# No Decision yet on the application for modifications to the existing development consent for a new service station at 75-79 Queen St. Berry

This application has raised a number of concerns in our community.

There are people who are in favour of some aspects of the application – including but not only:

the service station includes a shop;

the shop would operate 24 hour a day, 7 days a week.

And there are people with major concerns - including but not only:

Shop operating 24 hours a day and 7 days a week;

the shop is proposed to be moved to the street front;

the proposed 9 metre high sign;

the general character of the design not being appropriate in Berry.

In fact there is a petition against the proposal and of course there is the

opportunity for anyone in the community to make a submission on the Application through Council DA Tracking system.

The application has yet to be determined (as at the 15th February).

Council will usually accept submissions until their final decision, and that final decision has not yet been made.

# Huntingdale Park Resident Action Group update

SF109665 – Proposed New Torrens Title Lots on Hitchcocks Lane Berry. This is for over 300 housing lots.

Urgent Action is Now Called For Please make a submission on this — see details below.

Our group has made detailed submissions and representations on the current application SF109665 – Proposed New Torrens Title Lots on Hitchcocks Lane Berry. This is for over 300 housing lots.

Issues pertaining to traffic (including traffic studies and assumptions made in some of these); Landscaping and trees – removal and retention; confusing and contradictory maps in the application; lack of clarity on a number of issues including Council's request for a number of changes.

Council responded to our joint submission resulting in Council writing to the applicant requiring and requesting a large number of further or updated reports and considerations. The response was disappointing in a number of ways and we are taking those issues up with Council as we reported previously.

One of the main issues was that our joint submission only formally counts for 1 submission and this can sometimes be confused by Councillors and staff.

Consequently, we are now calling for individuals and households to make a submission. (see below)

Councils letter to the applicant was sent to them on 18-1-2023 and to date Council have received no written response apart from an email on 14-2-2023 requesting a meeting with Council staff.

The issues raised in Council's letter to the applicant go to the overall impact of this development, in particular traffic, noise, aesthetics and more sensible design issues as well as some formal errors requiring

amending, updated reports (traffic for example) and assumptions made in the application:

A quote from that letter from Council:

"...Council has recently requested the applicant review these and respond to the issues raised. A response will be provided as soon as possible, with relevant points to be considered under planning grounds"

"... in the event of significant amendments being made to the application prior to determination, this would require formal renotification of the application in accordance with Council's Policy. However, re-notification is not required in the circumstance an amendment may have a lesser or same affect."

"....I note that this application has been called up by the Council for decision due to public interest"

Our group continue to pursue an improved application and result on this for our community.

\* now run down the list of **documents** on the second half of the page and select each by clicking **"view"** it will appear on your screen offering to open it and warning some are large files.

You can make a submission here as well by clicking: "Contact us about this application" right at the bottom of the list of correspondence / submissionS. It can be as simple as saying something like:

I have serious concerns on the layout of this development and in particular the use of Hitchcocks Lane as one of the major access points to the development. This would result in a large increase in traffic on our local roads along with increased noise and inconvenience both during the development stage (excavators, road builders, water and waste water as well as all the other services to go in even before the house building stag. This traffic and noise issue would then continue when the houses are finished and occupied.


## I submit that Council should require the applicants to:

use Schofields Lane as the main access point or one of the main access points

remove the access from Hitchcocks Lane Insist (make it conditional) that the works be staged and that the main access point off Huntingdale Park Road (at the first roundabout) be built first and then be used exclusively for all work on the site. (along with Schofields Lane if this is achievable.

Request that Council hold a resident's briefing on the development at the earliest possible date.

#### **ROADWORKS STATUS**

Council received a status update on 13 February, and we've requested a presentation for the next Forum meeting.

**Wattamolla Road** There is a total of nine moderate to major landslips requiring repair along Wattamolla Rd as result of the 2022 severe weather events. Two landslips are classified as major and are included in the Major Landslip repair package to commence March 2023. Locations are rural addresses 13 and 356. A further six landslips are classified as "moderate" and are included in a separate landslip repair work package still being developed. Locations are rural addresses 310, 366, 388, 396, 404 and 405.

**Croziers Rd Bridge, Jaspers Brush** Following completion of investigation and design work and the calling of quotations, repair work to Croziers Rd bridge has commenced and will take four weeks to complete. Work involves the construction of a rock / concrete retaining wall to stabilise creek bank against erosion that had already started to undermine the bridge.

#### Tree Management - 45 Degree Rule Amendment

Council is proposing to trial changes to the current 45 Degree Rule Exemption for tree removal in the Shoalhaven Development Control Plan for a period of 12 months. The 45 Degree Rule Exemption has been in place since 2004 and allows the removal of trees in urban areas (not Rural zones) without Council consent, subject to certain criteria.

- The proposal includes refinement of terminology and some additional criteria, including:
- The tree must pose a demonstrable (actual) risk to the building.
- The tree must be located on the same lot that the building is located on.
- The tree must not include a hollow and/or nests (for example, stick bird nests), or be on an upward slope greater than 18 degrees from the building.
- The tree must be removed by an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Level 3 arborist in accordance with the relevant Australian Standards
- The landowner is to notify all adjoining and adjacent landowners/occupants and Council of the proposed tree removal in writing, at least 5 business days before the tree removal is due to commence. The notification to Council must be signed by the arborist removing the tree/s. The 45 Degree Rule Exemption is not being completely removed from Council's Development Control Plan. The proposed changes do not alter a landowner's ability to remove a tree that is a genuine imminent risk to human life and/or substantial property.



## The Berry & District Historical Society

# Berry - once a private town

Prior to colonisation Berry was home to the Dharawal speaking people of the Yuin nation. Broughton Creek, as Berry was known until 1889, began in 1825 as a private town, part of Alexander Berry's and Edward Wollstonecraft's Coolangatta Estate. In 1873, on Alexander's death, the estate passed to his brother, David Berry.

The first settlement was on the river flats between the hill where David Berry Hospital stands, the old Princes Highway and Pulman Street. All early settlers were on ground leased from Alexander.

The people of Broughton Creek began to feel that the hill site was unsuitable for development due to flooding. So, in 1883, they asked David for suitable level ground for a new town site. David had a plan drawn up for a town also known as "Broughton Creek", virtually as Berry is today. Most businesses were situated along Prince Alfred Street, the main thoroughfare to a wharf beside the Coolangatta Road bridge. 10 acres was allocated for the Showground. The town's name was officially changed to "Berry" by the Berry Municipal District Naming Act 1890.

On David's death in 1889 (unmarried and childless) the Berry Estate, valued at £1,250,000, comprised 500 acres at North Sydney, 80,000 acres north and south of the

Shoalhaven River from Gerringong to Jervis Bay, and an estate described as "a tract of swamp and jungle".

The Coolangatta lands were left to his cousin, Sir John Hay, and remaining lands were sold to finance David's generous bequest of £100,000 to St University, Andrews Scotland for the Berry Chair of English Literature (still functioning today), £100.000 for the David Berry Hospital for non-infectious diseases and £30,000 for the Presbyterian Church.

An auction for practically the whole of the Berry township was


conducted on market day on Wednesday, 21 February 1912. A large enthusiastic crowd came from miles around to the Showground grandstand. The local Council acquired the Showground, the churches bought lands

on which they were operating, and many tenants purchased their cottages, for such sums as £110 to £280. Berry was a private town no longer.

When I was a teenager there were no phones, the internet was just starting and took all of school lunch time to load up (accompanied by the sound of dial-up), and no one knew what anyone was doing once they left school for the day. We got to turn off. In this era of social media, it's hard to switch off at all

My kids now follow tik tok influencers who I don't know, whose worldview is foreign to me, and who are producing content that is of questionable value. Sometimes, I feel really out of control and like I'm losing connection with the people who matter to me most.

No one has parented in a world this complex before. As parents of this generation, we're all newbies. We need to be kind to ourselves and look for ways to connect and support each other.

There is no denying we are currently trading in a challenging market. Vendors are being asked to show considerable patience as buyers are influenced by the media and interest rate rises. However there is a narrative I don't believe is being told that tells a much more positive picture of the current real estate market.

#### WHISTLER VS. RUSKIN – FLINGING A POT OF PAINT IN THE PUBLIC'S FACE

#### **SUSTAINABLE BERRY AUTUMN 2023**

BEES: Encouraging bees in your garden encourages biodiversity helps make veggies and fruit trees more productive. The Berry Co-op sells a seed mix of plants that have flowers bees love. You may also consider leaving part of your lawn unmown, to give dandelions a chance to flower. Bees are especially attracted to yellow and blue/purple flowers. If you've got an unwelcome swarm that needs removing call Brian from the Shoalhaven Beekeepers Association on 0408 961 051. You can find more information at their Facebook page or shoalhaven.secretary@beekeepers.asn.au if you're interested in becoming an amateur beekeeper. https://www.abc.net.au/gardening/how-to/bee-hotel/9440586 has a video tutorial on how to build your own bee motel for Australian native bees.

FROG ID: A citizen science project run by the Australian Museum in Sydney, is studying dead specimens to determine the cause of death. They believe that an amphibian chytrid fungus involved, but the research team want to determine if there are other factors involved. If you find a dead frog in your garden, email calls@frogid.net.au with any details you have on location, and any photographs. If you are able to collect the dead frog, do so wearing protective gloves, and put the frog in a ziplock bag. The body should be put in your freezer. The research team at the Museum will liaise with you to arrange collection. To get involved with the project, download the FrogID app to your phone to record frog calls; the project uses the recording to identify species and the geo-referenced location, with minimal disturbance to frogs and their habitat.

COUNCIL RECYCLING DATES: Yellow bins are emptied this month on 1, 15 and 29. Bins go out the night prior to collection.

USED RAT TESTS AND DISPOSABLE MASKS: Used test kits are considered contaminated medical waste and must be disposed of in landfill, not your yellow recycling bin.

**REKINDLE ME:** You may have seen Wade Cawley's red electric van around town. Not only does Wade's business take e-waste to be broken down into its component parts, he will also take electrical goods such as small appliances that no longer work. Wade's business helps keep items out of landfill, and recycles materials for reuse in new items. Check rekindleme.net for more information. Ewing Electrical, a small business in Nowra, repairs small appliances; it may be worth checking to see if your item can be repaired rather than getting rid of it. Their number is 4421 8412

**TERRACYCLE:** This global foundation was established to fight ocean plastics at the source, and works with communities, accepting hard-to-recycle items. Some programs are free; others offer a pre-purchase box for a fixed fee, to be filled with diverse items and returned (free of charge), for separation and recycling. Various, specific programs are run by manufactures that either accept back their packaging, or . Use your own box, fill and return with a prepaid form. The bush fire danger period commenced on the 1st September 2022.

"Anyone wishing to light a fire during the Bush Fire Danger Period must obtain a free permit in addition to notifying their local fire authority and neighbours 24 hours before lighting up. If a fire does escape, make sure you call Triple Zero (000) immediately so that emergency services can respond and minimise the damage." Commissioner Rogers said. "Now is the time to update and discuss your bush fire survival plan. Have the conversation with your family about what you will do during a fire – talk about when you'll leave, where you'll go, what you'll take and what you'll do with animals."

# Forum launches free landholder resource kit

On 5th February, Berry Landcare held a landholder Forum for the seven year old Berry Bush Links project. Run by Berry Landcare and the NSW National Parks Association, the project was funded, by the NSW Environment Trust. It supports native habitats, biodiversity, and connectivity within the Berry Wildlife Corridor. Thirty three participants heard presentations on wildlife research, conservation land management, and the importance of feral animal control across the Corridor. This was the last forum with David Rush as the project's manager, whose Trust funding has now ended. Berry Landcare congratulate David on an exceptional project achievement and thank him for his dedication and passion.

Ana Gracanin, PhD candidate University of Wollongong (UoW), provided an overview of her local research on arboreal mammals and their use of critical remnant habitats, such as along Beach Road. Her development of 'selfie' camera traps has revealed the otherwise concealed private life of gliders and possums, and their canopy battle with introduced rats.

Ryan Dallas, PhD candidate, UoW, overviewed fox population dynamics, and described changing fox cranium morphologies across the Corridor. Ryan Wall, Shoalhaven Fox Control Project (SFCP), presented an overview of the resources available from this enormously successful community volunteer team, their programs including baiting, shooting and trapping.

Evelyn Osborne, Biosecurity Officer, South East Local Land Services, outlined State Government based resources available to landholders seeking feral animal control and conservation management strategies. Kate Watson, iNaturalist educator, provided a taste of how this easy-to-use web-based application can transform amateur natural world observations into a valuable database for researchers.

# **Shoalhaven Education Fund**

On 31 January, the 2023 Shoal-haven Education Fund grants were presented by the Mayor of the Shoalhaven to the successful recipients. A total of \$120,000 in grants was awarded to 46 applicants, which was the highest amount of annual grants given in the SEF's 10 year history. This brings the total amount of grants given since 2012 to over \$650,000.

This year's recipients come from throughout the Shoalhaven, including a number from Berry and surrounds. They will be studying at University and TAFE, in a wide variety of subject areas. Some of the recipients have also received funds from the SEF in past years.



# New contemporary arts festival coming to Berry this June!

## PLANT PROPAGATION NURSERY

Thank you to the new volunteers. Your contributions are very welcome as life in the nursery is always busy with school and community activities.

**Stage 2 students** began a 6 week practical program in the nursery in February.

Using magnifying lenses and microscopes, the students observe the function and structure of a variety of leaves and make botanical drawings and pressed herbarium specimens.

Banksia integrifolia, Banksia serrata and Banksia ericifolia are growing in the school garden allowing the students to identify the physical differences in the leaves, and to appreciate the mature form of the plant.

This herbarium specimen of *Banksia integrifolia* is one of many prepared by Julia, (one of our volunteers). A specimen of this quality shows the students how a plant is preserved for future study.

Illawarra Landcare held a seed propagation workshop in February and Australian Plants Society Nowra have scheduled a propagation from cuttings workshop in March..

# Shoalhaven residents creating real change in fight against illegal dumping

Shoalhaven residents are saying enough is enough when it comes to illegal dumping prompting a sharp upturn in public vigilance and reporting. Council has been asking residents to report illegal dumping of waste, such as used household items, old tyres, green waste or construction waste, by using the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Report Illegal Dumping (RID) webpage. The state average for public use of the RID website is 11% and Shoalhaven's use of the RID website is 73%. Data from October, November and December 2022 showed that increased reporting directly led to a spike in clean up notices and infringements, with Council's Rangers undertaking three times the amount of enforcement action. James Ruprai, Shoalhaven City Council - Director of City Development said, "Shoalhaven is leading the state with reporting from residents. This is a significant achievement, and we'd like to thank residents for their help in keeping the Shoalhaven clean." "Greater vigilance and reporting from the community

not only sees the prompt removal of waste from our bushland and beaches, but also allows rangers to put preventive measures in place," he said. increase in reporting means we have a clearer picture of where, when and what people are dumping illegally and provides greater support for ongoing investigations to find the perpetrators of these illegal acts," said Director Ruprai. Council encourages the community to

vigilant and keep reporting by using the EPA Report Illegal Dumping (RID) webpage, with three easy steps - snap a photo, upload it to the RID webpage, and tag your location.
