Growing Plants Growing Community

Red and Green — the colours of Christmas

Some local plants with decorative features especially at Christmas time, for you to enjoy.

The traditional NSW Christmas bush -Ceratapetalum gummiferum is familiar to us all and grows so well in gardens in Berry.

The creamy white flowers have all but disappeared by December, leaving the red sepals or bracts which last all through the holiday season. The colour of the sepals darkens as they age.



NSW Christmas bush is related to the much taller Coachwood - Ceratapetalum apetalum which can be seen as a flush of red on the escarpment.



The Illawarra Plum Pine (Podocarpus elatus) is a slow growing tree which can grow for several years as a potted plant. It has glossy dark green leaves and a dense habit with horizontal branches that are strong enough to support Christmas decorations. Being evergreen, it does not drop it's leaves if you bring it inside.

There are a few mature trees at the rear of Berry Show Ground and opposite the entrance to Berry Railway Station.

Hairy Clerodendrum - Clerodendron tomentosum - is a small rainforest tree with soft hairy leaves. The spring flowers are white with prominent stamens. The fruits develop in December, when ripe, they turn a deep





purple colour. The dark round fruits are held in the green sepals and look striking. Although it is sometimes called a Lolly bush. the fruits are not edible for humans.

Bracychiton acerifolius - Illawarra flame trees are prominent again this year in Queen Street and also in the grounds of the school at the intersection of Victoria and Clarence Streets. The spectacular fresh flowers are bell shaped and irridescent during Spring and Summer. The seed pods form about 3 months after flowering has finished.

THE JERRY BAILEY BURIAL GROUND

From the early 1800s a burial ground existed on the northern bank of the entrance to the Shoalhaven River at the township of "Jerry Bailey", known as Shoalhaven Heads since 1955. Previously, the area was used for Aboriginal burials. Initially established within the Coolangatta Estate, it is thought to have functioned as a burial ground until 1917. The anglicised name, "Jerry Bailey", is derived from the Aboriginal name for the place — Djerrabalay.

The burial ground, possibly one of the oldest in rural NSW, was used by both Aboriginal people with connections to the nearby sacred Mount Cullunghutti, as well as by non-Aboriginal people, mostly convict workers and their family members from Coolangatta Estate.

The site probably remained undisturbed until 1926, when it was subdivided by Alexander Hay into 30 residential blocks extending south eastwards from Hay Avenue, except for one narrower block clearly marked on the registered subdivision plan as "Reserve for Graves". All blocks were sold relatively quickly, except for the narrower block, which was sold in 1948. The title deed contained no reference to graves, which were still marked by headstones.

Two headstones are now housed in the Berry Museum, of Thomas Greer, and John Weeks, husband of Greer's widow. Greer's headstone is well known, having been lent twice to the National Museum of Australia.

The burial ground's general location can be identified from the local Jerrinja community's oral tradition and early subdivision records; however, its exact extents are unknown. There are currently four lists of approximately 80 names of those known or believed to be buried there.

Community members have approached Council asking that steps be taken to better recognise and manage heritage at this important historical site.

On 15 September, Council formally commenced consultation with those most directly affected (descendants, landowners/residents and Aboriginal community members) to investigate what action could be taken. Broader community consultation will occur before Council makes final decisions. More information can be found at: https://getinvolved.shoalhaven.nsw.gov.au/jerry-bailey-burial-ground. Family members with ancestors laid to rest at the burial ground are encouraged to contact Council so their input is considered.

Come to the Berry Landcare's 2025 AGM and meet the Powerful Glossy Gang

Landcare is about taking action to prevent and repair degradation of our natural resources. Many people are familiar with the Berry Landcare working bees for natural resource management. These are held at a number of sites in and around Berry. In addition to the working bees, Berry Landcare organises events, such as displays and talks to raise community awareness of environmental and ecology issues. The 2025 Berry Landcare AGM is one of these opportunities with a speaker at the meeting. The Berry Landcare AGM will be held on the 10th of December 2025 at the Uniting Church Hall, Berry. The AGM will begin at 4 pm and will be followed by our guest speaker, Yolande Cozijn, who will talk about threatened bird species in the Shoalhaven area.

Yolande is the publicity officer from Birdlife Shoalhaven and will be focussing her talk on three species: Glossy Black Cockatoo, Gang-Gang Cockatoo and the Powerful Owl. The presentation will focus on identifying these birds, the threats these species face, and some suggestions as to what we can do to help them.

I know there are many 'birders' within our Landcare community and I wonder if, like me, you have a special place in your heart for the Glossy Black. It is sometimes called the Casuarina Cockatoo because if feeds almost exclusively on casuarina seeds. The Glossy Black is often confused with the Yellowtailed Black Cockatoo. The Glossy Black has been seen east of the dividing range from central-eastern Queensland to Victoria, with sightings also on Kangaroo Island. Please join us on the 10th December and hopefully together we will discover something new about these beautiful and threated birds.


