### CYCLING EVENT THROUGH BERRY L'ETAPE AUSTRALIA -ON SATURDAY 20TH MARCH 2021



As a service to our readers and our community the Berry Town Crier is providing the latest information that we have been able to glean.

We have researched various avenues for information and found that:

- 1. This event was agreed to and promoted by Events NSW (NSW State Government) who then went to each of the Councils involved.
- 2. We understand that the NSW State Government (RMS) in conjunction with L'Etape Australia designed the traffic management plans required that included all the controls and maps and these then went to each Traffic Committee in each of the three Council areas.
- 3. In the Shoalhaven, the Shoalhaven Traffic Committee passed the plans (which included the maps, road closures and times) at their meeting on 10-11-2020. The Traffic Committee then recommended them to Council.
- 4. The Traffic Committee Report was then placed on the Agenda and presented at the Ordinary Council Meeting of Council held on 24-11-2020 where the recommendation was Passed by the Councillors.

Links for Maps of the route, road closures and times have recently been approved (see above) and published and have now been announced and uploaded. There were also additional maps provided that L'Etape stated were interactive and easier to follow. (17-2-2021)

#### We have extracted the following from the L'Etape Australia web site:

"The 5th edition of L'Étape Australia will use **181km of roads** through Kiama, the Shoalhaven and the Southern Highlands. We have worked in collaboration with the State Authorities and the Local Councils to gather as much **local knowledge** as possible and limit the impact of the event on the local traffic. A comprehensive Traffic Management Plan (TMP) was developed, **submitted to the State Authorities and the Local Traffic Committees**. When the Traffic Management Plan was endorsed by these bodies, it was then submitted to the vote of the councillors in each council and was subsequently approved.

"You will find below an overview of the road closures in place on **Saturday 20 March 2021** as well as their timings. More detailed maps will be regularly uploaded on this page to provide residents and business owners of each area with information that are specific to them.

#### "Please note the timings advertised on these maps start when the first sign is dropped on the road and end when the last sign is picked-up (and the road is fully re-opened).

"Please also note each map can be downloaded via the button at the bottom of the page. "If you have any question regarding the road closures, please send us an email at **info@ letapeaustralia.com** and we will come back to you shortly."

The following is from their Facebook site on 17-2-2021 "Since we released the local area road closure maps, we have received feedback mentioning these maps are not easy to use. We have therefore been working with Transport for NSW to developed a **digital map** and make the road closure easier to understand. This map can be found on the Community page of our website (https://letapeaustralia.com/community/).

When possible and safe to do so, we will also amend our plans to accommodate local residents and business owners movements on Saturday 20 March 2021. When approved, these amendments will be reflected on the maps available online."

#### L'Étape Australia by Tour de France states:

"The link to access all of the road closure maps is here: https://letapeaustralia.com/ community. Some of the areas throughout the course will have local access managed by traffic controllers however if you have any specific enquiries regarding access you are best to email them to info@letapeaustralia.com for a detailed discussion around your enquiry."



#### BERRY UNITING CHURCH RALLY TO "SOUND THE ALARM" FOR THE CLIMATE AS PART OF GLOBAL DAY OF ACTION

Local people of faith will be part of a global multi faith event on Wednesday 11th March bringing attention to a global multi faith statement from senior faith leaders to politicians telling them they must take serious action on the climate now.

They will do this by singing, praying and ringing the bells at Berry Uniting Church.

This is part of a global day of action on March 11 called **"Sacred People Sacred Earth"** when places of worship all around the world will sound the climate alarm.

Each place of worship will choose its own way to do this: ringing its bells, sounding a note on the shofar, calling the Azan, chanting and meditating. Every place of worship on Earth is invited to join in.

### THE PULMAN STREET STORE AND COTTAGE HOSPITAL

At the northern entrance to Berry, on the corner of Pulman Street and the old Highway, a building has recently undergone major renovation work. This was James Wilson's original store, built in partnership with James Stewart in 1861 and which later became the Cottage Hospital. It is part of the Pulman Street Heritage Precinct – the original site of the town of Berry.

David Berry had planned for a hospital for the inhabitants of Broughton Creek (Berry) and while the David Berry Hospital was being built, a temporary hospital, known as the Cottage Hospital, was set up in 1894 in James Wilson's then disused Pulman Street store.





It included a separate men's and ladies ward, a surgery, dining room,

Matron's quarters, bathrooms and outhouses. A local newspaper reported on the modern facility...'bathrooms are provided with both hot and cold water that can be turned off at leisure. A feature.....is the plumbing machinery erected for the purpose of drawing water for heating and gardening purposes from Broughton Mill Creek.' This Cottage Hospital operated till 1909, when it became a private residence.

The restoration process has been an interesting journey for the owners, both in complying with the requirements of Shoalhaven City Council Heritage Division and in employing a specialised Heritage architect and builder.

The original shingles on the roof have been covered and protected and paint colours were chosen from scrapings of the original paint work. A small piece of the original lattice work from the hospital's verandah was discovered, enabling replica pieces to be built. Similarly, some of the floorboards have been replaced by the wider original ones of that era, pieces of which were found under the floor. The area clear of the lattice on the north side is due to an original large front window from the early Wilson's store being revealed and restored.

Some old bottles and other articles found during the restoration will be displayed in the restored premises which opened on 1 February 2021 as Cottage Medical on Pulman.

On the 1st of February this year Daniel & Leila Abdallah launched the nationwide I4give day. It was their way to mark the tragic death of 4 members of their family – their 3



children Sienna, Antony and Angelina, and their niece Veronique. Instead of a day of bitterness they want to spread a message that brings healing and peace. It is a message of forgiveness.

Daniel and Leila spoke of their four angels: "This day is for them. Forgiveness is the greatest gift you can give yourself and others. It allows you to live peacefully and to heal. We still feel pain and sorrow every day, but forgiveness has helped to get rid of the anger and bitterness. It's helped us get through each day and make sure we are there for our other children,"


I heard both Daniel and Leila speak, and one year from their tragic loss and it was evident that the rawness of the emotion is still there. Maybe it always will be. I can't imagine being in their shoes. I can't imagine the kind of courage it takes to not just speak of forgiveness but to offer it to the one whose actions led to this loss. They make it clear, forgiveness doesn't ignore the past, or the need for justice for those who hurt us. But it offers a way forward – a gift both to the perpetrator and yourself.

Our Prime Minister, Scott Morrison spoke movingly at the launch of this day: "To see someone not only say these words but live them, even in the midst of continued pain and grief, leaves me in awe. To hear from Danny and Leila the words of faith and forgiveness, well, that was breath-taking. You chose not to hate but to love. You chose to be a light in darkness. You chose grace. You chose justice not vengeance."

Daniel and Leila shared that it was their faith in Jesus that has helped them most, quoting Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you"

There is no easy road here, and no shortcuts. But if you'd like to explore how Jesus helps to find forgiveness, both for ourselves and for others please reach out.

## **BUNDANON TRUST A PREMIER ATTRACTION** FOR THE **SHOALHAVEN COAST**

Gifted to the Australian people by artists Arthur and Yvonne Boyd in 1993, Bundanon is the only national institution in regional Australia. This year, the Boyd's vision of an art museum at Bundanon will be realized. The \$33 million build, supported by the Australian and New South Wales governments, will house Bundanon's \$43 million art collection. An annual exhibition program will be on offer from the end of this year when the Art Museum opens to the public.

The contemporary Art Museum embedded in the landscape is at the heart of the new plan for Bundanon. From the Art Museum, The Bridge, housing a creative learning centre, and accommodation, spans 160 metres, the size of more than three Olympic swimming pools. A café will also be on site.

Bundanon Chief Executive Officer Deborah Ely comments that Bundanon is "recognised as an incubator for contemporary art in Australia through its extensive, multi-disciplinary, artist in residence program, and as a platform for research into art and science collaborations, environmental innovation, and children's creative education. With the opening of the new Art Museum, Bundanon will be a not-to-be missed immersive experience, confounding expectations."

During the construction period, the historic 19th century Homestead continues to be open to visitors every Sunday. Visit Arthur Boyd's Studio, conserved in the state that Arthur last left it in. ### Shoalhaven Education Fund thanks its Berry supporters

Many Berry locals will be familiar with the second hand bookstalls that pop up regularly in Broughton Court, outside the post office, and in the Uniting Church Hall, but do you know what the funds raised are used for? The Shoalhaven Education Fund, which runs the bookstalls, was founded in 2012 by a volunteer committee including the owner of the Berry Post Office, Linda Marquis, and since then has raised over \$330,000 and awarded it to 200 young people to help with their costs of post school studies at University or TAFE, vocational studies, apprenticeships and entry level employment. Some of these young people have come from Berry and surrounds, and many of them stay in, or return to, the Shoalhaven after their studies and are now working locally, including as nurses, teachers, vets, mechanics, chefs and social workers. Others have gone on to stellar careers in the performing arts, academia and business. While they don't receive cash, recipients can be reimbursed for items they purchase, or ask the SEF to purchase the items for them. The SEF will pay for anything that assists their studies or work, with examples including textbooks, computers, car and fuel costs, rent, work-boots and tools, accommodation for practical training, and many others.

At our annual awards ceremony on Monday 8th February we awarded over \$70,000 to 31 recipients, and thanked all of our donors. As a volunteer committee, we are entirely reliant on community donations, and are particularly grateful for the significant and ongoing support from the Berry community, including the Zonta Club of Berry, Berry CWA, Berry Garden Club, the Arbor Bridge Club, Berry Uniting Church, the Berry Alliance and many individual Berry residents. Our committee and volunteer group this year has included Berry locals Sophie Ray, Anne Weinert, Ruth Hartman, Perrie Croshaw, Helen Buchanan, Ann Walder, and Penny Joye, plus many others from other parts of the Shoalhaven. 

### Tellurian Ravers

Berry district residents have recently endured the worst party-season noise for many years. Even day-time noise has been recorded peaking 95 decibels, with many reports of loud love-making extending throughout the night. Not air B&B, wedding parties, or boozy bogans ignoring bylaws - these are local residents.

2020-21 has been a super-season for our cicadas (*Cicadoidea*). A feature of their life-cycle is synchronised emergence over a single season. Typically numbers will peak in intervals between three to seven years. Triggers are poorly understood, however the recent drought, regrowth after wildfire, and abundant winter and summer rainfall are probable causes this season.

With over 700 species, Australia has the greatest diversity of cicadas in the world. Unlike the bland character of most zoological names, Australia's common cicada names are a tongue-in cheek celebration of our culture and generations of childhood classification. Some memorable names include: Floury bakers, Blue moons, Yellow mondays, Whisky drinkers, Pissers and Masked devils.

Australian cicada nymphs typically spend about six or seven years underground and emerge to an adult life of only a few weeks. The purpose of the adult male is to find a mate (and is the only gender to sing), and for the female to mate and lay its eggs, which it does in plant stems. Both genders die after mating. Once hatched, the nymphs fall and burrow into the ground, and the cycle repeats.

The collective mass chorus (a 'shrill'), is thought to be a strategy designed to confuse predators and maximise mating opportunities.

Although adult lives are short, the season's extended chorus is due to the emergence of different species at different times. In our local district, Green grocers are heard during October and November, and are subsequently replaced by Black princes, Double drummers, Red eyes and Razor

Abandoned exoskeletons. After years underground - time to break open your shell and party.

#### **FAST FASHION**

According to WWF it can take up to 20,000 litres of water to produce enough cotton to make a single t-shirt and pair of jeans. The fashion industry is enormously damaging to the earth's environment, and we know fashion is unsustainable. Shop wisely and support companies that have transparency about their supply chains. Visit goodonyou.eco for further information and some valuable tips.

#### **CLEAN OUTS**

Getting rid of excess items at this time of year is on the top of everyone else's list too, so ring to check with your preferred charity shop that they're accepting donations. Remember that op shops shouldn't have to bear the cost of disposing of unsaleable junk, so be thoughtful and responsible about what you pass on. Most op shops won't take electrical items. If you can't give them away they shouldn't go into landfill. The local Berry Waste Depot will take them for recycling.

#### THE BERRY WASTE DEPOT

After extended opening hours over the summer holiday break, from 1 February the depot reverts back to normal opening: Friday to Monday from 8.00 am to 4.00 pm. The buyback center is open only on Saturday and Sunday from 8.00 am to 12.00 pm. As ever, the depot is closed on public holidays. Don't forget to use your Council vouchers for free drop offs of household and green waste. The depot continues to provide free garden mulch, subject to availability. Mulching improves soil, cuts down on weed growth and helps soil retain moisture.

Don't forget you can dispose of the following household items for free: • Car and household batteries

- E-waste
- Fluro tubes and light globes
- Gas bottles

- Smoke detectors
- Motor oils (up to 20L)
- Other oils (up to 20L)
- Oil- or water-based paints (up to 20L)
- Fire extinguishers
- Clean polystyrene sheets or boxes (Note: polystyrene used for food containers has to go into landfill, in your red bin)
- Scrap metal
- Timber
- Whitegoods (a fee for refrigerant removal may apply)

#### **YELLOW BINS**

- Not sure about the label on your hard plastics? Before you bin it, visit recyclingnearyou.com.au/arl
- Collect clean aluminium foil to the size of a tennis ball size before recycling. Small items can fall off conveyor belts or block machinery.
- Plastic lids and small metal lids (e.g. beer caps) have to go in the red bin.
- Soft plastics can be recycled at supermarkets. Visit redcycle.net.au for more information.
- Polystyrene should never go in the recycling bin. See above for more information.
- Only glass packaging for food goes in the yellow bin, any other glass goes in the red bin.

#### BERRY ALLIANCE AND TOWN CRIER FROM COUNCIL

### BROUGHTON VALE / BERRY RURAL FIRE BRIGADE BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD AND FIRE PERMITS

A Fire Permit is required for burning activities during the Bush Fire Danger Period in Rural Fire districts and at all times in Fire and Rescue districts around the state. Fire Permits help ensure fire is used safely and minimise the danger to you, your property and the community.

- Just because it's the Bush Fire Danger Period doesn't mean you can't use fire but there are restrictions to ensure fire is used safely.
- Getting a permit is free and easy. Contact your local Fire Control Centre or for FRNSW fire permits go to the FRNSW website.
- There are heavy penalties if you don't follow restrictions or rules.

#### The key things to remember:

You need a fire permit if it's the Bush Fire Danger Period.

At least 24 hours before burning, you must notify your local Shoalhaven RFS Fire Control Centre (4424 4424) of your intention to burn. You must also notify any adjoining neighbours (including those separated by a road, lane or waterway) at least 24 hours before burning. You should always check that there is no Total Fire Ban.

Heavy penalties apply if you don't follow restrictions or rules.

### THE ROLES ANIMALS PLAY AT A TASTE OF PARADISE FARM

People are often amazed at the range of animals that live at A Taste of Paradise Farm Charity, which includes our domestic farm animals such as dogs, horses, cattle, goats and poultry, alongside the many native creatures that make their home there.

The Charity is committed to supporting the at-risk and disadvantaged young people who access our one-on-one farm mentoring program. The various animals at the farm enable us to work with the children to build trust and develop safe, reliable relationships, while teaching them new skills.

Some of the children who come to A Taste of Paradise Farm, don't trust people anymore as they have had their trust broken by adults, that should have been trustworthy, and don't want to be hurt again. They want to trust, but it is too hard. Our animals offer these young people a way to begin to trust again.

Our animals play a big role at A Taste of Paradise Farm. They are often the bridge between our mentors and the young people who may be experiencing complex trauma.





When the animals see the young people they rush to the fence and are excited to greet them and for a young person this may be their first experience of feeling loved or cared for.

The kids help to hatch the baby chickens, feed and care for them as the birds mature, and eventually collect, clean and package the eggs.

Seeing a newly born baby animal and holding a baby chicken or goat for the first time can bring a new sense of hope and joy into the lives of young people. Providing love and care for baby animals can sometimes break a cycle of despair in a young person who hasn't received much love in their own lives.

Part of the work that we do is to build nesting boxes for our native birds, sugar gliders and microbats. The young people participate in the construction and monitoring processes. This gives them skills and the chance to contribute to a project that improves our local bio-diversity.

All our animals make a significant contribution

to introducing joy back into the lives of many young people who may have suffered both sexual and physical abuse, or neglect and we go to great lengths to ensure the interaction with our animals is safe for both the young person and the animals

### DAVID BERRY HOSPITAL AUXILIARY NEEDS NEW MEMBERS

### WHAT HOSPITAL? David Berry Hospital

In 1889 David Berry died leaving a large estate. Included in his will was 100,000 pounds "for the purpose of erecting and endowing a hospital for non-infectious disease for the benefit particularly of inhabitants of Broughton Creek (Berry) and the district of Shoalhaven and generally of all persons to whom it might be accessible" including the Aboriginal women who had their babies there.

The hospital was opened on 18th September,1909 and named after the benefactor "David Berry". Originally, the hospital was for general treatment, including 30 beds, men's and ladies wards and operating theatre, with separate Nurses Home and staff cottage.

The midwifery ward closed in the 1960's.

The hospital was eventually transformed into a Rehabilitation Unit and in August 1988 the Nurses' Home was transformed into a Palliative Care Unit. Both units continue to perform those roles today.

David Berry Hospital and Karinya Palliative Care are part of the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District.

In the 1970's a Hospital Auxiliary was formed to provide support to the Hospital.



### The Berry Forum

Over the last 18 months, 180 DAs have been lodged in the Berry area, and the Committee has responded to 7 requests for assistance from residents (4%).

#### Multi Dwelling - 52 Parker Crescent, Huntingdale

A strata title subdivision for five detached dwellings on a half-acre lot. Council held a 'residents briefing' in February 2020 and residents challenged its interpretation of the application of SLEP Clause 4.1F (strata title subdivision). Residents also paid for legal advice, affirmed their position.

In September, councillors refused the DA and included failure to comply with SLEP CI 4.1F as a reason for refusal. The applicant has since appealed to the L&E Court and a conciliation conference will be held on 8 March.

#### 'Primitive Glamping Site' - 260 Mount Hay Road

A DA for a 'primitive camping ground and communal camp kitchen'. In response to residents' concerns, the Committee advised Council about luxury glamping DAs using the description 'primitive camping ground' and circumventing requirements for public safety and facilities for people with disabilities.

Residents have submitted around 170 objections, referring to the circumventing of planning regulations and the size and scale of the proposed 220sqm 'communal kitchen' that resembles a function centre. Council is awaiting the applicant's response to RFS requirements.

#### Tourist Resort - 275 Bong Bong Road

A DA for multiple accommodation buildings, a 257sqm 'Pavillion' for functions, a swimming pool and a designated area for future large scale tourist accommodation.

The DA is attempting to use the 'tourist & visitor accommodation' land use description to avoid restrictions on the number and size of tourist cabins and to obtain a function centre (prohibited in a RU1 zone). Council has received around 140 objections and is awaiting the applicant's response to several issues.

#### Function Centre - Mananga Homestead

A DA for a shed and silo to be used as a function centre at Mananga, which is adjacent to the Pulman Street Heritage Conservation Area. The applicants are using SLEP Clause 5.10(10), claiming to fund ongoing maintenance they require a prohibited function centre operating fifty times pa until 11pm. Residents believe it would be extremely detrimental to the peaceful residential and rural setting of the Pulman Street HCA and its historical significance.

The heritage report states, "no specific conservation work is required" and the \$197,000 pa claimed for running costs includes \$130,000 for gardening maintenance. Approx. \$250,000 pa will soon become available from tourist cabin accommodation.

Council has received around 140 objections and is assessing the application.

#### Two-storey Dwelling - 57 Victoria St

A DA for demolition of an existing dwelling (opposite the heritagelisted Courthouse and Police Residence) and construction of a very large two-storey flat roofed dwelling that is very unsympathetic to its surrounds. The site is also adjacent to the proposed Berry Showground Heritage Conservation Area.

Council has received around 70 objections and is awaiting the applicant's response to several issues.


