfare of the WWI veterans especially the Limbless Soldiers Association. He passed away in 1941 aged 52.

Commander David Hutchinson of HMAS Albatross delivered the Commemoration Address.

The Ode was recited, followed by the "Sounding of The Last Post", the time being 11.00 am one minutes silence was observed for the cessation of hostilities of WWI followed by "The Rouse".

Wreaths were laid by the Sub-Branch, and local community organisations, and at completion, Piper John Morrison played "The

MC Clr John Wells recorded the RSL Sub-Branch's' appreciation for the efforts of those whose assistance had been invaluable the Commemoration Service: RAN HMAS Albatross for providing the Cenotaph Catafalque Guard, Shoalhaven City Council, Turfco for their continued support, the Women's Auxiliary for their loval and sustained work throughout this year, Berry Rotary for placing of chairs and Piper John Morrison. Particular thanks is given to the Berry Community Activities Centre whose donation greatly assisted in the purchase of the new canopies that will be used for all future Commemoration services.

The service then concluded with the Australian National Anthem.
